Students in kindergarten are working with shapes and using their cutting and gluing skills to create cats with a choice of three views.

First graders studied artist Henri Rousseau and his jungle paintings. They are using tempera paints to create their own tigers peeking out from jungle foliage.

Second graders are working with a style of art called Pointillism, after artist Georges Pierre Seurat. Students have created gumball machine drawings and using pointillism in their pieces.

Third grade students are yarn painting, after seeing the Huichol tribe of Mexico create these amazing art pieces with beeswax and yarn.

Fourth grade students have completed a study of Ancient Greek Amphoras. They worked with an amphora shape cut from tag board, layered oil pastel and painted over it with black paint to create their own scratchboards. Students used a scratch tool to incise authentic and student created designs.
