Discussion Questions:

- How does the writer's tone differ from the diary entry?
- What makes this writing sound serious?

Example 3: Descriptive Poem

Golden leaves dance in the autumn breeze, Crisp air whispers through the tall trees. The river hums a quiet tune, Beneath the glowing harvest moon.

Discussion Questions:

- How does the writer's voice create a peaceful feeling?
- What words or phrases make the poem descriptive?
