

Setting up your account:

- Go to <http://study.com/join>

Enter the license code from the automated email that you received and hit “Continue” (see the example below).

- Fill in the fields for your name, email, phone number and password. The email and password are what make the account unique to you. Please use your university email address if you have one. *And please make note of the email and password you use to set up your account for future access.*
- Click “Join Now”



- Click the drop-down arrow with the person icon at the top right of any Study.com page to access your dashboard (see sample page below)

- Find the right course for you using the below list:
 - o Praxis Test Suite
- Take the course practice test as a starting point. There are 50 questions and may take between 1-1.5 hours.
 - o From that course page, go to the “exam” tab to access the practice test
 - o Once you complete the practice test you will be directed to a results page that will provide you with your score as well as your areas of weakness. You can use the links provided in the areas of weakness section to access the learning for those topics.
 - o This will help prioritize what areas of the course you may want to start with first
 - o You can take the practice test multiple times
