I understand that I may withdraw my consent at any time by contacting the designated data protection point of contact.
- I agree that the copyright and intellectual property rights related to my child's creation are assigned exclusively and free of charge to the Parents of the Dragons Asbl for any form of use (reproduction on clothing / merchandising etc.).

CONTEST RULES

ARTICLE 1: THE ORGANISER

The non-profit association Parents of the Dragons Asbl, registered in Mersch at Rue Square Princesse Marie Astrid and recorded in the Luxembourg Register of Beneficial Owners under number F 14481 (hereinafter referred to as the "Organiser"), is organising a mascot contest from March 23, 2026, to June 5, 2026, titled "Draw the mascot for your European School in central Luxembourg."

ARTICLE 2: CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

The drawing contest is open to all students of EIMAB (primary and secondary), subject to compliance with the following conditions:

- Parental Authorisation: All minor participants must obtain the prior consent of their legal guardian.
- Assignment of Rights: The signature of the parental authorization/rules by the legal guardians entails full and complete acceptance of the assignment of intellectual property rights as well as the participant's image rights.
- Adherence to Rules: The mere act of participating in the contest implies, for both the student and their legal guardians, the unreserved acceptance of these rules.
- Ineligibility: Any person not meeting all of these criteria or refusing to comply with the aforementioned conditions will be automatically excluded from the contest.

ARTICLE 3: CONTEST THEME

Theme: "Draw the mascot for your European School in central Luxembourg" The contest invites students to bring the school's emblem to life. A mascot is an imaginary character or a humanized object that proudly represents the colors and identity of a group.

- Objectives and Stakes: The winning creation will become the face of our school community. It will be used in future publications and featured on exclusive collections of clothing and accessories.

Compliance: To be eligible, each project must strictly adhere to the technical and artistic criteria detailed in Article 4 of these rules.

ARTICLE 4: TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS AND SUBMISSION OF WORKS

To be valid, each project must strictly comply with the following instructions:

4.1. Format and Medium:

- Medium: The drawing must be created on a sheet of A4 size paper.
- Condition: The work must be submitted flat. Any folded drawing will be rejected.
- Anonymity: To ensure the impartiality of the jury, no personal inscriptions (first name, last name, signature, or distinguishing marks) must appear on the drawing.
- Drawing: No text is allowed on the artwork.

4.2. Techniques and Creativity:

- Authorized Mediums: All manual techniques are welcome (markers, colored pencils, pastels, paint, fabric or cardboard collage), provided that the final design is clean, legible, and easily reproducible.
- Prohibitions: Digital drawing is not authorized.
- The use of existing images, characters, or logos is strictly prohibited: the work must be an entirely original creation.
- Participation: Only one drawing is accepted per participant.

4.3. Submission Package and Delivery:

Each participant must submit a complete file in an A4 envelope containing:

- The original drawing.
- The first page of the rules (parental authorization/rules) duly completed and signed.
- Submission Deadline: The file must be deposited by Monday, May 4, 2026, before 4:00 PM, in the designated box located at your school's secretariat.
- Important Note: After this deadline, no creations can be accepted for participation in the contest.

ARTICLE 5: STATUTORY DECLARATION

Contest participants acknowledge, on their honor, that they are the sole author of the work submitted.

ARTICLE 6: CONTEST ORGANIZATION

6.1 The Schedule

- March 18 to 20: Official announcement of the contest within the school.
- March 23 to May 3: Creation phase.
- May 4 (before 4:00 PM): Submission of works to the secretariat.
- May 5 to 11: Verification of file compliance by the Organizer.
- May 12 and 13: Jury deliberations and classification.
- May 18 to 22: Exhibition of copies of the 10 finalist drawings at the EIMAB 1 and EIMAB 2 sites.
- June 1 to 5 (until 2:00 PM): Student voting to determine the grand winner among the finalists.
- Week of June 22: Award ceremony in the presence of the school management, the jury, the Organizer, and families.

6.2 The Jury

6.2.1. Composition of the Jury: The jury is appointed at the discretion of the Organizer. It consists of 3 to 10 members drawn from EIMAB staff, representing the diversity of its departments. The jury's decisions are final and cannot be subject to any dispute or claim. To ensure total fairness, no students, parents, members of the "Parents of the Dragons" Asbl, or teachers/staff with children attending EIMAB may serve on the jury. A numbering system will be used to ensure the anonymity of the works submitted to the jury.

6.2.2. Selection Stages: The jury will examine all works that comply with the terms of Articles 3 and 4. Following this review, 10 finalist drawings will be selected. These 10 creations will be exhibited within the school from May 18 to 22, 2026. After this period, all students from EIMAB 1 and 2 will be invited to vote for their favorite project via a dedicated survey. Voting will close on June 5, 2026, at 2:00 PM. The counting of votes will be conducted under the supervision of the Organizer. Projects will be evaluated based on three criteria: technical feasibility (capacity for 3D modeling), originality of the creation, and its inclusive dimension, which must unite the entire school community.

6.2.3. Tie-breaking: In the event of a perfect tie in votes following the student ballot, the jury will deliberate again to designate the grand finalist from among the concerned candidates.

ARTICLE 7: PRIZES FOR THE WINNERS

The grand winner will receive a prestige gift and a custom textile item featuring their own design. The other 9 selected finalists will receive a participation gift and merchandising featuring the mascot.

ARTICLE 8: DESIGNATION OF WINNERS

8.1. Communication to Winners: Winners will be contacted by email to receive detailed arrangements for receiving their prizes. The prizes offered are strictly personal (non-transferable): they cannot be exchanged, assigned to third parties, nor be subject to a request for a cash equivalent.

8.2. Award Ceremony and Communication Rights: An official award ceremony will take place during the week of June 22, 2026. Prizes will be presented to the winners by the Organizer and members of the school community, accompanied by members of the Jury.

By participating, the winners authorize the Organizer to photograph and film the award ceremony, and to use these materials and the winning works in accordance with Article 9.

8.3. Cancellation and Non-Compliant Entries: The following will be considered void and automatically excluded from the contest:

- Files that do not include the authorization signed by the legal representative.
- Any work that does not comply with the technical and thematic specifications detailed in Articles 3 and 4.

ARTICLE 9: PUBLICITY AND USE OF DRAWINGS

The Organizer becomes the owner of all submitted works, which will not be returned. By participating, each candidate assigns their exploitation rights to their drawing (reproduction, adaptation, and distribution across all print and digital media).

Furthermore, participants authorize the Organizer to use their first name, last name, image, and creation for promotional or public relations purposes within the EIMAB school community and by the Organizer, without being entitled to any financial compensation. Acceptance of these rules constitutes express authorization of image rights.

ARTICLE 10: DATA PROTECTION

10.1. Collection and Purposes of Processing: The Organizer, acting as the data controller, collects and processes the personal data of participants (first and last name) for the exclusive purposes of managing the contest, identifying the winners, and awarding prizes.

10.2. Mandatory Nature: The provision of personal data is a contractual condition for participating in the contest. Failure to provide the requested information will prevent the Organizer from validating the participation or guaranteeing the awarding of prizes, as precise identification of the winner is required.

10.3. Recipients and Retention: The collected data is intended for the Organizer's internal departments. It will only be transmitted to third parties if required by a legal obligation or a court decision. The data will be kept for a period of three (3) months from the announcement of the results to cover any potential dispute periods.

10.4. Participant Rights: In accordance with current legislation, the legal representatives of the participating minor have the following rights:

- Access, rectification, and erasure of data;
- Restriction of processing and the right to data portability.

10.5. Procedures for Exercising Rights: Any request to exercise these rights must be accompanied by:

- A written certificate confirming the possession of parental authority over the child concerned;
- A copy of a valid identity document of the legal representative.

ARTICLE 11: ACCEPTANCE OF THE RULES

11.1. Participation in the contest implies the full and unconditional acceptance of these rules in their entirety, as well as the Organizer's decision on any dispute that may arise regarding the interpretation and application of these rules.

11.2. Modification of the Rules:

The Organizer reserves the right to modify, interrupt, postpone, or cancel the contest, or to change the nature of the prizes, should circumstances require. The Organizer shall not be held liable as a result of such actions.

ARTICLE 12: RESPONSIBILITIES

12.1. Technical Responsibility: The Organizer shall not be held responsible for any technical malfunctions, service interruptions, or connection problems (computer networks, Internet, servers) that may hinder or prevent participation or the student voting process. The Organizer does not guarantee that the website or voting platforms are free from errors or viruses.

12.2. Fraud and Contest Integrity: The Organizer reserves the right to shorten, extend, modify, or cancel the contest in the event of force majeure or if circumstances so require. Any participant committing fraud, attempting identity theft, or engaging in unfair maneuvers will be immediately disqualified.

12.3. Responsibility Related to the Prize: The Organizer disclaims all responsibility for any incident, damage, or prejudice of any kind resulting from the acceptance, possession, or use of the prize by the winner. The prize is accepted "as is."

12.4. Information from Third Parties: The Organizer's responsibility is strictly limited to the information disseminated on its official communication channels. It cannot be held responsible for information, errors, or omissions published by third parties or on any other media (third-party social networks, press, external websites) not directly managed by the Organizer.

ARTICLE 13: DISPUTES

13.1. Severability Clause: If any clause of these rules is declared null, invalid, or unenforceable by a court decision, such invalidity shall in no way affect the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions of the rules, which shall remain in full force and effect.

13.2. Applicable Law: These rules and the conduct of the contest are exclusively governed by Luxembourg law.

13.3. Settlement of Disputes: In the event of a dispute or litigation relating to the interpretation or execution of these rules, the parties shall endeavor to find an amicable solution before taking any legal action. In the absence of an amicable agreement within a reasonable timeframe, the dispute shall be submitted to the exclusive jurisdiction of the competent courts of the judicial district of Luxembourg.

13.4. Statute of Limitations (Foreclosure): To be admissible, no dispute or claim relating to the contest, its organization, or its results will be accepted after a period of thirty (30) calendar days following the official publication date of the results.

ARTICLE 14: ALL RIGHTS RESERVED AND FINAL PROVISIONS

14.1. Protection of Content: All elements (texts, photographs, illustrations, and graphics) appearing on the contest's communication materials are protected by intellectual property laws. Any reproduction, copying, publication, downloading, transmission, or distribution, in any manner and on any medium whatsoever, is strictly prohibited without the prior written authorization of the Organizer. All intellectual property rights are expressly reserved.

14.2. Compliance with Rules and Sanctions: Participation in the contest implies the full, complete, and unreserved acceptance of these rules in their entirety. The Organizer reserves the sovereign right to exclude, without notice, any participant whose participation is found to be non-compliant with the provisions of these rules.
