ELO COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS		
Read A-Latte 25/26 OFFERED: Q1: 7th/8th Grade Q2, Q3, Q4: 6th-8th Grade	Love reading? This is a book club-style class with a twist. We will enjoy ample student-driven reading opportunities in a relaxing environment, while also building our communication skills and fostering a love of reading for all. Come join the fun!	
Children's Books 25/26 OFFERED: Q2, Q4 : 6th-8th Grade	This course will explore what it takes to create a children's book. Students will learn about illustrations and the writing process. Lastly, students will write, illustrate, and publish a children's story.	
Cursive 25/26 OFFERED: Q1 6th Grade Only Q3: 6th-8th Grade	Can't read your grandmother's birthday cards? I am here to help you! Students will learn the basics of upper and lowercase letters in cursive. They will become comfortable reading cursive and master the cursive form.	
Mythology & Science Fiction Q2: 6th-8th Grade	In this course, we will learn about and read myths from a variety of cultures, including Greek, Roman, Norse and Native American. We will also learn about the history of the science fiction genre and explore how mythology and sci-fi have impacted society.	

MATH & PROBLEM SOLVING		
Financial Literacy 25/26 OFFERED: Q4 6th-8th Grade	Learn more about personal finance: managing your money, budgeting, investments, and other practice math application for your future	
Puzzles and Brain Games 25/26 OFFERED: Q1 6th Grade Only	Students will sharpen their math and creative language skills by completing a wide variety of puzzles and games. Puzzles will include Sudoku, logic puzzles, nonograms, crack-the-code, rebus, word finders, etc Games range from creating various words out of an allotted draw (Boggle, Scrabble), challenges where students pull from their creativity to communicate game-related messages (Catch Phrase, Scattegories, Balderdash) or logic and strategy games (Mastermind, Clue). Puzzles and games will change and difficulty will increase as the elective progresses.	
Creative Problem Solving 25/26 OFFERED: Q4 6th-8th	Students will sharpen their math thinking skills by completing a wide variety of puzzles and brain games. These will range from Sudoku, various varieties of Sudoku (Jigsaw Sudoku, Killer Sudoku, Samurai Sudoku), Kakuro Puzzles, Number Search, Number Fill in, and Checkerboard Puzzles. We will change the type of puzzle and the difficulty of the puzzles as the elective progresses.	
RPGs 25/26 OFFERED: Q1 7th/8th Grade Only Q4 6th-8th	D&D and other role-playing games! Are you ready to create your own world and build teamwork as you and your classmates travel through it? This class is open to all levels of interest and experience. Be prepared to show up with an open mind, as anything is possible in this class!	

SOCIAL STUDIES		
Pop Culture 101: 80s - 2000s 25/26 OFFERED: Q4 6th-8th Grade	Do you like 80s, 90s and early 2000s music, movies, video games and culture? Do you want to learn more about this innovative and interesting time period? In this class, students will learn about the popular "pop" culture of the 80s-2000s – everything from new technology, like the internet, that was created in these decades to the most popular films and fads. Students will also learn about the politics and historical events from this time period, including The Cold War between the United States and Russia. The 80s through the early 2000s were a unique time period that we will explore in this class.	
History of Skateboarding 25/26 OFFERED: Q3 : 6th-8th Grade	Skateboarding truly started in the late 1960's and 1970's stemming from the California surf culture. It exploded during the 1980's with movies like Back to the Future bringing it to popular culture. It was during this time that skate manufacturers began signing pro skateboarders like Tony Hawk to promote and design boards. This class will explore this history and the cultural impact it had, with students ultimately designing their own skateboard.	
History of Baseball 25/26 OFFERED: Q2 : 6th-8th Grade	Do you like Baseball? Do you like History? Do you like Popular Culture? This class will explore how the game of baseball has played a significant role in US History. From the breaking of the color line by Jackie Robinson, to the inspirational first pitch by President Bush after 9/11, baseball has been a significant contributing factor in the cultural changes that have occurred in America's history.	
Mock Trial 25/26 OFFERED: Q1 7th/8th Grade Only	A mock trial is a simulated courtroom experience where students act as lawyers, witnesses, and other courtroom roles to present a hypothetical legal case. Participation helps students hone critical thinking, public speaking, and teamwork skills. This experience provides a deeper understanding of the legal process and can prepare participants for potential legal or advocacy careers.	

SCIENCE	
Psychology & the Brain 25/26 OFFERED: Q2, Q3: 7th/8th Grade Only	Have you ever wondered why we think the way we do? Or even think about why you dream at night? In Psychology and the Brain, you will begin to explore these questions and more about how our brains work, and even how sometimes things can go wrong. Come join our exploration and even have the opportunity to take a deeper look into the workings of your own brain! You will be driving your learning in this class.
Wilderness Medicine 25/26 OFFERED: Q1 7th/8th Grade Only Q4: 6th-8th Grade	Learn the basics of wilderness medicine and survival skills. This class aims to explore and strengthen problem-solving and critical thinking skills in a fun and skill-based manner. The goal is to foster a growth mindset, strengthen team building, learn medical basics with an outdoor mindset and have FUN!
Fly Tying & Fly Fishing 25/26 OFFERED: Q4: 6th-8th Grade	Do you love to make things? Do you like being outside? Have you enjoyed the thrill of catching fish in Fortnite or Minecraft? If you answered yes to any of those questions then this class is for you! In this class learn about fish, what they eat, where they like to hang out, and how to catch them, as well as how to tie flies that work well in our area. You'll also learn different fly casting techniques and have the opportunity to try catching fish with your own flies (Possibility for a field trip to Colorado Youth Outdoors)
Gardening 101 25/26 OFFERED: Q3 &Q4: 6th-8th Grade Semester Commitment	Explore the wonders of gardening by learning the basics of planting, nurturing, and maintaining a garden. Through hands-on activities and engaging lessons, you will develop a deeper understanding of plants, soil, and the environment. Learn valuable skills such as teamwork, responsibility, and patience and develop the knowledge and confidence to start their own gardens and appreciate the beauty and benefits of nature.
NASA 25/26 OFFERED: Q1 7th/8th Grade Only Q4: 6th-8th Grade	Head to the clouds? Looking up? Want to know what is out there in the black expanse that we see at night? We will study the NASA organization. Explore the history, past and current missions, what it takes to be part of NASA, and opportunities to work there

ART	
Ceramics 25/26 OFFERED: Q3: 6th-8th Grade	In this course, students will explore the rich history, traditions, and qualities of clay as a functional and artistic medium. Students will hone their understanding of form, space, and volume through the construction of various hand-built projects, and will also experiment with a variety of surface applications and glazing techniques.
Sculpture 25/26 OFFERED: Q2, Q4: 6th-8th Grade	The focus of this course will be to introduce basic three-dimensional processes and materials as well as develop a student's understanding of form and space. Ceramics, Plaster, Mixed Media, and other sculptural mediums will be explored. Various historical periods will be studied to help students understand the importance of sculpture's role in reflecting and shaping history.
Elements of Art 25/26 OFFERED: Q1: 6th Grade Only	It is important to develop a strong foundational understanding in the discipline of art to fully understand its true power. In this class, students will develop this knowledge by exploring the elements of art through a variety of engaging projects. Students will further strengthen this understanding by studying how these foundational elements have been used by artists throughout history.
Basic Woodworking 25/26 OFFERED: Q3: 6th-8th Grade	In this course, we'll learn about basic woodworking techniques using hand tools to create different projects. We'll discuss measurement, cuts, nailless joinery techniques, and shop safety. Students will have the opportunity to create a pencil box, A hinged box, and a small stool. (Materials Req'd)
Jewelry and Beading 25/26 OFFERED: Q3: 6th-8th Grade	Learn the basic skills of creating bracelets, necklaces, earrings, and rings with different types of mediums.
Create a Comic Book 25/26 OFFERED: Q1: 6th Grade Only	Students will learn about the basics of creating a comic, starting from writing the script and creating their own characters, to drawing the comic itself.
Phone Photography 25/26 OFFERED: Q3: 6th-8th Grade	Photography is more than just taking a picture. It is an outlet for creativity, vision, and imagination. It can give you a sense of purpose, a mode of storytelling, and a different perspective on things. Smartphone photography is different from digital photography using a camera because it is so instant and accessible. You take a picture and see the results on a large screen, you can instantly edit it with a photo editor, and you can send or post it online to share instantly with your friends and followers.
Textile Crafts 25/26 OFFERED: Q3: 6th-8th Grade	Learn the basic skills of sewing, knitting, crocheting, cross-stitching, and other fun textile crafts. Students will be introduced to key designs and will explore different techniques.

PE/ATHLETIC	
Athletic Conditioning 25/26 OFFERED: Q3, Q4 : 6th-8th Grade	This class will focus on improving fast-twitch muscles, footwork, balance, and endurance. It is open to ability levels. Be prepared to show up with a positive attitude and to give your best effort.
Sports Skillz 25/26 OFFERED: Q2: 6th-8th Grade	The purpose of this course is to develop the physical skills necessary to be competent in many forms of movement, knowledge of team sports concepts such as offensive and defensive strategies and tactics, and appropriate social behaviors within a team or group setting.

Stop Motion Animation

Amazing Shake is a thrilling soft-skills competition that tests your professionalism, poise under pressure, and many other life and career-needed skills. Students can sign up for 1 quarter of training (either Q1 or Q2) to prepare themselves for competing in the NVCS Amazing Shake competition which takes place during February 2026. (Students who are unable to take Amazing Shake as an ELO can come to before-school coaching sessions between November-January in order to prepare to compete)

Amazing Shake: Community Connections

25/26 OFFERED: Q1: 7th & 8th Grade Only Q2: 6th-8th Grade <u>Prerequisite</u>: Previous Amazing Shake experience is recommended, but not required. <u>Students must complete an application.</u>

Ready to take your soft skills to the next level? Hone your Amazing Shake skills while putting them into practice through various on and off campus opportunities. This course will consist of volunteering in NVCS classrooms, giving school tours, visiting local businesses and city leaders, and mentoring younger Amazing Shakers.

Amazing Shake: Business Builders

25/26 OFFERED: Q2: 7th & 8th Grade Only <u>Prerequisite</u>: Previous Amazing Shake experience is recommended, but not required.

Students will build on previous Amazing Shake skills and experiences to take their ideas from concept to creation! They'll learn how to develop a product, design a prototype, and craft a business model, complete with marketing strategies and financial plans to pitch to a panel of sharks. Throughout the course, students will gain real-world skills in problem-solving, teamwork, and creativity, all while working toward creating their own business.
