





- 3 Activities to introduce gender perspectives into policies and programmes related to climate change.





It aims to strengthen the capacities of civil society organisations to mainstream gender in their practices and to actively advocate for gender mainstreaming in policies, programmes, projects and legislation.

It was published in 2021 by The Asian-Pacific Resource and Research Centre for Women (ARROW) and UN Women Asia and Pacific Regional Office, and has those contexts in mind.
