Reflecting on Generosity

During August and early September, each commission at CMC will lead a worship service that celebrates and features their work. See the schedule below. CMC Compassion Fund

Financial hardships in our congregation arise for a variety of reasons: medical bills, job loss, unexpected major expenses, counseling/therapy. CMCers generously support the Compassion Fund for mutual aid among members, so that we can ease these hardships among our households. If you or a CMCer you know has a financial need, the Grants Committee will review your need through a brief application <u>available on our website</u>. CMC households are eligible for up to \$600 twice annually in compassion funds as administered through the Grants Committee, which maintains confidentiality. In situations of higher need, the process includes a recommendation from Grants Committee to Council. Getting to Know Our Congregation

GETTING TO KNOW YOU: Eliana Marcela Yejedor Hernandez



You've got a free afternoon. How do you spend it?

I would drink a cup of coffee, read something, and then I would take a nap. I would also probably call my sister in Panamá, or my mother in Colombia, on WhatsApp.

What is something you've done, or accomplished, that you're proud of?

I am proud of having graduated from college and having completed my degree in English. The accomplishment was amazing, but I don't miss having to think about writing papers. I don't really like to write, I like talking. The cliche is that I'm the first in my family to graduate from college, even though many of my family members should have "degrees" in other abilities and life skills, like my grandfather who knows how to provide for himself completely on his own without depending on economic systems, like the ones I depend on in which money seems to be always necessary.

Fun fact about you.

I broke my elbow the first time I went ice skating. You can tell how good my relationship is with cold weather.

You've lived in several different countries. How have those places influenced your view of the world, and of yourself?

I have lived in three countries: Colombia, Ecuador, and the US. When I was in Colombia, I only thought of myself as "Eliana" from the Eastern Plains countryside. Some considered me "White," although I was mainly a part of the majority *mestizo* population. However, I didn't really think about race or those labels. When I arrived in Ecuador, I was considered first a "Colombian" and second "Eliana." Then I arrived in the U.S. and now I'm considered a woman of color and a Hispanic. For the first time, I started thinking about race and ethnicity. I'm mentioning this to exemplify how our contexts mold our identities and tell us who we are and what our place is in that context. I feel much more comfortable among people of the lower economic class, but I've learned to relate with people of the middle and upper classes as I've gained more academic education.

Living in different places has also awoken an interest in words, the significance of our words, and how those words reflect ways of thinking in different contexts. Also, our human capacity to serve and love others, and our temptation to fall into "othering," is something that constantly catches my attention and makes me stop to reflect.

Something that I've enjoyed about living in different places is the food and sharing time with those who prepare different foods: in Colombia, arepas with cheese and cornmeal; in Ecuador, coffee and *bolones de verde*, fried balls of green plantain stuffed with cheese and/or chicharrones; and in the United States, fresh peaches and cherries, and Thai food, especially from Taste of Thai.

Quick Stats About Eliana

Work: I work at Bluestone Elementary School as a Home-School Liaison. It doesn't have anything to do with homeschooling; it's a position that connects families with the school and helps the school to be connected with families, especially those who are new to our school or need interpretation services. I love this job because I get to work with some of our Spanish-speaking families and families from other countries.

Family Members: I am married to David Shenk. I am the mother of Kaleth, age 13, and the human mom of Tito, our dog.

Birthplace: Piñalito, Meta, Colombia

Current home: Harrisonburg, VA, very close to the EMU baseball field

Host family needed August 1-16: Lyubov and Scott Slashcheva will be relocating to Harrisonburg in the coming month. Lyubov was recently hired to be the dentist at the Healthy Community Health Center. Their 15-year-old, Armando, is excited to be part of EMS's soccer team and the family is seeking a host family living within biking distance from EMS to enable him to begin conditioning with the team on August 2nd, and are seeking a host family for him from August 1-16. The team conditions 5-6 hours a day and Armando would be transporting himself by bike to/from EMS. Lodging, food, and laundry would be the main needs for which a host family would provide.
