- VI. Rate and Quality Workgroup Final Draft Recommendations- Draft Report: https://bit.ly/3d0TAjC
  - This is the final draft recommendation that the Rate and Quality Workgroup have finalized.
  - Eric Peterson, a member of the State Rate and Quality Workgroup, will be presenting today at 1 pm in the State Contractors meeting to highlight key items in the draft.
  - Katie suggested to share Peterson's presentation at 1 pm to the greater Steering Committee or post it on the website.
  - This is an opportunity for the Local Planning Council to review and maybe even weigh in.
  - If you are not state contracted (CSPP contracts), the Hold Harmless agreement makes it voluntary for ratings this year.
  - There is no guidance at this time on what rating would mean for next fiscal vear.
  - The implementation guide of the Quality Rating System (QRS) says that once a school site relocates, then the rating becomes vacated.
- VII. Continued Discussion about Focus/Goals for Committee- Members will add-to and vote on the following top goals identified from the April and May meetings:
  - 1. Workforce preparation, pipeline, recruitment, wellness
  - 2. UPK planning & implementation clearer understanding of impact/implication to preschool, alignment, coordination with districts, outreach & communication to families about choice
  - 3. Supporting early learners who are DLL and/or have special needs

    - The committee discussed and voted on the top 3 goals
      - TK/UPK: UPK planning and implementation (9 votes)
        - A clearer understanding of impact/implication to preschool, alignment, coordination with districts, outreach and communication to families about choice.
        - Partner with school districts to provide transportation for TK students to access private provider after school care
      - Workforce: Preparation, pipeline, recruitment, wellness, compensation (9 votes)
        - How can we work with the FCC union to ensure that non-union/private providers voices are also heard?
        - Support private providers.
      - Inclusion: Behavioral Support resources for children in public Pre-K programs (5 votes)

- Speech supports and education for families and teachers for children ages 0-5, especially around multilingual speakers and milestones.
- Social-emotional support for families and sites.
