Osa Meji | The Great Mothers is a section of The Road to Ose Tura dance film created by Ifa priestess, dancer, choreographer, and scholar, Efeya Ifadayo Olaberinjo Makala Sampson before she transitioned into the ancestral realm on August 6, 2020.
