WELCOME!

Welcome to the ninth-biennial Rhetoric Society of America Institute! The Rhetoric Society of America is committed to making the institute accessible for all attendees. This Accessibility Guide offers accessibility options related to Institute events at the University of Maryland. We hope this guide will be useful to you during your time in the College Park/DC Metro area. You may have questions, needs, or accommodation concerns that are not covered in this guide. If those needs arise please contact co-directors Jessica Enoch or Kristy Maddux (rhetsa19@umd.edu).

While this guide focuses on many aspects of the physical locations of the Institute and getting around College Park, RSA's commitment to accessibility for all attendees extends to our scholarly practices as well. Seminars and workshops are, in the main, discussion-based and invite small-group work. If there are special accommodations we can make for these types of interactions, please let us know. We will offer CART services at our keynote event after the Thursday luncheon on June 6th.

The University of Maryland is located in College Park, MD, a suburb of Washington, D.C. accessible via metro and other forms of public transportation. The University is less than 10 miles from the White House, the U.S. Capitol, and the Library of Congress, while also being located in Prince George's County, a majority-minority county that claims the most affluent African-American population in the nation. College Park is simultaneously urban, suburban, and a college town, with access to some of the most influential political institutions in the world. Its population is rich with racial and cultural diversity.

Tribal Welcome

We acknowledge that we are on the traditional territory of the Mattapanient, Patuxent, Piscataway, Moyaone, and Pamukey peoples. To recognize the land is an expression of gratitude and appreciation to those whose territory you reside on, and a way of honoring the Indigenous people who have been living and working on the land from time immemorial. It is important to understand the long-standing history that has brought you to reside on the land, and to seek to understand your place within that history. Land acknowledgements do not exist in a past tense, or historical context: colonialism is a current ongoing process, and we need to be mindful of our participation in it.

LONG DISTANCE TRANSPORTATION

REGIONAL AIRPORTS

There are three major airports that service the region—Thurgood Marshall Baltimore-Washington International (**BWI**, 30 miles from campus), Dulles International Airport (**IAD**, 35 miles), and Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (**DCA**, 15 miles). All three airports are accessible by public transportation, DCA by Metrorail and BWI and IAD by Metrobus.

Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport (DCA)

Taxi fare from DCA to College Park is typically ~\$60. You should verify with the driver that the fare is near that range.

There is a metrorail line servicing College Park from National/Reagan to College Park. Take the "Yellow Line" to Mt. Vernon Square Convention Center, then transfer to the "Green Line" to College Park. On-going construction is prone to cause delays, check out wmata.com for up-to-date information. As you approach College Park from Washington, to your left is the West side of the Metro Station (Calvert Road). It is about a 20-40-minute walk to Campus.

Taxis and shuttle bus pickup lanes are located on the East (right) side of the College Park Metrorail station. There are cabs often waiting for passengers at the stations.

The University of Maryland also operates a wheelchair accessible **shuttle service** (red & white UM Shuttle buses) which runs Mon.-Fri. to the College Park Metrorail station at 15-minute intervals beginning at 6:40 AM from the East Side of the metrorail station. Stop and Pick-up points on campus are at the UM Circle and at Lot HH by the Stamp (Student) Union, which is two blocks away from Tawes (see **campus map**).

The Hotel offers a complementary shuttle to and from the metro. Call 301.277.7777 to arrange transportation.

Elevators

The elevators are equipped with raised Braille buttons and are accessible to individuals who use wheelchairs. At some elevators, an electronic voice announces arrival at each floor.

Ground Transportation

1. Airport shuttle buses are equipped with wheelchair lifts and audible announcements.

2. Taxis: The airport has an open taxi system served by numerous taxi operators. Several taxis are equipped to accommodate wheelchairs in storage. Patrons who need taxis with wheelchair lifts are encouraged to contact a taxi operator directly in advance of going to the curb. This will save time versus waiting at the curb for an accessible vehicle to be called by the dispatcher. Contact taxi dispatch at 703-417-4333.
3. Washington Flyer Shared Van, operated by Super Shuttle and Supreme Airport Shuttle, have wheelchair-accessible vehicles. Patrons who need accessible vehicles are encouraged to reserve an accessible vehicle in advance by contacting Super Shuttle at 800-BLUEVAN (258-3826) or Supreme Airport Shuttle at 800-590-0000.
4. Airport Metrorail Station: WMATA maintains a webpage about the Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport station including alerts about elevator disruptions.

Pet Relief Areas

Reagan National Airport has designated Pet Relief Areas for service animals that accompany passengers. These are located outside the terminal.

Public Restrooms

Restrooms are fully accessible with toilet stalls for individuals with disabilities. Most toilet stalls have infrared flush devices. All sinks in each restroom are placed at an accessible height, and infrared devices are used to activate the water at most locations. Baby changing stations have been placed at an accessible height in both men's and women's restrooms at most locations.

Unisex companion care restrooms are provided at these locations:

1. Terminal A, pre-security - Next to Men's and Women's restrooms in the airline ticketing lobby and adjacent to the Historic lobby
2. Terminal B/C, pre-security - Next to each set of Men's and Women's restrooms on the Concourse level (Level 2) and adjacent to Bag Claim #1 and #12 (Level 1)
3. All terminals, post-security - One per pier near Gates 1-9, 10-22, 23-34 and 35-45

Public Telephones

In Terminals B and C, TTY units are located throughout the Airport and are clearly marked with blue and white signs above each unit. In addition, each group of pay phones has a clear path to a wheelchair accessible unit. All pay telephones are equipped with volume control, are hearing-aid compatible, and have Braille or raised numbers.

Security Screening

All security checkpoints are accessible. The Transportation Security Administration (TSA), which conducts passenger screening at the checkpoints, has a program to assist travelers with disabilities and medical conditions.

Wheelchairs

You may arrange for wheelchairs at any terminal through your airline or with any Skycap at the Airport. Please notify your airline in advance of your visit so that they can better serve your needs.

Thurgood Marshall Baltimore-Washington International (BWI)

The **Greenbelt-BWI Airport Express Line** is a Metro nonstop bus service from BWI to Greenbelt Metro Station (fare is \$7.50--MUST have exact change). It runs every 60 minutes (**timetable**). From the Greenbelt Metro station, take the Metro one stop to the College Park station. Once you arrive, it is about a 20-40-minute walk to Campus.

Taxis and shuttle bus pickup lanes are located on the East (right) side of the College Park Metrorail station. On-going construction is prone to cause delays, check out wmata.com for up-to-date information. There are often cabs waiting for passengers at the stations.

The University of Maryland also operates a wheelchair accessible **shuttle service** (red & white UM Shuttle buses) which runs Mon.-Fri. to the College Park Metrorail station at 15-minute intervals beginning at 6:40 AM from the East Side of the metrorail station. Stop and Pick-up points on campus are at the UM Circle and at Lot HH by the Stamp (Student) Union, which is two blocks away from Tawes (see **campus map**).

The Hotel offers a complementary shuttle to and from the metro. Call 301.277.7777 to arrange transportation.

Also available at the BWI Ground Transportation area located at the lower level are LIMOUSINE SERVICE (301) 912-2000 and BWI TAXI SERVICE (410) 859-1100; the fare is ~\$65 to College Park.

Accessibility Options at Thurgood Marshall Baltimore-Washington Airport

TSA Passenger Support Specialists

Travelers requiring special accommodations or concerned about the security screening process at the airport may ask a TSA officer or supervisor for a passenger support specialist who can provide on-the-spot assistance.

Lift-Equipped Buses

All shuttle buses servicing the BWI Marshall Airport parking lots and the BWI Marshall Rail Station are wheelchair accessible. All drivers are fully trained in the operation of the lift equipment.

Parking

Parking for the disabled is available in all BWI Marshall Airport Parking Facilities.

Pet Relief Areas

BWI Marshall Airport travelers who are accompanied by service or other domestic animals can enjoy the convenience of four pet relief areas while at the airport – two are pre- security and two are post-security.

Service Dogs & TSA

TSA passenger screening canine teams may be operationally deployed at the airport, especially near checkpoints. The canines are working animals that are trained to detect traces of explosives concealed on passengers or their belongings. Passengers traveling with pets are asked to use a checkpoint where the working dogs are not assigned at a particular time. Passengers traveling with service animals may continue to use the checkpoint with working dogs.

Services for the Visually Impaired

Services are available for passengers with visual impairments. Passengers should contact their airline for assistance when traveling through BWI Marshall Airport.

Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TDD)

There are public telephones equipped with Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TDD) throughout the airport. There are also TDD phones at the information desks located on the upper level Concourse A/B, lower level in the Southwest Airlines baggage claim 1-5 area, lower level Concourse E as well as the MAA Pathfinders office.

Free Video Calls for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing

Free video calls are available using the Purple Video Relay Service (VRS). The phone is located in the Central Terminal Back Hallway adjacent to Dunkin Donuts.

Unisex Bathrooms

These bathrooms are especially equipped for people with disabilities. It is possible for a person with a disability to use them with or without an attendant. Two pre-security unisex bathrooms are located to the right (just past Hudson News) and to the left of Concourse D security, behind the airline ticket counters.

Family Restrooms

BWI Marshall Airport has family restrooms in many locations throughout the terminal building. There are four on Concourse A - one before security between security and the bank (equipped with an adult changing table), one just past

security near the Phillips restaurant, one at gate A9 and one in baggage claim on the lower level.

There are five family restrooms in the Concourse B area - one at security, one near the Silver Diner restaurant, one at gate B2, another at gate B7 and one at baggage claim belt 5.

Concourse C has one family restroom - at gate C7.

There is one family restroom in the B/C Connector (equipped with an adult changing table).

There are three near Concourse D - one is in the upper level back hallway near Hudson News, one in the back hallway behind the Delta Air Lines ticket counter and one at gate D7 (equipped with an adult changing table). (**Map of the Family Restrooms**)

Wheelchair Service

Aviation Safeguards serves Alaska Airlines, American, British Airways, Spirit, and United. The wheelchair request number is **410-841-9915**.

Flight Services & Systems (FSS) serves JetBlue and WOW airlines. The wheelchair request number is **216-218-9035**.

Southwest wheelchair requests can be made by calling **1-800-435-9792**.

Dulles International Airport (IAD)

Guests flying into Dulles should be aware that this airport is not metro accessible and is the farthest from campus. We recommend taking a taxi or using Supershuttle for transportation from Dulles to College Park.

Elevators

The elevators are equipped with raised Braille buttons and are accessible to individuals who use wheelchairs. At some elevators, an electronic voice announces arrival at each floor.

AeroTrain C Station Elevators

The AeroTrain C Station elevators are located on the center platform. Please wait for the doors to open on the center platform from the AeroTrain so that you can access the elevator there. Please note there is a time delay for the center platform doors to open.

Ground Transportation

1. Airport shuttle buses are equipped with wheelchair lifts/ramps and audible announcements.
2. Rental Car shuttles are all equipped with wheelchair ramps/lifts.
3. Washington Flyer Taxi has several vehicles within the fleet equipped to accommodate wheelchairs. Patrons who need an accessible vehicle are encouraged to reserve an accessible vehicle in advance by contacting Washington Flyer Taxi at 703-572-TAXI (8294).
4. Washington Flyer Silver Line Express buses are all wheelchair-accessible.

Pet Relief Areas

Dulles International Airport has designated Pet Relief Areas for service animals that accompany passengers.

Public Restrooms

Restrooms are fully accessible with toilet stalls for individuals with disabilities. Most toilet stalls have infrared flush devices. All sinks in each restroom are placed at an accessible height, and infrared devices are used to activate the water at most locations. Baby changing stations have been placed at an accessible height in both men's and women's rest rooms at most locations. A unisex companion care restroom is provided adjacent to the public restrooms at many locations.

Public Telephones

In the Terminal and all Concourses, wheelchair accessible Telecommunication Device for the Deaf (TDD) telephones can be found at various locations throughout each building. All TDD telephones have clear, accessible pathways for wheelchair patrons.

Security Screening

All security checkpoints are accessible. The Transportation Security Administration (TSA), which conducts passenger screening at the checkpoints, has a program to assist travelers with disabilities and medical conditions.

Wheelchair Service

You may arrange for wheelchairs in any Concourse or in the Terminal through your airline or with any Skycap at the Airport. Please notify your airline in advance of your visit so that they can better serve your needs.

TSA Help Line

TSA has a TSA Help Line to assist travelers planning to fly on any airline in the United States. TSA Cares is a help line to assist travelers with disabilities and medical conditions. TSA recommends that passengers call 72 hours ahead of travel for information about what to expect during 12 screening. Travelers may call TSA Cares toll free at 1-855-787-2227 prior to traveling with questions about screening

policies, procedures and what to expect at the security checkpoint. TSA Cares will serve as an additional, dedicated resource specifically for passengers with disabilities, medical conditions or other circumstances or their loved ones who want to prepare for the screening process prior to flying.

Travelers may also request a Passenger Support Specialist ahead of time by calling the TSA Cares hotline at 1-855-787-2227. The hours of operation for the TSA Cares Help Line are Monday through Friday 8 a.m. –11 p.m. ET and weekends and holidays 9 a.m.– 8 p.m. ET. Travelers who are deaf or hard of hearing can use a relay service to contact TSA Cares or can email TSA-ContactCenter@tsa.dhs.gov. When a passenger with a disability or medical condition calls TSA Cares, a representative will provide assistance, either with information about screening that is relevant to the passenger’s specific disability or medical condition, or the passenger may be referred to disability experts at TSA.

OTHER LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Train

Major Amtrak routes from the north, south, and west all run to or through the D.C. region, with both Union Station (D.C.) and New Carrollton Station (Maryland) easily accessible to the University campus. For information on accommodations offered by Amtrak visit

SuperShuttle

SuperShuttle offers shared van service from all airports; call 1-800-258-3826 (1-800-BLUEVAN) to arrange 24-hour door-to-door service to most hotels, homes, and offices in the Baltimore-Washington-Northern Virginia metropolitan area. The fare to College Park from BWI is ~\$35; from National/Reagan Airport the fare is ~\$33; from Dulles, ~\$41.

Car

The University is located at the nexus of two major highways—Interstate 95, the major north-south freeway on the east coast, and Interstate 495, the Capital Beltway that surrounds the D.C. metro area—making it easily accessible by car. For those who travel by car, **pay-per-hour parking for visitors** is available, at a maximum cost of \$15 per day. Mowatt Lane Garage has the most available spaces and least competition from other campus activities during summer months. **Campus map**.

RSAI Attendees can also **buy a parking pass** for the time period of both the seminar and the workshop.

Metrorail

The University is located along Metrorail's Green Line, which takes riders from College Park into D.C. in approximately 20 minutes.

The METRO system includes Metrorail maps at all stations and on each car of their trains which easily indicate every stop for each (color-coded) rail line. Use wmata.com for up-to-date schedules. As you approach College Park from Washington, to your left is the West side of the Metro Station (Calvert Road) (~20-40-minute walk to Campus). However, taxis and shuttle bus pickup lanes are located on the East (right) side. Often, there are cabs already waiting for passengers at the stations.

UM Shuttle Buses

The University of Maryland also operates a wheelchair accessible **shuttle service** (red & white UM Shuttle buses) which runs Mon.-Fri. to the College Park Metrorail station at 15-minute intervals beginning at 6:40 AM from the East Side of the metrorail station. (The last return from campus will be at 7:50 PM; during academic year the last run is at 3:00 AM). Stop and Pick-up points on campus are at the UM Circle and at Lot HH by the Stamp (Student) Union, which is two blocks away from Tawes (see **campus map**).

Paratransit

Participants may take advantage of the University of Maryland's Paratransit shuttle which transports students and visitors to locations across campus. This free service is open to visitors and is available for all academic engagements. However, visitors must register with the university and schedule trips in advance. Anyone interested in taking advantage of this service can contact rhetsa19@umd.edu. We need to reserve this service by May 15th; please be in touch with us before then. Bikeshare

College Park's bikeshare program, mBike, has stations around campus and the Metro station, which visitors can rent for a \$6 daily fee.

AT THE RSA INSTITUTE

Event Locations

The RSA Institute will be hosted at the University of Maryland College Park, MD campus in three locations. The primary location is Tawes Hall, where the majority of sessions will be held. Secondary events will be held at Adele H. Stamp Student Union and at Milkboy ArtHouse, an off-campus bar and restaurant.



Cross-Campus Transportation

As these events are spread across campus, we recommend guests with difficulty walking long distances to stay at The Hotel. They offer a free shuttle service that services the surrounding campus area; however, this service is not wheelchair accessible. Participants may take advantage of the University of Maryland's Paratransit shuttle. This free service is open to visitors and is available for all academic engagements. However, visitors must register with the university and schedule trips in advance. Anyone interested in taking advantage of this service can contact rhetsa19@umd.edu. Tawes Hall

A daily breakfast and the seminar and workshop sessions will be found in Tawes Hall. Tawes Hall has an elevator servicing all floors and ramp entrances. There are two main entrances to the building: Alumni Drive entrance and Campus Drive entrance. The Alumni drive entrance leads into an older part of the building and requires a more circuitous path to the second and third floors where most of the events will be held. When entering from the Campus Drive entrance, participants will find elevators to the right and a stair case directly in front of the entrance that leads to the second floor.

Adele H. Stamp Student Union (Stamp)

Stamp is about a five-minute walk from Tawes (0.2 miles) and the Thursday afternoon luncheon and keynote will be held in the Grand Ballroom (First Floor) and Hoff Theater (Ground Floor). The Ground Floor is only accessible by stairs or elevator. There are two recommended entrances for events including the Main entrance and the South West entrance (see map on page 16). Both entrances are wheelchair accessible and elevators are found to the right of both entrances. For more information about Stamp please visit:

Getting from Tawes Hall to Stamp Student Union

The walk between Tawes and Stamp is about 0.2 miles and takes about five minutes. It is mostly flat, even sidewalks that are well maintained. When leaving Tawes, participants should exit Tawes using the Campus Drive Exit, walk to the road, turn left and follow Campus Drive as it curves to the right. Stamp will be on the left-hand side of the road.

Quiet Room

A quiet room will be reserved in Tawes Hall. We will have information on the exact location closer to the date of the Institute.

Lactation Rooms

The University of Maryland has several lactation rooms available. Tawes's lactation room is located on the third floor (3119) and is accessible with a key. To pick up the key, please contact rhetsa19@umd.edu.

Tawe's lactation room features three options for sitting (including two chairs next to tables and one comfortable chair) and electrical outlets. There is also a sink and refrigerator located in room 2115 (downstairs just below lactation room).

Stamp's Nursing Room is located on the second floor of the Stamp. Stop by the Stamp Information Desk for more information. The University of Maryland also has several other lactation rooms across campus. Restrooms

There are restrooms assigned for Men, Women, and Accessible, All-Gender/Family in both Tawes and Stamp. The Men's and Women's restrooms have standard accessible features: an additional stall with a higher toilet, grab bars, and (some) room to maneuver. However, sinks in the restrooms designated for Men and Women may be high for wheelchair users.

There are two all-gender/family restrooms in Tawes in the basement floor. In Stamp, there is an all-gender/family restroom located on the ground level directly across from the Stamp Ticket Office and Hoff Theater. This is a single unit restroom that is equipped with a baby changing station and a bench so that breast-feeding parents have a private restroom facility. Stamp's all-gender/family restroom can be locked from the inside which allows for parents with small children to use a private restroom facility.

Weather

In early June, the high temperature in College Park tends to be in the mid-to-low 80s. Nights tend to drop into the mid-to-low 60s. Summer can be hot and humid but also have unpredictable rainstorms, so we'd recommend packing a travel umbrella or light raincoat. We recommend bringing sweaters or light jackets for use inside the conference areas and in the evenings since temperatures can vary in June.

MilkBoy ArtHouse (MilkBoy)

MilkBoy is about a 14-minute walk from Tawes, a six-minute walk from the dorms, and a nine-minute walk from The Hotel. The front entrance is wheelchair accessible and there is an elevator to the second floor.




