Vision Statement

The Lockhart High School Roaring Lion Band and its directors are committed to the development of outstanding citizens through participation in the performing arts.

Mission Statement

As a team, the RLB will emphasize best practice and performance excellence. We will serve our school by engaging our community and audience with our exceptional performance quality and represent our school district as we strive to earn high ratings in all competitive events.

What We Teach...

All our members improve performance qualities and musical skills by joining the band. But there are so many non-musical lessons that can be derived from the band experience. Some of these are:

Students leave the LHS Band Program knowing the value of hard work in building a championship level product. Our students also receive the gift of lifelong friendships! Being in the RLB gives our students the opportunity to develop attributes that will serve them well throughout their lives, as well as the tools to bless the lives of others.

Program Components

The cornerstones of the Roaring Lion Band are daily practice and rehearsal, performances and the interaction between instructors and students in all classes and rehearsals.

The RLB performing activities are composed of the components that follow.

Marching Band

Marching band rehearses, performs and competes during the first 3 months of school and is the flagship performing group of the Roaring Lion Band. Members of all high school band and color guard classes are performing members of the LHS Marching Band.

Concert Band

Woodwind, brass and percussion musicians are all participants in a concert band. These indoor ensembles are grouped by ability level and assigned through an audition. Our 2 concert bands perform at school concerts, community functions and competitions during the winter and spring.

Color Guard

This team of performers come from various performance backgrounds and provide energy, style and pageantry to generate the marching band's overall effect. During the winter and spring months, these students make up the LHS Winter Guards.

Percussion Ensemble

In addition to performing as members of the marching band and concert bands, the percussion musicians of the RLB form an ensemble of their own that performs during the winter and spring months.

Jazz Band

Jazz band is a class that band students may enroll in to continue their musical journey. This ensemble studies jazz theory and technique and performs at the winter and spring concerts.

A detailed description of each of these components along with rules, expectations and schedule can be found on the pages that follow.

Marching Band

Marching Band is an educational tool for both musical and leadership development. The marching show educates the performers and entertains the audience; therefore, it must be designed at the highest level of the activity. The Marching Band is the most visible and recognizable musical performance unit at LHS.

Marching Band Components

The LHS Marching Band is made up of 3 equally important performer families:

- 1. Winds Woodwind & Brass
- 2. Percussion
- 3. Color Guard

Wind musicians perform mostly on the same instruments they have been learning since 6th grade. French Horn, Baritone and Tuba instruments are adjusted slightly to accommodate the marching activity, but play very similarly and are easily adaptable from the fundamental playing our students are taught in jr. high. Double reed instruments (oboe and bassoon) are normally utilized only in a stationary solo capacity. Therefore, double reed musicians contribute to our marching band in a variety of alternative performing positions.

Percussion musicians perform in one of the following sections: the battery (marching percussion) and the front ensemble (stationary pit percussion). Instruments are assigned by audition and are intended to match each student with the instrument that will best allow him or her to contribute positively to the team. See the section titled "Percussion" for more detailed information.

Color Guard is the visual auxiliary unit of the marching band. These members dance, emote and spin equipment to visually interpret the music played by our musicians. Positions within the Color Guard are determined by the needs of the marching show and selected by audition. See the section titled "Color Guard" for more information about color guard.

Visual, Marching and Marching Spots

The main challenge for performers that have not been in a marching band before is learning the rigorous and precise visual responsibilities that make the activity unique. The band and guard incorporate elements of military marching, body movement and acting to bring to life our presentations. Band is a varsity activity within LISD and the same physical endurance and stamina required by athletics applies to band.

DON'T WORRY, NO EXPERIENCE IS REQUIRED. The directors and staff will teach you everything you need to know to perform at the highest level possible! All you need is an open mind, maximum effort and a desire to give your personal best.

When the marching production is composed by our design team, the number of positions on the field in each section are selected to maximize the overall flow and coordination of our program. In some cases, the directors and staff may assign primary and secondary marchers to field positions in order to maximize the development of all our members. Students who are assigned primary marching positions will perform when in good standing. Secondary marchers will shadow the primary marchers, learning the spot in case they are needed. Secondary marchers may perform in other supporting roles if necessary.

For the purposes of this Handbook and its contents, a member in "good standing" is defined as a student who:

- Has remained academically eligible according to UIL and LISD Standards during the associated time period.
- Has attended all required performances.
- Has not had a DAEP placement during the associated time period.

Marching Band Rehearsals

Each student of the band and guard will meet daily during class to rehearse music and marching as well as build skills and fundamentals. Additionally, the band meets all together and as sections outside of school time on a regular weekly schedule:

- Monday
 - 7:00–8:30am Full Band (Practice Lot)
 - 4:45-5:45pm Woodwind and Percussion Sectionals (Locations as needed)
- Tuesday
 - 6:00-8:30pm Full Band (Stadium Rehearsal)
- Wednesday
 - 4:45–5:45pm Brass and Color Guard Sectionals (Locations as needed)
- Thursday
 - 7:00-8:30am Full Band (Practice Lot)
- Friday
 - 7:00–8:30am Full Band (Practice Lot)

Rehearsals will start on time and end on time. Students must arrive 15 minutes earlier than the scheduled time in order to gather necessary materials and be in their assigned position at the time rehearsal is to begin.

Attendance

Each member of the Roaring Lion Band has an obligation to be at all rehearsals and performances, on time, with the necessary equipment and materials. Unexcused absences will affect your weekly rehearsal grade and position in the marching band. Study the band calendar with your parents and clear all the performance dates now! Please see the marching season event list below and consider carefully your availability. All conflicts must be reported according to the RLB registration guidelines in order to maintain good member standing. See section titled "Attendance Policy" for more information about rehearsal attendance.

Fundamentals Camp

Fundamentals Camp will take place at the conclusion of the school year to prepare all high school band members for the upcoming marching season. Topics covered will include marching, music technique, musical warm ups/skills and show music. All students must attend. The fundamentals camp schedule for 2022-2023 is as follows:

Summer Band

Summer Band rehearsals will take place during the weeks leading up to the start of school. This series of rehearsals is the most crucial for the marching band's success. During these weeks, the students will be trained in all facets of performance and musicianship. Individual positions within the drill will be assigned during summer band. Students will be acclimated to the physical rigors of marching band as well as the weather through progressive scheduling and exposure. The schedule includes appropriate breaks and meal times. The summer band schedule for 2022-2023 is as follows:

Marching Rehearsal Standards/Safety

Most marching rehearsals are held in the band lot located next to Lion Stadium. Students' attire for all marching band rehearsals includes shorts, a light colored t-shirt, hat or cap, athletic tie shoes, and socks. For Stadium Rehearsals, all students will wear their RLB Workout Shirt and Shorts for uniformity. Sunglasses and sunscreen are highly encouraged for the safety and health of our students. Students must bring an individual water bottle clearly labeled with their name to all rehearsals. Students should not share water bottles. Water bottles will be kept close, and frequent water breaks will be taken. During rehearsals, directors will adhere strictly to the UIL student health and safety guidelines. For other expectations see section entitled "Rehearsal Guidelines and Band Hall Conduct."

Football Game and Marching Contest Procedures

Game Days

- Pep Rally: Lockhart High School home football game days begin with a pep rally performance at TBD o'clock in the main gym. All students must attend for full credit in weekly performance grades.
- Dress Rehearsal: The band will have a short run-through of the half-time show EVERY gameday. Practice will take place on the LHS football field or practice lot. Students must attend the gameday rehearsal in order to be eligible to perform.
- Game Day Meal: the RLB members will be provided a game day meal before
 every football performance. Meals are ordered in advance using the <u>RLB Meal</u>
 <u>Order Form</u>. Students are expected to stay on campus for meals and remain calm
 as this time is also used to prepare for the performance. Students may not eat in
 the band hall and are required to clean up their own trash.

Contest Days

Dress Rehearsal: The band will have a short rehearsal to prepare for the contest.
 Students must be on time and participate in this rehearsal in order to perform in the contest.

Uniform

- Uniform(s) will be assigned to each member of the band/guard.
- The "traditional" Roaring Lion Band Uniform includes the following:
 - Jacket
 - Bib Pants or "Bibbers"
 - "Shako" Hat
 - Marching Shoes
 - Gloves
- Students must provide the following as part of their uniform at each performance:
 - RLB Workout or Show Shirt
 - RLB Workout Shorts (or similar)
 - Plain black socks at least calf length

- Alternate contest uniforms may apply depending upon the marching show design and will be issued as necessary.
- All uniforms will remain on racks in the band hall except when in use.
- Each student is responsible for correct storage and management of their uniform(s) within their assigned garment bag at all times.
- Students will not be dismissed from any performance until uniforms are correctly stored.

Loading

- All instruments/equipment traveling to the performance on the equipment truck must be loaded immediately following rehearsal.
- Each student must place their personal instrument in the assigned loading location (cage, stack or on truck) in order to guarantee your instrument makes it to the performance.
- Qualified "Loading Crew" members and parent volunteers are responsible for completing the loading process
- Small instruments such as flutes and clarinets may remain with the students on the bus if possible.
- Once the truck is locked, it will depart LHS, therefore any equipment that does not make it on must travel with the student who owns it on the bus

Inspection

- Before departing LHS for any performance all band/guard students will be inspected for the following:
 - Proper wear, fit, and condition of uniform and all necessary uniform parts as listed above.
 - Possession of correct instrument, music and water jug needed for performance.
 - Condition of equipment (inspected before loading begins if traveling on equipment truck)
 - Brass: horns polished
 - Woodwinds: horns polished, at least three good reeds
 - Percussion: sticks/mallets (taped correctly)
 - Color Guard: all equipment properly weighted and taped; all silks checked for wear and tear
 - Music binder OR flip folder in good condition, properly labeled, with all of the necessary music
 - No exposed jewelry (necklaces, bracelets, piercings, etc.)
 - No distracting makeup (basic neutral facial makeup allowed)
 - No fingernail polish or visible pen/marker markings on hands or elsewhere
 - All hair should be neatly kept so that it does not reach the collar of the uniform

- Specified show hair and makeup is complete and to the standards met by the director and staff.
- Inspections are conducted by section leaders and reported to the drum majors and directors.
- Any student who does not meet the standards of the inspection will face the following consequences:
 - Level 1 Infraction: Instrument, bibbers (bottom), jacket (top), shako or marching shoes missing. Student will be dismissed from performance and must be picked up by parent at LHS. Student's weekly performance grade will be affected.
 - Level 2 Infraction: Gloves or correct socks missing. Appearance otherwise unacceptable. Student will travel with band, but will not perform in the marching performance. Student's weekly performance grade will be affected.
 - Level 3 Infraction: Any other inspection failure. Student's weekly performance grade will be affected.
- Any section leaders or drum majors found concealing an infraction will be dismissed from their position.

Bus Rides

- All transportation to games and competitions will be on LISD school buses.
- Students are to follow all LISD transportation guidelines and comply with Bus Driver, Parent Chaperone and Director instruction at all times.
- Only personal audio (headphones) may be used; no external speakers.
- No eating or drinking on the school buses (unless specified by the band directors for certain long-distance trips). When given permission to eat make sure all trash is thrown away at the end of the trip.
- Remain seated at all times.
- Talking is to be kept at a reasonable level. Screaming, yelling, etc. is not acceptable.
- Keep all parts of the body inside the bus at all times.
- Bus assignments will be made by directors and are not to be changed without permission.
- No Public Displays of Affection (PDA) of any kind.
- Any student found not complying with these guidelines will face the following consequences:
 - 1st Offense: Seat reassigned near a band director.
 - 2nd Offense: Student may be dismissed from an event and a parent will have to pick them up from the performance location.
 - 3rd Offense: Student may become ineligible to ride the bus to band events.

Alternate Transportation

- If for some reason you need alternate transportation to or from a band-sponsored event, you are required to give notice to Mr. Crowley via email at least 24 hours prior to the event.
- Only parents or approved guardians will be allowed to drive students to events.
 No student may drive themselves.
- Students leaving an event with a parent must have a release meeting with a band director before departing.

Arrival at a Performance

- Students and chaperones are to remain on the buses until instructed by a band director.
- Each performance will have slightly different unloading procedures and will be covered during final instructions before leaving LHS.
- Students exiting the bus must be completely dressed in the assigned uniform. No unzipped jackets or accessories.
- Keep in mind the idea that "as soon as we get off the bus, we are performing!"
 ALWAYS conduct yourself with class and dignity. You are representing Lockhart!
- The unloading, line up, warm up and stand-loading process should be done so quickly and with a business-like manner.

In The Stands

- When performing/spectating in the stands during, before or after a game, students must remain in their assigned position until instructed otherwise by a band director.
- Non-band members are not allowed in the band area at any time.
- All students must have their music in a flip folder.
- Students must always be ready and attentive to band director instruction.
- Watch closely for cut-offs in the music, as the band will sometimes stop playing in the middle of a song.
- No food, drink or gum is allowed while the band is in the stands. RLB water jugs are required for hydration and are therefore an exception.
- You must have permission from a director to use the restroom. Never go to the restroom alone - always go with at least one other person. Return quickly from the restroom so that others may go. Students are not allowed to visit the concession stands while out.
- Do not play your instrument unless the entire band is performing. Battery percussion may perform separately as assigned by a director.

Dismissal

- When the band arrives at the band hall after a game performance, students may not depart until formally dismissed by a band director.
- Dismissal is scheduled for approximately 30 minutes after arrival at the band hall.
- A final inspection will take place ensuring that all instruments, uniforms and equipment are put away properly before the band is dismissed.
- Students must arrange for transportation home from LHS within 20 minutes of dismissal.

Marching Contests

- Marching Shows have developed into an art form. Shows have evolved into eight minute mini-stage shows complete with elaborate props and staging. Our shows are designed for creativity and sophistication. On Saturdays during Marching Season, the RLB will perform their show at various contests that are held throughout the area.
- Specific contest information will be posted and communicated as soon as it is available.
- Attendance at these contests is mandatory for all band members.

• General Performance Conduct

- Remember, you are part of an organization that represents the pride and class of Lockhart. Whenever you wear the RLB uniform or logo, you must behave in a way that positively reflects the school and our organization.
- We will also stand respectfully while the National Anthem and all other ceremonial music is played.
- We will watch attentively and enthusiastically when another band performs their show.
- We will make a positive impression on everyone we meet.
- You are part of a fine organization and are expected to act accordingly. At no time should anyone do anything or say anything that could reflect negatively on the group in general.
- All band events are school-sponsored and students will adhere to the Lockhart High School and LISD student code of conduct at all times.
- Any student found to be behaving in a way that is unbecoming of a Lockhart Lion will be dealt with to the fullest extent of the law.

2022 Marching Show

Hello Lockhart!

We are so excited to introduce the 2022 Roaring Lion Band marching show, "NYC." This year's band and guard will take our audience on a journey through the city that never sleeps to explore a day in New York City!

Geoffrey Sperling, production designer; Luke Gall, drill writer and Collin Pagel, percussion arranger return to our design team. Mr. Jeff Chambers, a veteran composer has joined them as wind arranger to bring "NYC" to life.

Music will be sourced from the following pieces:

- Empire City Alicia Keys
- Original compositions by Jeff Chambers
- -The Band Directors

Concert Band

Concert Band is the backbone of our program. Concert season is where the students develop the skills that transfer to great performances in the concert hall and on the marching field! All applicable policies and procedures from marching season apply to concert season as well. See below for additional concert/winter season details.

Band Placement

All woodwind and brass students will be screened by band directors during the spring semester for assignments into appropriate concert ensembles for the following school year. Students will be assigned to Wind Ensemble or Symphonic Band. Students will be placed in the band which will allow them to progress and grow as a musician while contributing to a great performing concert band. Ensemble assignments may be changed mid-year at the directors' discretion. See section entitled "Percussion" for information about percussion band placements.

Region/Area/All State Band

The road to All-State begins in July, when the assigned etudes are released by TMEA. In summer band camp, Region music is distributed to all band members as part of their RLB music binder and etudes are taught as early as possible. Regardless of whether a student will audition for region/area/all state band, it is the RLB philosophy that learning these etudes is essential to the growth and development of all of our students. Additional fees apply to participate in TMEA events. We encourage as many students to audition as possible and find that it is a great opportunity to show leadership and initiative. In general the process is as follows:

- TMEA 5A Region/Area Band auditions take place in late November or early December.
- Students selected to District Band receive commendation and honor but do not advance or participate in a performance experience.
- Students selected to Region 12 Band participate in the Region Band Clinic experience during January.
- Students selected to Area Band receive advanced commendation and honor.
- Only a select number of Area Band "chairs" advance to audition for the TMEA 5A All State Band during January.
- Selection to the TMEA 5A All State Band is the highest honor an RLB member can earn.
 The students perform at and participate in the TMEA Convention/Clinic weekend in February.

Solo & Ensemble

All band members are required to participate in the "in-house" LHS Solo & Ensemble Contest. Students are assigned an appropriate solo and chamber ensemble at the outset of concert season and prepare with the assistance of band directors for performances in February. These graded performances are adjudicated by a group of professional guest judges and are accompanied by top-flight pianists. Students may register to compete in the UIL Region 12 Solo & Ensemble Contest in February, where they have the chance of earning UIL rating awards and advancement to the Texas State Solo & Ensemble Contest, held in May/June. Additional fees apply to participation in UIL Solo & Ensemble events.

Concert & Sight-Reading Contest

As the individual players develop and improve, so should the performing ensembles (Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble). We believe in performing the highest level of music possible for each ensemble, considering the level of the performers. Each band will play a great depth and breadth of literature. Bands will play with the highest level of ensemble technique and musicality.

Earning a "Superior" rating at UIL Concert & Sight-Reading is the ultimate goal of Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band each year. During March and April, both concert bands will participate in at least 1 "Pre-UIL" evaluation and the formal UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Contest. Preparations for these events may include playing tests, pass-offs, clinics and sectional rehearsals as assigned by ensemble directors.

Jazz Band

Jazz Band is a program offering of the Roaring Lion Band that meets daily during school. This class is geared towards 10th-12th grade musicians who want to learn how to play jazz music and take their musicianship to the next level. Jazz Band students study jazz and advance their musical independence through personal practice and clinics.

Communication

An organization of the size and scope of the Roaring Lion Band requires exceptional communication between all constituents. Directors are available to communicate with parents and students during hours where rehearsals and performance are not occurring. What follows is details about RLB communication procedures.

Roaring Lion Band Website

<u>www.roaringlionband.org</u> - Here you can find more information about all Lockhart Junior High School and Lockhart High School Bands and ensembles. On the RLB website you will be able to find calendars, events, itineraries, music etc.

Charms

All RLB members and their families are required to maintain an updated profile with Charms Office Assistant. Using Charms, stakeholders track financial information and receive weekly newsletters, or "Navigation Sheets", from the band directors. The directors will provide assistance with login and maintenance of Charms accounts on a yearly basis. Directions on how to access Charms Office are as follows:

- 5. Student Area Password, enter your password. If it is your first time, enter your school ID number.

Google Classroom

Google Classroom pages will be maintained for the RLB and all related classes. Directors are able to communicate in real time with students, manage assignments and provide feedback through this helpful program. RLB students are required to maintain a presence on Google Classroom and respond to tasks as assigned.

Rehearsal Guidelines and Band Facilities Conduct

- 1. NO food, gum, or drinks other than water are allowed in the band facilities.
- 2. Students should not enter the band hall or any band facility unless a director is present.
- 3. Students should retrieve and set up their instrument, place their empty case in their cage and proceed to their seat or position immediately.
- 4. Students should begin a personal warm up of long tones and fundamentals as soon as possible.
- 5. Students will show good rehearsal etiquette by being a good team player. Remain on task at all times; do not talk or interrupt the focus of the rehearsal. Raise your hand and ask questions if you need individual help.
- 6. Students will maintain proper posture at all times.
- 7. Band members will not touch or play with any equipment that does not belong to them including percussion instruments and color guard equipment that may be stored in the open.
- 8. Be mindful and respectful of groups that are rehearsing in the band hall and do not disturb their rehearsal time if you are nearby.
- 9. Students should clean up personal belongings and store them safely in their personal cage after every rehearsal. Any personal items that are left out will be placed in the lost and found. The band department is not responsible for personal items stored anywhere in the Band Hall.
- 10. Students are solely responsible for the care and maintenance of their assigned equipment. All instruments are to remain COMPLETELY in cases, with shut latches, when not in use. Students should have their names on the outside of their instrument cases in a visible place. Be sure that your serial number, make and model are written down at home.
- 11. FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY of Instruments: Students using school instruments will be assigned a \$50 per school year instrument usage fee. Parents should NOT take a school-owned instrument to a repair store and expect reimbursement. We have vendors under contract for the repair of these instruments. If an instrument is in need of cleaning or repair, please see a band director.
- 12. Take proper care of your band uniform. Failure to properly care for your uniform will result in academic and financial penalty.
- 13. Instrument cages shall remain clean. No food should be left in the slots. Marching shoes, rehearsal clothes, etc. may be stored in the slots during marching season if kept in a neat and tidy manner. Any perishable items left on the floor will be discarded at the end of the day.
- 14. Practice rooms are to be used for appropriate practice only (see practice guidelines).
- 15. Students should not enter the directors' offices without permission; knock and wait for a response.
- 16. No student is to use the band office computers/phone/copier without permission.
- 17. Please be considerate of the directors' requests for assistance and/or performance of tasks around the band hall. Help out generously when possible!

- 18. Band members serve as goodwill ambassadors for the school and the community. Polite and courteous behavior is a credit to the band organization, to the school, and to the parents. Be respectful at all times.
- 19. Follow all school and district rules. Any infraction of conduct, attitude, or responsibility will be dealt with in one or more of the following manners:
 - a. Conference with student
 - b. Conference with parent
 - c. Conference with triad principal and administrative consequences
 - d. Expulsion from band program

The goal of the band directors is to ensure that all students are treated fairly. We will work with you to resolve problems that may arise. We are here to provide a quality music education for all our students!

Note: "Band Facilities" is defined as any room used for RLB instruction or performance.

Practice Expectations

- Improvement in our class/group is the responsibility of each and every member.
- Each student will complete at least 30 minutes of individual work on music/material related to class each day, 6 days a week. This time should be independent of any rehearsal.
- Practice may be completed at home if an appropriate setting is available.
- The band hall and surrounding areas are available for students practice during the following times:
 - 8:15-8:45am on each school day.
 - o 4:35-5:30pm on each school day.
 - During lunch periods.
 - During non-band classes for students who have the appropriate written pass.
 - During any LHS band rehearsal provided the practicing students do not disrupt the occurring rehearsal in any way.
- Students must practice musical fundamentals and assigned music, prioritizing upcoming performances.
- Practice sessions must adhere to the following standards:
 - Independently. No group practice unless assigned by a director.
 - In the correct setting. Use practice rooms, rehearsal rooms and approved areas only.
 - Using proper materials. Use the correct instrument/equipment and proper tools.
 - Sheet music
 - Tuner
 - Metronome
 - Band Chair
 - Music Stand
 - Practice with the same expectations as band/guard rehearsals.
- Adhere to the correct outline of a practice session:
 - Warm Up/Fundamentals (10 Minutes)
 - Long tones or chop builders
 - Work on quality and control of sound
 - Tune
 - Skill Building (10 Minutes)
 - Scales/rudiments or other basic exercises
 - Articulation/slur exercises
 - Ear training
 - Repertoire (10 Minutes)
 - Select music
 - Work on a specific phrases or section
 - Be MUSICAL
 - Stay focused!
 - Limit run-throughs

Private Lessons

Private instruction on your instrument is the absolute best way to improve on your instrument. Many fine instructors on a variety of instruments have made themselves available to teach LISD students. If you are interested in private lessons, see any band director.

Grading

All LHS Band/Guard classes are subject to the following grading procedures. See individual class syllabi for additional information on grades.

• Daily Work (40%)

- o Weekly Rehearsal Grade 100 Points
 - Graded during non-class rehearsals
- Other "Daily Work" assignments may include, but are not limited to: practice plans, self assessments, group practice

Test (60%)

- Performances 100 Points
 - See class/activity schedule.
- Other "Tests" may include, but are not limited to: skills tests, video assignments, written reflections

Attendance Policy

Student attendance and punctuality is paramount to the success of any of our programs and therefore must be carefully monitored and enforced. Members of the RLB are subject to the following standards and procedures in order to maintain good standing:

Attendance

Excused Absences

- o In order for an absence to be excused, it must qualify as follows:
 - Appear in detail on the "Conflict Sheet/Schedule Agreement" form for the correct activity as filled out before the season and signed by student and parent. Directors will review these and use the information when assigning parts, roles and positions for their performing ensemble.
 - Be of an emergency nature and communicated at the earliest possible time via email to Mr. Crowley:
 - Student Illness
 - Death in family
 - True need or hardship
- Any absence that does not meet these qualifications is unexcused and therefore subject to appropriate consequences.

Unexcused Absences

- Any absence that is not reported correctly or does not meet certain qualifications will not be allowed and will result in consequences for the student. Please keep in mind the following about unexcused absences:
 - Tutorials: LHS teachers do a wonderful job of making themselves available for tutoring during a given week. RLB members should arrange any necessary tutorials around the band schedule.
 - Personal Appointments: Doctors, dentists and any other personal appointments should be scheduled around the band schedule when possible. Any emergency medical appointments require a doctor's note to be excused.
 - Communication: If an unavoidable conflict arises, it must be reported through email to Mr. Crowley as soon as information is available. This allows time to make arrangements to replace the performer if necessary. All email communication should include honest and transparent detail including the time, date and particulars of the conflict.

- Any unexcused absence will be subject to the following consequences:
 - Unexcused absence from rehearsal:
 - First Offense: Loss of credit for event in weekly rehearsal grade
 - Second Offense: Loss of credit for event in weekly rehearsal grade and loss of 1 performance
 - Third Offense: Loss of credit for event in weekly rehearsal grade and loss of performance position
 - Fourth Offense: Dismissal from the performing program
 - Unexcused absence from a performance:
 - First Offense: Loss of grade credit for performance, loss of performance position
 - Second Offense: Dismissal from performing program

Punctuality

- Excused Tardy
 - In order for a tardy to be excused, it must qualify as follows:
 - Appear in detail on the "Conflict Sheet/Schedule Agreement" form for the correct activity as filled out before the season and signed by student and parent. Directors will review these and use the information when assigning parts, roles and positions for their performing ensemble.
 - Be of an emergency nature and communicated at the earliest possible time.
 - Any tardy that does not meet these qualifications is unexcused and therefore subject through appropriate consequences.

Unexcused Tardies

- Any tardy that is not reported correctly or does not meet certain qualifications will not be allowed and will result in consequences for the student. Please keep in mind the following about unexcused tardies:
 - "I have a pass...": RLB members are responsible for managing their personal schedule and arriving on time to band events. When being held by any school activity other than an administrative meeting, students should communicate with the appropriate teacher or sponsor so that they get to band on time.
 - Rehearsal Preparation: It is an RLB expectation that students will arrive early enough to gather belongings and get to the appropriate position by the time activities are to begin. Students who are on campus, but not ready to start will be counted tardy.
- Any unexcused tardy will be subject to the following consequences:
 - Unexcused tardy:
 - First Offense:
 - Less than 10 minutes late: Teacher redirection consult and loss of 5 points from weekly rehearsal or performance grade
 - Greater than 10 minutes late: Loss of credit for event in weekly rehearsal or performance grade
 - Second Offense:
 - Less than 10 minutes late: Parent phone call and loss of credit for event in weekly rehearsal or performance grade
 - Greater than 10 minutes late: Parent phone call and loss of 1 performance
 - Third Offense:
 - Less than 10 minutes late: Parent phone call and loss of 1 performance
 - Greater than 10 minutes late: Parent phone call and loss of performing position

Academic Eligibility

During marching season, all RLB members must meet minimum grade requirements to participate in UIL activities. Grade checks and eligibility dates are set by LISD in accordance with UIL guidelines. Student grades for all classes will be audited regularly by the band directors. Performance assignments and positions may be affected by UIL eligibility AND director grade checks. Please view the 2022-2023 UIL Lockhart Eligibility Calendar for relevant dates and eligibility timeline.

Band Trip

Trips will be planned to supplement and augment the band experience and are available to all RLB members unless otherwise specified. However, trip participation is not a requirement for membership. Trip costs will be borne by the participating student and their family, and are in addition to band fees required for membership. Fundraising opportunities and financial assistance from a variety of sources will be made available. To participate in trips, the students must be enrolled in band/color guard and in good financial/disciplinary/academic standing.

Extracurricular Overnight Trip Conduct

James Crowley, Director of Bands is the designated administrator in charge of band trips. Any violation of rules may result in penalties provided under the Lockhart High School Student Code of Student Conduct, the Roaring Lion Band & Color Guard Handbook and/or the laws of any city, state or municipality. Other trip-specific rules and regulations will be outlined in a Trip Conduct Agreement that will be signed by both parents and students prior to departure. These will include, but are not limited to the following:

- All district and respective campus rules apply as well as the rules of the LHS RLB.
- Use or possession of tobacco, alcohol or any illegal drugs will result in notification of proper authorities and possible immediate dismissal and return of the student at the parent's expense.
- If illegal activity results in detention by authorities, parents shall have responsibility for all intervention, counsel and transportation.
- Curfew will be established nightly and adhered to strictly by all students. Students must stay in assigned rooms.
- No improper activity, including PDA will be tolerated on overnight trips.
- Only participating LISD students are allowed in LISD hotel rooms.
- Students must notify sponsor/chaperone of their whereabouts at all times if they are in a location other than their assigned room.
- The sponsor will conduct a mandatory meeting with parents/chaperones prior to the trip. Failure of the parent to attend the meeting may result in the student and parent not participating in the activity.
- Malicious or willful damage/theft of property by a student shall result in the student being dismissed at parent expense. Parents and students shall assume full financial responsibility for damages, transportation and any other associated costs.
- Luggage and personal items are subject to search prior to departure from LHS and at any point during the trip if there is suspicion of contraband.

Roaring Lion Band Lettering Requirements

The Roaring Lion Band letter jacket is an award to be worn with extreme pride. All qualifications are subject to a student being a member in good standing of the RLB for the entire school year. Jackets are ordered during the Spring semester and are issued to students in August.

Any band member having completed their third year of high school band in good standing will be awarded a letter jacket. For example, if a student maintains academic eligibility and active participation in band activities during every semester of their 9th, 10th and 11th grade year, they will be awarded a jacket at the beginning of their senior year. A student may earn their letter jacket before the completion of their third full year of high school band by earning a minimum of 10 letter jack points during any single school year. See below for point values.

Students receiving a letter jacket are expected to stay in band after they have earned it. Students who have qualified for a letter jacket and have not signed up for band the following school year will not be awarded their jacket.

Letter Jacket Points:

- 1 pts. Participation in All Region Band audition
- 2 pts. TMEA District Band designation
- 6 pts. TMEA Region Band Membership
- 2 pts. TMEA All Region Jazz Band membership
- 3 pts. First Division Solo at LISD Solo & Ensemble Contest
- 3 pts. First Division Ensemble at LISD Solo & Ensemble Contest
- 3 pts. First Division Solo at UIL Solo & Ensemble Contest
- 3 pts. First Division Ensemble at UIL Solo & Ensemble Contest
- 2 pts. Pit Orchestra
- Students who earn a letter jacket from another school activity can earn a band patch. These are ordered and issued at the same time as the band letter jackets.
- Students can earn a band patch yearly by completing the requirements of lettering by points.
- All appeals to lettering decisions, and all special circumstances, will be heard and dealt
 with on a case-by-case basis by a committee. The committee will include Fine Arts
 Coordinator, the Director of Bands and another committee member appointed at the
 discretion of the Fine Arts Coordinator.
- Lettering points will not carry over from one year to the next. Each year the student must begin anew in the accumulation of points.
- Students with outstanding band fees will not be issued a letterman jacket.

The RLB will pay for the jacket and/or lettering patch. Any other awards, patches, service bars, buttons etc. added to the jacket must be paid for by the student.

Finances

Each band student is required to pay/purchase the following except where indicated as optional or only required for specific groups, etc. A deposit will be due at band registration. Payment plans are available to accommodate a variety of financial needs. See the page titled "Payment Methods and Plans" for information about payment plans and due dates. What follows are definitions of band fee items.

Fee Sheet Item Descriptions

- Participation Fee (Required Annually): The participation fee helps to cover the cost of drill, music, and show designers, specialized instructors, clinicians, and masterclass teachers throughout the year. These items are considered "fair share" as the cost is borne equally by the band and color guard members.
- Marching Shoes (Required): For new members or replacement pair.
- **Color Guard Shoes (Required):** Performance shoes are required for new members. The color of shoes will depend on the costume each year.
- **Show Shirt (Required):** The shirt worn underneath the uniform at football games or contests.
- Workout Shirt (Required): This shirt is worn at our Tuesday evening practice and other events as necessary.
- Workout Shorts (Required): These shorts are worn at our Tuesday evening practice.
- **Performance Top:** This is worn by wind and percussion members at contests.
- **Instrument Rental:** Required for students using school-owned instruments.
- Water Jug (Required): These are made custom for uniformity and must be used by all students.
- **Ultimate Drill Book App. (Required):** Used by all students to learn drill except front ensemble members.
- Duffle Bag: Required for color guard members, optional for wind/percussion members.
- Uniform Cleaning Fee (Required)
- **Region Band Fee:** This fee is determined by TMEA and is paid in the fall for students wanting to compete for the chance to make the All State Band.
- Solo & Ensemble Fee: This covers the entry fee and accompanist for the RLB solo & ensemble contest. Required for all Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band members. There is an additional fee for the UIL solo & ensemble contest.
- Black Dress Shirt (Required for Symphonic Band members and Wind Ensemble men): Part of the LHS concert season uniform.
- **Gloves (Required):** To be worn by all color guard members as part of the uniform. Does not need to be reordered unless lost or replaced.
- Warmups (Required): Track jacket and pants to be worn by all color guard members as part of the uniform. Does not need to be reordered unless lost or replaced.

The Lockhart High School Band Boosters

The RLB Boosters is an organization made up of parents and friends of the Lockhart Junior High and High School Band students. The Boosters are an integral part of this very special band program and are dedicated to supporting our students and the directors. The Boosters provide financial assistance at both the junior high and high school level, helping to defray the costs of key items such as:

- Instrument purchases
- Maintenance and repair
- Marching music and drill design
- Additional band technicians for marching, percussion and color guard assistance
- Props
- Uniform repairs and replacement
- Equipment trailers and transportation
- Software for Charms and Smart Music programs

It's not all about money, however; the Boosters also provide **physical and moral support** to our bands by moving equipment, chaperoning trips, cheering from the stands and much more. Our band kids compete in one of the toughest Areas in the state for music, so it truly takes a village to be successful.

You might wonder, "Why should I become a booster?" As one long-time band parent puts it, "Band Boosters is where I go to find out what's really happening in band from a parent's point of view. Taking an active role as a band parent keeps me involved in my teenager's life, and I've made some great friends along the way."

There are several ways parents can be involved such as chaperones, concession stand volunteers, pit crew, trailer volunteers, and uniform volunteers.

We are all parents of kids about the same age and have all the same joys and concerns that you have! We on the Booster Board have committed ourselves to this organization and we eagerly await getting to know you. We will go out of our way to welcome you and invite you into the RLB Family! Meetings

The Band Boosters conduct meetings on the third Thursday of every month at 7pm in the LHS band hall. Attendance by the members is very important to keep the lines of communication open between the Booster Board, Directors, and Parents. Parents should plan to attend as many of these meetings as possible. The Boosters are an integral part of the success of our band program.

Background Checks

LISD does require ALL volunteers to submit an application and consent to a background check. Any person volunteering for the Roaring Lion Band must have a check done annually prior to volunteering. A parent can request a LISD Volunteer Form from the Booster Board. We can turn it into the Directors for you with all the other parents at the beginning of the school year. There should also be one in the registration packet online. Fill it out for all events for your child, not just for band.

The Roaring Lion Band Leadership Team

Excellent student leadership is a key component of our band. Students with the required experience, skills and abilities as well as a desire to grow and develop our band program should apply to become a band leader. See available positions and qualifications below:

Drum Major

- Selected by a panel of directors and other judges and evaluated on the following:
 - Written Application
 - Interview
 - Conducting audition
- Must be in excellent academic standing
- Serves as the communicator between the directors and students
- Conducts the marching show
- Runs the metronome at practice
- o Assists the directors in teaching marching fundamentals and drill
- Maintains discipline on the marching field
- Makes sure all sound and marching equipment is ready for rehearsal
- Is 30 minutes early for every band function, and stays until the last student leaves
- o Represents the band in a respectful manner
- Ensures that the leaders of the band work as a team
- Assists the band directors with organization
- Attends assigned drum major training camp during the summer
- Attends all RLB Leadership training events
- Participates in weekly leadership meetings during marching season
- Participates in the RLB Band Council as necessary throughout the year
- Is a 10th-12th grade member of the band in good standing
- Willing to participate in all band activities throughout the year (Region Band, UIL Solo & Ensemble, special performances, etc.)

Section Leader, Captain, Co-Captain

- Selected by a panel of directors and other judges and evaluated on the following:
 - Written Application
 - Interview
 - Musical/Performance Skills
- Must be in excellent academic standing
- Serves as a role model for their section
- Promotes unity within their section
- Assists section members in learning their music and drill
- Is 15 minutes early for every band function
- o Takes responsibility for all section members and self
- Maintains discipline within the section

- Communicates with drum majors about any issues pertaining to their section
- Writes down and learns all section members marching dots
- Knows all section members parts (i.e. 1st part, 2nd part)
- Provides marching/musical tutorials to
- section members as assigned by band directors
- Learns and tests on music at a high level
- Serves as a mentor to younger members of the section
- Attends all RLB Leadership training events
- Participates in weekly leadership meetings during marching season
- Participates in the RLB Band Council as necessary throughout the year
- o Is a 10th-12th grade member of the band in good standing
- Willing to participate in all band activities throughout the year (Region Band, UIL Solo & Ensemble, special performances, etc.)

Note: The number of leadership positions available depends upon the size or needs of the band as well as the quality of applicants and are at the discretion of the band directors.

Service Positions

These teams may be an opportunity for a student who is not selected as a leader or not yet qualified to demonstrate leadership skills and show initiative.

Set-Up Crew

- Crew leader appointed by band director from leadership team
 - Leader is responsible for recruiting crew
- Must have been a member Roaring Lion Band in good standing
- Must arrive at least 15 minutes early and participate in rehearsal setup

Uniform Crew

- Crew leader or "Quartermaster" appointed by band director from leadership team
 - Leader is responsible for recruiting crew
- Must have been a member Roaring Lion Band in good standing
- Must participate in uniform maintenance organization and distribution as assigned by the band directors
- Must be organized and conscientious
- Must be able to meet deadlines

• Sheet Music Team

- Crew leader or "Librarian" appointed by band director from leadership team
 - Leader is responsible for recruiting crew
- Must have been a member Roaring Lion Band in good standing
- Must participate in sheet music organization and distribution as assigned by the band directors and help maintain a functional music library
- Must be organized and conscientious

Must be able to meet deadlines

Loading Crew

- Crew leader appointed by band director from leadership team
 - Leader is responsible for recruiting crew
- Must have been a member Roaring Lion Band in good standing
- Must participate in operations of the band including but not limited to:
 - Loading and unloading of equipment truck
 - Building, moving and maintaining field props
 - Band hall storage/organization projects
- Must be willing to sacrifice meal/show prep time in order to complete duties
 - Loading crew will be compensated for this time with extra meal items
- Must be organized and conscientious
- Must be able to meet deadlines

Color Guard

Color Guard is a visual activity that incorporates flags, rifles, sabres, and dance. It is referred to as the "Sport of the Arts" due to its both athletic and artistic nature. The Color Guard acts as the visual representation in the marching band show during the Fall. Then moves into its own competitive season known as Winter Guard. Where the Color Guard travels around competing against other Color Guards in the central Texas area. Color Guard is a full year activity with lots to look forward to.

Fall Guard Information

We believe that Color Guard is a great activity for incoming freshmen to become acquainted with the high school environment and its students, as well as for continuing high school students to become involved with an activity to motivate them to stay academically, mentally and physically engaged. We train our students to be both athletes and artists, pushing them to be scholars and role models. During the marching band season, the color guard is what helps bring the visual package of the show to life through movement and choreography with equipment. The color guard will be given the proper training and tools they need to be successful in the activity.

Winter Guard Information

After marching band season we move into the winter guard season. The group moves into the gym where a new show is created to a soundtrack with new choreography on a performance tarp. They will perform with the TCGC and WGI circuit competitions during the months of January-March. The program will have a JV and Varsity team depending on the given year and number of members. All equipment for both seasons of color guard will be provided by the school and returned at the end of each season.

Percussion

Percussion is an integral part of the Roaring Lion Band program. In percussion, students will participate in marching band ensembles (marching battery and front ensemble) concert band, dedicated percussion ensembles, and will even be able to play with the jazz band. Percussionists must be dedicated to their personal growth as a musician as well as the growth as a percussion section. In order to accomplish this percussionists will practice individually and as a section. Percussionists will focus on all areas of percussion to become a well rounded percussionist.

Marching Band Season

All percussionists are considered a part of the loading crew and must stay with the truck for the duration of loading and unloading percussion equipment. Loading and unloading is a year round responsibility. Marching band instrument assignments will be based on our clinic/audition process in the spring. Students will be placed on the instrument they will be most successful on based on the clinics. Due to the number of certain instruments and to make sure every part is covered everyone will audition for more than one instrument. This is to ensure that each student is matched with the instrument the student will be most successful on. Double reed members that are in the percussion section for the marching band season will maintain performance quality on their primary instrument. Double reed players are encouraged to participate in percussion ensemble during the concert season, but not required.

Concert Season

Solo and Ensemble music will be distributed Wednesday, November 18th after school. Music will be assigned to students by the directors. Students that have received a first division rating at UIL Region S&E will be able to pick their solo. Concert band assignments will be established from the Region Video assignments in the fall. Percussion ensemble schedule is built in the spring and formed around band class schedules and other student organizations. Percussion ensembles will compete/take part in percussion festivals in the Spring as well as a percussion concert on April 8th, 2023.
