Course Description

We cover World Mythology. The first quarter will be primarily Greek and Roman, but then we will delve into the likes of Norse, Egyptian, Celtic, maybe King Arthur, and possibly do several crash courses in cultures like Aztec, Chinese, Polynesian, Japanese, Babylonian, Native American, Slavic, and maybe a touch of Voodoo. Along the way, we will also explore folk tales and legends of various cultures. Basically, if you think that six-headed monster is most likely a cursed princess, of course the sky is really the inside of the skull of a dead giant, and you know that you never, ever go into the dark woods, and are fine lots and lots of names that you cannot spell along with conflicting continuity, then this is the class for you.
