# Advanced Certification in Special Education Program Guide to Applying for Certification

Since some <u>testing centers</u> have reopened as of May 1, 2020, certification exams and credit requirements remain necessary for initial or professional license.

In order to qualify for an Initial and/or Professional Students with Disabilities license, all candidates need to:

- 1. Hold a valid New York State Initial, Permanent or Professional license in another subject area
- 2. Meet credit requirements and receive an institutional recommendation
  - o To be recommended by Relay, you must:
    - i. Satisfy any outstanding prerequisite credits
    - ii. Complete and pass Relay coursework to demonstrate good academic standing
- 3. Pass required Certification Exams (specific details below)
- 4. Apply for an Initial or Professional License via the Approved Teacher Prep program Additional Certificate pathway on TEACH in either:
  - Students with Disabilities: Grades 1-6 Generalist certificate
  - Students with Disabilities: Grades 7-12 Generalist certificate

### **Required Certification Exams**

All candidates must take the **CST Students with Disabilities (060)** exam.

Students who are seeking the 1-6 Students with Disabilities license also need to take the <u>Multi-Subject:</u> <u>Teachers of Childhood (Grade 1–Grade 6) (221/222/245)</u> exam. Advanced Certificate candidates may have already taken this exam to meet the requirements of their existing initial or professional license.

Students who are seeking the 7-12 Students with Disabilities - Generalist license also need to take the Multi-Subject: Secondary Teachers (Grade 7–Grade 12) (241/244/245) exam. Advanced Certificate candidates may have already taken this exam to meet the requirements of their existing initial or professional license.

## **Emergency COVID-19 Certificate**

If you anticipate not being able to take and pass the required exams before the start of SY21-22, you should apply for an <a href="Emergency COVID-19 Certificate">Emergency COVID-19 Certificate</a> prior to September 1, 2021. The Emergency COVID-19 certificate is valid for one year, through Sept 1, 2022, and provides more time to meet the NYS

licensure requirements outlined above. Note: there is no cost for the Emergency COVID-19 Certificate, however you must apply and pay for the Initial/Professional Certificate that you seek in order to be eligible.
