## What We're Learning



### ELA: Module 4, Unit 2: Analyzing Characters and How Their Actions Contribute to Theme

This week students will continue reading The Hope Chest. They will take the Unit 2 Mid Unit Assessment and read chapters 14-18. Students will also begin their writing assignment/end of unit assessment for this module, "Do Something Meaningful."



### Math: Using Place Value to Understand Metric Measurement

This week students will continue their final math unit, "Using Place Value to Understand Metric Measurement". During this unit, students will know the relative sizes of measurement units, solve problems involving metric measurement, and measure to solve problems involving metric units: centimeter, meter, gram, kilogram, liter, and milliliter. We will focus on mass, capacity, and converting measurements in word problems. We would appreciate you taking opportunities to provide real world learning experiences with your child. Please continue to reinforce this skill with your child. We will begin EOG review next, fluency with multiplication and division facts will be imperative please work on these with your child.
