## **Using the Modal Verbs**

A *modal verb* is a type of auxiliary verb that is used to indicate modality that is likelihood, ability, permission, and obligation. Common modal verbs include: can / could, may / might, must, will / would, and shall / should. Modal verbs tend to precede another verb.

Modals do not have subject-verb agreement. They are used to indicate modality. It is important to learn the unique aspects of modal verbs and how they function within the context of a sentence.

Here is a chart to show some modal verbs, the types, and how they are used in sentences.

Ability	can, could	• David <i>can</i> speak three languages.	
		• He <i>could</i> speak fluent French when he was five.	
Permission	can, could, may	• Can I sit in that chair, please?	
		• <i>Could</i> I open the window?

Advice	should	You <i>should</i> visit your dentist at least twice a year.	
		• You <i>should</i> try to lose weight.	
Obligation	must, have to	• I <i>must</i> memorize all of these rules about tenses.
