Unicorns are mythical animals, what does mythical mean? 2. What qualities make unicorns so beloved and magical to many people?
Supplies needed: 2.5 cups of the following: white glue, shaving cream, & foaming hand wash, 2.5 teaspoons of the following: cornstarch, body lotion, baking soda 5 tablespoons of saline contact solution Food color & glitter & Baggies for the slime	Activity introduction: Today's project is: Unicorn Slime 
Closing:	Unicorn Would You Rather Questions (have the student explain their choice): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a unicorn horn that glows in the dark or wings that let you fly? • Have the ability to become invisible or have a unicorn as a pet? • Live in a world where unicorns are the primary mode of transportation or where unicorns can talk? • Find a unicorn in the wild or have a unicorn come to you in a dream?
Group game: <u>Developmental Goal:</u> Transition participants into one large circle. <u>Equipment Needed:</u> None	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Read through the game instructions ahead of time so that you can teach the activity. 2. Use an attention-getter to gather students and make sure they are listening. 3. Explain the game, the rules, and how to play the game. 4. Check for understanding, have a few kids and staff demonstrate play. 5. Link to game: Whoosh Ball
