How to do and what to do?

- 1. You can choose between these two topics as your main topic: (pick 1)
 - Love
 - India

Next you have to find a sub-topic. This can be a little tricky as your sub-topic shouldn't be too narrow nor too general. You can find inspiration in materials from class or do your own research. You can run your idea for a sub-topic by me before you get started on your research.

- 2. Brain storm on the sub-topic and write down your ideas.
- 3. Consider what it is about this topic you would like to talk about. Choose what you think is the most interesting aspect or whatever you think you will have the most to say about.
- 4. Structure your ideas by making a short draft outline (udkast).
- 5. Make notes on what you need to find out more about.
- 6. Narrow down your search topics so your Google searches match your outline. Be specific when you search for information. Stay away from websites that are clearly biased or contain highly specialised information. You need to be able to understand what you read!
- 7. Make sure you know where to find your references. References are required for your final outline. Copy/paste the material and sources you find online into your outline right away.
- 8. Rewrite your outline so it fits with what you know now. Use your own words!

- 9. Check for spelling and grammar mistakes and check that your references are in order.
- 10. Once your outline is complete, you start preparing the actual presentation. Make sure the structure and the content of your presentation is in accordance with your outline.
- 11. Write your presentation IN YOUR OWN WORDS!
- 12. Practise presenting your presentation until you can present without reading out loud from your text. It is NOT a test in reading out loud but an oral presentation.
- 13. Make your recording **HERE**
- 14. Hand in your outline and sound file by uploading it to Ludus. **DEADLINE: 6. October 2023**
- 15. Note:

Your outline should only be 1 piece of paper (no powerpoint etc.)

Your presentation should last around 5 minutes.
