Find articles, books, & more: Pay gap

- 1. Enter "pay gap" and click Find It!
- 2. Scroll down to **Limit by Source Type** and choose: Primary Source Documents (this results in government information)
- 3. Look at Subjects:
 - a. GENDER wage gap; WAGE differentials; EQUAL pay for equal work;
 - b. PAY equity
- 4. Unclick Primary Source Documents
- 5. Click **Advanced search**, then copy and paste line "a" below
 - a. "gender wage gap" OR "wage differentials" OR "equal pay for equal work" OR "pay equity"
 - i. "Quote marks" around **2 or more words** keeps them together in that exact order
 - ii. OR connects similar ideas
 - b. Change the drop-down at the end of the box to: Subject Terms
 - i. This makes your search words more focused
 - c. AND
 - i. AND connects different ideas and box rows
 - d. In the other boxes, put in additional words like: race, ethnicity, mothers, physicians or other occupations/careers

Find articles, books, & more: Careers and occupations

Advanced search:

- 1. careers AND vocational AND guidance OR development (all subject terms)
- 2. Limit Publication Date (2020?-)
- 3. limit by **Source Type**: eBooks
- click the down arrow next to Subject, then Show More look at the words used
- 5. add another word to the search? Or just look through titles

Find articles, books, & more: Other topics

- 1. Use the Find articles, books, & more box to search the topics that interest you, e.g.,:
 - a. gender sports
 - b. gender education
 - c. reproductive justice
 - d. third wave feminism
 - e. or other ideas
- 2. Use the ways to narrow your results that we used above:
 - a. Publication Date
 - b. Source Type
 - c. Subjects
