Christian Houge (born in Oslo, 1972)

Based in Oslo, Norway, Houge has been making photographic art for over twenty years, and new insights continue to open. Exploring the relationship between Humankind and Nature has been an ongoing theme in his work. By exploring this relation, the artist investigates Mans` condition with recurring themes such as environmental impacts in the Anthropocene, identity, and the notion of death.

The artist often juxtaposes the visually aesthetic with an underlying sense of uneasiness. This emanates a cognitive dissonance in the viewer to invite personal references and deeper insights.

Houges 'Vanitas' series and performance started in 2019 after finishing his ritualistic burning of trophy animals for the series 'Residence of Impermanence'. During the past four years rare human skulls used for medical research has been collected and burned in detailed classical 'Vanitas' still-life's in the Memento Mori tradition (Latin for 'remember you shall die') inspired by the Dutch masters in the 1600's.

This cathartic performance evokes the impermanence of life and the vanity of living. A meditation on the Human condition in culture where death has become somewhat of a taboo. This reminder contrasts our self-confirmation through social media which can leave us somewhat detached from ourselves.

By juxtaposing the beautiful and the violent in the hyperrealism of digital photography, these still-lifes are meant to inspire on many different levels, as the references to what a skull represents are endless. Creating dialog with thought-provoking art is Houge's main objective.

In 2021 his series 'Residence of Impermanence' (2017-2019) received nine nominations for the sustainability award Prix Pictet with the theme FIRE. This work has exhibited at six museums and several galleries - including a solo show at Fotografiska, Stockholm (2019), and at Galerie Omnius during Les Recontres d'Arles (2019). Furthermore 'Residence of Impermanence' is currently touring the US initiated by California Museum of Photography (UCR), Los Angeles with the exhibition 'Facing Fire; Art, Wildfire and The End of Nature in the New West'. This exhibition explores the ever-worsening forest fires due to climate change.

Houges series 'Death of a Mountain' (2016-2020) has been nominated for this year's Leica Oskar Barnack Award and received an arts grant from the Norwegian Government. The solo show at Buer Gallery received much attention, as well as Oslo Negative Photo Festival and Street Level Photoworks in Glasgow.

His work has been shortlisted for the BMW Prize at Paris Photo (Scout Gallery, London). In 2015/2016, 'Paradise Lost' toured China and his work has been published in several books and has been presented at symposiums and Ted talks. Many works from his series are included in major private, public and institutional collections.
