He studied economics at the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) before transferring to the USC School of Cinematic Arts, where he focused on cinematography. He has shot branded work for McDonald's, Airbnb, Apple, and more. His branded work has aired on national television, and his narrative work has been screened at film festivals worldwide.

## Eliana Victoria Alcouloumre

Eliana Victoria Alcouloumre graduated from SCA in December of 2017 with a double major in Film & TV Production and Cinema & Media Studies. In the year since, she has worked full time as an on-set production assistant in feature film, television, and commercials. She is currently staffed on HBO/A24's upcoming series, *Euphoria*. Prior staffed PA credits include *Lucy in the Sky* and *Strange Angel*, as well as day playing on *This is Us*, *Call the Wild*, and a half dozen commercials. While still in school, Eliana worked as a researcher on the feature film *Detroit*, as well as the first seasons of *Mindhunter* and *Yellowstone*.

## Cinzia Angelini

Cinzia is a story artist and director, with an unbridled passion for all types of animation. Her years directing her independent short film "Mila", combined with her experience on some of the biggest animated features of our time, gives her a unique ability to develop a wide spectrum of projects. Most recently, these include her series of TedX talks in Italy and the U.S. that strive to promote socially relevant, short and feature length animated films.

## Clara Aranovich

Clara Aranovich is the daughter of two immigrants; an Argentine physicist and a Chilean market researcher/author. She holds a BA from Dartmouth in Literature/Creative Writing and an MFA from USC's School of Cinematic Arts in Film Production. Her narrative fiction work has competed in festivals around the world, from SXSW to Stockholm Film Festival, and has been featured by curators such as the Flux Screening Series at the Hammer Museum, NOWNESS.com and Le Cinéma Club. Her original web series, TANTALUM, stars Marcus Henderson (GET OUT) and is having its world premiere at the Tribeca Film Festival in April. Her feature MAYACAMAS earned her a spot in the Sundance Screenwriter's Intensive. Among other notable commercial successes, Clara is the first woman to ever direct a commercial for Major League Baseball, and her campaign with them went on to win a Bronze Lion and several Clios. Clara additionally loves the out-of-doors, dark absurdism, sci fi surrealism, and creamy peanut butter. When not writing or on set, she can usually be found watching films, on a mountain somewhere, or volunteering at a women's clinic with LA4Choice. She is also a certified Wilderness First Responder.

Lindsay Armstrong

Lindsay Armstrong graduated from the MFA program in the Winter of 2014. After graduation she moved to the Bay Area to work as assistant editor at Pixar, where she assisted on *Finding Dory* and the upcoming film *Onward*. She has since moved back down to LA and has been working as an assistant editor in film and television. She is currently working on Season 3 of Netflix's *GLOW* and is editing her first feature, *Nanay Ko*, which was directed by a fellow USC MFA alumna.

Jordan Bahat

A Los Angeles native and son of Israeli and German immigrants, Jordan began working as an editor while attending USC's School of Cinematic Arts. After graduating, he produced and directed the awarded feature length documentary, *Jealous of the Birds*, and began directing music videos for local bands. To date his music video work has acquired nearly half a billion views online while recognized and awarded at the Music Video Producer's Association, UK MVAs, MTV MVAs, and Vimeo staff picks. He has direct short-form documentaries on conceptual artist Adrian Villar Rojas, chefs Craig Thornton and Danny Bowien, and architect Tatiana Bilbao. His film, *The Bullet*, about the world's greatest living human cannonball, David "The Bullet" Smith, Jr took awards at the Seattle Intl Film Fest and Slamdance. His commercial work for clients such as Gatorade, Powerade, Toyota, Acura, Samsung, McDonalds, Google, Sony Playstation, Equinox and others, have won the Clio, ADDY, AdWeek ARC Award, Ciclope, and D&AD Pencil, amongst others - with work for Jeep featured during the Super Bowl in both 2015 and 2016. He has recently stepped into scripted filmmaking, having directed episodes of the TV show *Guidance for Awesomeness TV* and HULU, with a feature-length scripted debut forthcoming. He is represented for commercials by Caviar in the US and France, and Markenfilm in Germany.

## Ryan Bartley

Ryan Bartley has been working in theater, film, television, and radio since she was a child. After attending the prestigious theater program at Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts, located in Dallas, Texas, Ryan graduated early and relocated from Dallas to Los Angeles. There she began working in anime, video games, and animation. Her anime credits include *Re:ZERO* (Ram), *Sword Art Online The Movie: Ordinal Scale* (Yuna), *Charlotte* (Yusa Nishimori and Misa Kurobane), *Hunter x Hunter* (Komugi), *Mob Psycho 100* (Tsubomi and Mukai), *Berserk* (Nina), *Erased* (Osamu), *Maquia: When the Promised Flower Blooms* (Dita), and *Satellite Girl and Milk Cow* (KITSAT-1). Ryan is the English voice of Plachta in the Atelier video game franchise. She's also provided additional voices for some of the top performing recent feature films including *The LEGO Movie 2: The Second Part*, *The Boss Baby*, *Captain Underpants: The First Epic Movie*, *Spider-Man: Homecoming*, *Jumanji: Welcome to the Jungle*, *X-Men: Apocalypse*, *Avengers: Infinity War*, and *Bumblebee*. Ryan is the voice of Jay the blue jay in the Netflix original animated series *Treehouse Detectives*, the voice of Pamme the fennec fox in the Netflix original series *YooHoo to the Rescue*, the voice of Young Zeta on Nickelodeon's *Shimmer and Shine*, the voice of Pupkin Cake and Bunny Bow in the Shopkins franchise, and her on-camera work includes the Lifetime movie *Queen Sized*, the horror-comedy *Halloweerd*, and the award-winning digital series *L.A. Macabre*, available now on Amazon Prime. Ryan is a graduate of USC School of Cinematic Arts with a major in Cinema-Television Critical Studies and a minor in Screenwriting.

I grew up in Prague a film making family. My dad is a screenwriter and my mom is an actress. Movies were naturally a big part of my life. I come from the first generation of Czech people that were able to study abroad after the fall of the iron curtain. That's why upon finishing my Bachelors in Film Sound in 2008 I came to the the states as an exchange student where I began my Masters at West Virginia State University and then moved Los Angeles to study at USC where I received my Masters of Fine Arts in Film and TV Production specializing in sound. For the past five years I've been mostly freelancing as a sound designer and mixer for clients as Sony, Netflix, Universal or Lionsgate. I am mostly supervising independent features but I work on documentaries, music videos and commercials. I worked with Kanye West, Nas or Machine Gun Kelly. This year I've been nominated for the Motion Picture Sound Editors Award for - The best foreign feature.

Steven Brookman

Steven Brookman is the Co-Head of Motion Picture Business Affairs at leading entertainment agency Creative Artists Agency (CAA), where he serves as a high-level negotiator and advisor to many of the most acclaimed and successful artists in film today. He joined CAA in 2003 from the entertainment law firm Bloom, Hergott and Diemer, where he was a partner. Steven received his law degree from the University of California Berkeley and his undergraduate degree from Colgate University. Most recently, Steven has joined the University of Southern California School of Cinematic Arts faculty as a professor teaching the course "Breaking into the Entertainment Industry".

Linda Brown

Linda Brown is a recipient of a Kodak Vision Award for cinematography, a Kodak Education Award and a Fulbright Scholar. She studied filmmaking at Temple University and cinematography at AFI. Her credits include *Little Indiscretions*, *Lucky Bastard* and *American Beauties: In Pursuit of Art*, which she also produced. Brown shot *Walking to Waldheim* with Doris Roberts and episodes of Showtime's *Women: Stories of Passion*, plus various documentaries and music videos throughout her long career. Her documentary, *Your Favorite*, detailing her relationship with her father, won recognition at Athens International Film Festival and the American Film Festival. Brown's latest documentary, *You See Me*, received a USC Humanities Research Grant and has has screened in Spain, Poland, Netherlands, Singapore, Malaysia, Korea, Sudan and has received 7 nominations and 6 awards at international and national film festivals. Linda has taught at AFI, Maine Media Workshops, City University of Hong Kong, Temple University, the Red Sea Institute of Cinematic Arts and Multi-Media University in Malaysia. She is an Associate Professor and Head of the Cinematography track.

## Kimberley Browning

Kimberley Browning is a film and television producer based in Los Angeles. She is the founder and Festival Director of Hollywood Shorts, currently in its 20th season. She is an Associate Short Film Programmer at the Tribeca Film Festival. She previously served as an Associate Short Film programmer at Los Angeles Film Festival and Guadalajara Film Festival's Los Angeles annual FICGinLA. Raised in Washington DC, Kimberley studied music and film at the University of Southern California, then began her career working in production at Disney's Touchstone Television. She is also the Executive Producer of HBO Access, a directing and writing fellowship program for emerging talent from diverse backgrounds in episodic television, and is a directing mentor of YoungARTS regional Miami and Los Angeles programs. Her producing and directing credits include television, digital episodic content, feature films and documentary.

## Bonnie Bruckheimer

Bonnie Bruckheimer has been a film and television producer for many years, having produced such films as "Divine Secrets of the Ya-Ya Sisterhood", starring Sandra Bullock, Ellen Burstyn, James Garner, Ashley Judd, and Maggie Smith. She formed All Girl Productions, with partner, Bette Midler, in 1985 and made her debut as a film producer on "Beaches," having served previously as associate producer on "Big Business," the hit comedy that starred Bette Midler and Lily Tomlin. Her many screen credits include MAN OF THE HOUSE, FOR THE BOYS, THAT OLD FEELING, and she was Co-Producer on HOCUS POCUS. Bruckheimer served as executive producer on the Bette Midler HBO concert film "Diva Las Vegas" which earned ten Emmy nominations and won three Emmy awards, including "Outstanding Variety, Music or Comedy Special." She was also executive producer on the highly rated CBS special television production of "Gypsy" starring Bette Midler, which won both Emmy and Cable Ace Awards. She also served as Executive Producer on the short-lived "Bette" sitcom, after which All Girl closed its doors. In 2011, Bruckheimer had a dream come true, and started teaching the wonderful "History of Women in Film," "Career Choices and Challenges" course at USC School of Cinematic Arts. Because of her many years of working in film and television, she has had an array of influential, successful and fascinating guest speakers to her class. The class is limited to 25 students, but there is a waiting list, every fall. Bruckheimer has been involved in numerous charitable organizations, including eight years of National Spokesperson for Cedars-Sinai Research for Women's Cancers. She has been an animal rights activist and supports a variety of dog and cat rescues organizations. Bruckheimer is on the Advisory Committee of the National Women's History Museum. She has volunteered on political campaigns and travelled over the country, knocking on doors for the candidates she supports. She is active in several veteran's organizations. She is a mentor to many of her USC students and speaks at film schools, other than USC. In 2008, she became a volunteer grief counselor at Our [House-Grief.org](http://House-Grief.org), and has worked with teenagers grieving the death of a parent or parents, for the past nine years. This work has changed her life. Although Bruckheimer has enjoyed tremendous success in both career and personal life, she unequivocally states that the greatest achievement and joy of her life are her son, Keith Martell (31), a glassblower, who resides in Portland, Oregon, and her

daughter, Miranda Martell (27), Campaigns Manager at Fake Love, an ad agency, which is owned by the New York Times.

Logan Burdick

Logan Burdick is a multi-hyphenate creative, and digital media executive. His inaugural feature film, "Rhino" (starring Jared Gilman of Wes Anderson's "Moonrise Kingdom") is out this year.

Jordan is an Interaction Prototyper on Magic Leap's UX Team, where he's worked with a ton of different systems including gestures, eye tracking, meshing and shared experiences. He's particularly excited about VR & AR as a way to make tech that bends to people, rather than the other way around.

Chanell Chen

Chanell Chen is the Director of Entertainment and Media, Greater China at East West Bank, based in Shanghai. She has been with East West Bank since 2011 and specializes in providing highly structured financings for companies based in the US and in Mainland China that create, produce and distribute content. Chen has facilitated a number of landmark partnerships such as Perfect World's slate investment with Universal Pictures, Bona's investment in pictures produced and released by various studios including Twentieth Century Fox and Sony, the co-investment deal between Hunan TV & Ltd and Lionsgate Entertainment, and the multi-picture slate deal between Huayi Brothers Media Corp and STX Entertainment. She has worked in East West Bank's Entertainment Industries team in Beverly Hills before relocating to Shanghai in 2018.

Teresa Cheng

With more than 30 years of animation and visual effects production experience, Teresa Cheng has played key roles as a studio executive and a producer. Cheng most recently served as the general manager of Lucasfilm Singapore and previously oversaw production for the joint venture between DreamWorks Animation in the U.S. and the newly established Oriental DreamWorks in Shanghai as Senior Production Executive. Cheng's feature film credits include *Shrek Forever After*, *Madagascar*, *Batman & Robin* and *True Lies*. During her 17-year tenure at DreamWorks, Cheng traveled extensively to evaluate CG studios in Shanghai, Nanjing, Taipei, Seoul, Mumbai, Bangalore, Vancouver, Montreal and Toronto – culminating in the company's

expansion in China and India in the last few years. In the visual effects community, Cheng has worked as both a client (Warner Brothers Studio) and a vendor (Rhythm & Hues) and is no stranger to startups (Digital Domain). A native of Hong Kong, Cheng moved to Seattle where she received a Bachelor of Arts in Communications from the University of Washington. Cheng has also lived in Vancouver, Toronto, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Yokohama. Her interest in scuba diving has led to underwater excursions in Palau, Solomon Islands, Truk Lagoon, Belize, Curacao and Cayman Islands. She is an avid student of Brazilian percussion and recently started playing the ukulele.

#### Bonnie Chi

In addition to working with current students and alumni to cultivate and promote USC talent to the entertainment industry, Bonnie Chi oversees the office of Industry Relations. She is also an Adjunct Professor for the Marshall School of Business/School of Cinematic Arts (BCA) program. Chi has over 20 years of entertainment experience starting at The Chasin Agency, working her way over to the William Morris Agency until her move to the USC School of Cinematic Arts.

#### HyeonJeong Cho

HyeonJeong Cho is South Korean-born animated filmmaker and storyboard artist located in Los Angeles where she recently finished her MFA degree at *University of Southern California* for Animation and Digital Arts. Currently she is working as a Storyboard Revisionist at *Nickelodeon Animation Studio*. Her thesis film, *Nowhere* won the Best Animation at Los Angeles Cine Fest, and has been selected many film festivals such as *Palm Springs International Animation Festival*, *Bucheon international animation festival* and more. Before HyeonJeong comes to US, she has been in 20 countries including Working Holiday in Australia, 50 days solo backpacking in India, completing Camino de Santiago by herself in Spain, volunteer work in the Philippines. Also, she has diverse work experience in 4 different countries, South Korea, Australia, Japan and US. Most recently HyeonJeong interned at *Nickelodeon* as a Production Intern on *Shimmer and Shine* for Summer and Fall 2017, and the previous summer she worked at *Tokyo Broadcasting System* and created short animated assets and commercial bumpers for the TV show, *CatChat*, which was aired in Thailand in 2017.

#### Melissa Cobb

Melissa Cobb is Vice President of Original Animation at Netflix, the world's leading internet entertainment service. Cobb leads the content team responsible for bringing animated series and feature films to Netflix members in 190 countries around the world. Prior to Netflix, Cobb spent over a decade at DreamWorks Animation, where she produced the Academy Award-nominated *Kung Fu Panda* trilogy. She most recently served as Chief Creative Officer for Oriental DreamWorks, where she oversaw development and production as well as business and production strategy for a slate of high-quality animated feature films targeted to a global audience. Before joining DreamWorks, Cobb was at 20th Century Fox Feature Animation (*Titan A.E.* and *Ever After*) and Walt Disney Pictures, where she was responsible for discovering and

developing live action titles. Cobb earned an M.B.A. from the Anderson Graduate School of Management at UCLA and a Bachelor of Science from Stanford University.

### Elisabeth Collazos

Elisabeth Collazos is a freelance writer for publications and websites that focus upon Fashion, Art and Entertainment. She enjoys the creative and learning process of taking a writing project and developing it through fruition. Elisabeth especially enjoys interviewing artists and finding out what inspires them. Xiomara Comrie began her career in the film industry in 1990 in New York City as an Assistant Cameraperson. Her first jobs were on music videos and as an intern in the camera department on Spike Lee's *Malcolm X*. That exposure and experience led to a 2-year stint on *Law and Order* as a Camera Trainee and 2nd Assistant. For the next 15 years, Xiomara was fortunate enough to work alongside cinematographers Philippe Rousselot, Sven Nykvist, Robert Richardson and with directors Sidney Lumet, Robert Redford, Tim Burton, Robert DeNiro and Denzel Washington on projects including *Night Falls on Manhattan*, *Lions for Lambs*, *Big Fish*, *Planet of the Apes*, *The Good Shepherd*, *Antoine Fisher Story* and *The Great Debaters* and *Remember the Titans*. In October 2008, Xiomara joined the staff of the International Cinematographers Guild, Local 600 as a Business Representative and in late 2015, she was appointed the first National Diversity Officer. In addition to enforcing contracts and serving the membership, she is working alongside National Executive Director Rebecca Rhine, the diversity committee and women's groups to increase awareness and promote inclusion and access within the membership and the industry. Under her watch, Local 600 has implemented negotiating seminars for women, Unconscious Bias training for the Local 600 Board and has various collaborations with numerous organizations including the PGA, Hollywood CPR, Canon and Tiffen. She is particularly interested in expanding access and opportunities for future cinematographers and camera persons. Xiomara is a proud 1st generation American of Panamanian descent and mother of 2 toddlers, Walker and Camila. She is an avid runner and an amazing tennis player.

## Liz Cook Mowe

Liz Cook is the Director of Documentary film at Kickstarter. Previously she has worked in France with the U.S. State Department, in India with A.R. Rahman, composer and musician, and in NYC as the acquisitions manager for the digital distributor, SnagFilms. She has spoken at a variety of film festivals including Sundance, SXSW, TIFF, Tribeca, Cannes, Sheffield Doc Fest, Hot Docs, and IDFA. Kickstarter is a public benefit corporation focused on bringing creative projects to life through crowdfunding. Since the company started 10 years ago, more than \$4 billion dollars have been pledged to support over 160k creative projects. Of that, we have seen more than 26k successfully funded film projects with more than \$430 million dollars pledged to films in total.

## Midge Costin

Midge Costin is the Kay Rose Professor in the Art of Dialogue & Sound Editing. She is the first to hold this endowed chair, which was given by George Lucas in 2005 and has been Head of Sound at SCA since 2000. For 20 years, Costin has been a feature film sound editor in Hollywood, having worked at every major studio. Costin has collaborated on the soundtracks for filmmakers such as John Waters (*Crybaby*), David Wolper (*Imagine: John Lennon*), Kenneth Branagh (*Dead Again*), Tony Scott (*Crimson Tide*) and Jerry Bruckheimer (*The Rock*). Two of the films, *Crimson Tide* and *Armageddon*, for which she edited effects and dialogue, received Academy Award nominations for Sound Editing. Several of the films Costin has sound edited have received nominations for the Motion Picture Sound Editors' Golden Reel Award. *Crimson Tide* won for Best Feature Film Sound Editing. Costin worked her way up to editing sound on action adventure films at a time when very few women were cutting Fx in Hollywood (a situation which has not changed significantly). She is a past Board member of the MPSE and is a long-standing member of the Editors Guild. Her avocation as a surf kayaker has earned her a spot on the U.S. Surf Kayaking Team in 2005, the winner of the World Championship in Costa Rica. In 2007, the team took fifth place in Spain.

Jayjit DasGupta

Jayjit DasGupta started out in Theater. He studied directing at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts (RADA). He was the Artistic Director and Executive Producer of the Generic Theatre Co. in Washington DC. In 2001, he became the first ever undergraduate to be awarded the Lannan Fellowship for Writing at the Folger Shakespeare Library. Loss of close friends at the Pentagon during September 11<sup>th</sup> propelled Jayjit to take a hiatus from the arts. He studied medicine at the University of Tennessee. He served on the Heart & Lung Transplant team at Vanderbilt University and trained at University of Pennsylvania and the Gift of Life programs. During his tenure at SCA, he was awarded the Jean and Ruth Negulesco Fellowship in 2016 for Writing and Directing. He is a two-time College Television Awards finalist in the Commercials category. In 2017, he was invited to be a part of the prestigious internship program at the Emmys/Television Academy. He was also elected the Student Body President for all 7 divisions for 2017 and 2018. Since his graduation in 2018, Jayjit has been directing commercials locally and internationally. He has primarily been working with Left Productions. His latest project was with JWT India and the State of Gujarat tourism. His next project is with the Tales of the Cocktail group. He is repped by Innovative Artists.

Lauren Dineley is the Coordinator at Writ Large, a literary management and production company based in Los Angeles. Lauren is originally from Toronto, Canada where she attended the University of Toronto. She graduated from the Peter Stark Producing Program at USC's School of Cinematic Arts in 2016. She has produced several theatrical productions, and two short films.

Rebecca Doyle

#### Jack Epps

Jack Epps, Jr. is an award winning writer and filmmaker who first became involved in making films while an undergraduate at Michigan State University. Inspired by a student film festival, Epps made his first film the following semester and has been making movies ever since. His student film *The Pigs vs the Freaks*, was purchased by NBC and made into a Movie of the Week, re-titled *Off Sides*. Epps produced and worked as second unit director on the film. Upon arriving in California, Epps wrote an episode of *Hawaii Five-O* and *Kojak*. While continuing to pursue his writing, Epps also worked as a cinematographer and an assistant cameraman on various local productions. Epps had the good fortune to work for a period of time as a second unit cameraman and assistant cameraman for Orson Welles on Mr. Welles' last film, *The Other Side of the Wind*. Epps united with his screenwriting professor from Michigan State University, Jim Cash, and began writing screenplays together. After writing seven unproduced screenplays, their first produced screenplay was *Top Gun* which went on to become the #1 world wide box office hit in 1986. Within eleven months, the writing team of Cash & Epps had three produced screenplays in the theaters: *Top Gun*, *Legal Eagles*, and *The Secret of My Success*. As a screenwriter, Mr. Epps co-authored over 25 screenplays and eight produced motion pictures including *Dick Tracy*, *Turner & Hooch*, and *Anaconda*. Epps also did extensive revisions on *Sister Act* and *Die Hard III*. While Epps is primarily known for co-authoring big actions movies, Epps equally enjoyed writing romantic charm and chase comedies inspired by the films of Hitchcock, Wilder and Sturges. Films like *The Secret of My Success*, *Legal Eagles*, *Turner & Hooch*, *Viva Rock Vegas*, and *Sister Act* are examples of the comedy of Cash & Epps. Recently, Epps wrote the video game *Top Gun* for the Sony PlayStation network. Epps has also written video games for THQ. Epps had the pleasure to write for some of the most successful actors in the motion picture industry including Robert Redford, Tom Cruise, Tom Hanks, Warren Beatty, Michael J. Fox, Debra Winger, Al Pacino, Anthony Edwards, Bruce Willis, Meg Ryan, and John Voight. He also worked with such motion picture giants as Ivan Reitman, Jerry Breckheimer, Joel Silver, Herb Ross, Tony Scott and Dick Donner. Epps was recently honored as the recipient of the first Victoria and Jack Oakie Endowed Chair in Comedy at the School of Cinematic Arts. Epps was the fall 2008 commencement speaker at the Michigan State University graduation ceremonies and was awarded an honorary doctorate by Michigan State University. In addition, Epps is recipient of the Michigan State University Spartans in Hollywood Lifetime Achievement Award. In addition, the team of Cash & Epps was recently honored by the American Film Institute as one of the Top 100 Greatest Quotes in American Cinema for their line: "I feel the need... the need for speed." Epps is a thirty five year member of the Writer's Guild of America, and a member of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

Michele Farinola

Michele Farinola has been working in documentary features and television for over twenty years. She is currently the executive producer at PCH Films, where she recently produced DAVID CROSBY: REMEMBER MY NAME along with Cameron Crowe's Vinyl Films and BMG, which sold to Sony Pictures Classics at the 2019 Sundance Film Festival and will be released in theaters July 2019. She is currently producing LINDA RONSTADT: THE SOUND OF MY VOICE for CNN Films, which will premiere at the 2019 Tribeca Film Festival in April. Prior to PCH, Michele served as Co-Head of Documentary Features at Spitfire Pictures, a unit of Exclusive Media, where she was an executive producer of the 2012 Academy Award® winning documentary, UNDEFEATED released by The Weinstein Company and the 2012 Grammy®

Award winning documentary, FOO FIGHTERS: BACK AND FORTH. In addition, Michele was the executive in charge of production of HBO's 2012 Emmy® winning documentary, GEORGE HARRISON: LIVING IN THE MATERIAL WORLD, directed by Martin Scorsese; and THE LAST PLAY AT SHEA, released by Lionsgate and Showtime. Michele started her entertainment career at Paramount Pictures and 20th Century Fox, working for a studio chairman, eventually segueing into producing and directing dozens of high-profile, award winning cable documentary series and specials for AMC, A&E, USA Network, SciFi Channel, Starz and Animal Planet under the Fox Television Studios banner.

## Michael Fink

Michael has earned degrees from California State University Northridge, San Francisco Art Institute, and California Institute of the Arts, in an attempt to leave behind a checkered past that included stints as an Army officer, a money manager, and a studio artist and photographer. Michael started his film career on "The China Syndrome", followed shortly by films such as "Star Trek – The Motion Picture", and "Blade Runner". Michael received his first Visual Effects Supervisor credit on "War Games" in 1982. And during the very early years of digital animation and visual effects, on films such as "Buckaroo Banzai" and "Project X", Michael innovated novel ways to integrate computer graphics with live action and traditional visual effects. In 1988, Michael saw Kirk Gibson hit the game winning home run in the first game of the World Series between the Dodgers and the Oakland A's. Michael produced and directed for Sony a live action and animation short which was the first demonstration of real-time integration of computer graphics with high definition video in 1989 (Symbolics and Sony HDTV). Michael received an Academy Award nomination for "Batman Returns" in 1993. In that film he supervised the creation of the first photo-real computer graphic creatures in a feature film that faithfully replicated existing, living, beings (penguins and bats). In 1993, Michael directed the first Coca-Cola "Polar Bear" spot, which may be the first public showing of a computer graphic creature with three-dimensional fur. Michael was honored in October 2001 at the Premio Immagine in Milan, Italy for his contribution to the art and science of digital filmmaking. In 2008, Michael received an Academy Award for Best Visual Effects, and a BAFTA Award for Best Special Visual Effects for the film "The Golden Compass". The film combined live action, animation, and visual effects in nearly every cut. From 2008 to 2011 Michael headed the North American visual effects group of Prime Focus, and guided the development of a global visual effects pipeline between North America, the U.K., and India. He supervised visual effects and animation on a number of films, including Terrence Malick's "Tree of Life". Michael was happy to contribute to the Academy Award winning film "Life of Pi" in 2012, working with BUF Compagnie on a 1½ minute sequence known as Tiger Vision, which was often cited in reviews of the film as a seminal moment in the story, establishing the strong bond between Pi and Richard Parker, the tiger. Michael is a Professor at the University of Southern California School of Cinematic Arts, and continues to do 2nd unit directing, visual effects supervision, and consulting on visual effects, animation, and 3D projects. He serves as Chair of the Division of Film and Television Production, and holds the George Méliès Endowed Chair in Visual Effects, and the Kortschak Family Endowed Division Chair in Film and Television Production. He is on the Executive Committee of the Visual Effects Branch of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences,

and is a founding member, former Board member, and a Fellow of the Visual Effects Society. Michael and his wife Melissa Bachrach live in Los Angeles.

### Sean Flanagan

Sean Flanagan is a writer/producer who has made his name in film distribution and marketing, working on over 800 feature films in the past five years. He has worked for Swingset Creative, BidSlate, Mojomakers, Buffalo 8, Visual Data Media Services, Premiere Digital, Quiver and for dozens of North American distributors during his career. Key projects include Al Pacino's *Wilde Salome*, Ashley Judd's *Trafficked*, Zedd: *True Colors* and HBO's *Dia De Gracias*. Previous clients include Sundance Institute, Film Rise, Paradigm and Samuel Goldwyn. Founded in 2013, Mammal Studios has worked on projects such as *"Yellowstone, seasons 1 & 2"* (Paramount Network), *"Bird Box"* & *"Bright"* (Netflix), *"Fury"* & *"The Shallows"* (Sony Pictures), *"Bad Times as the El Royale"* & *"Joy"* (Fox), and music videos for *"Eminem"*, *"The Weeknd"* and *"Sza"*, among many other film, television and music video projects. A graduate of USC (B.A. English/Creative Writing, class of '93), Michael was also a member of the Men's Water Polo team, as well as being selected for T.C. Boyle's *Advanced Writer's Program*. Fight on!

#### Butch Hartman

Michigan native Butch Hartman remembers wanting to create cartoons as far back as kindergarten. "I drew a picture of my teacher and she kept raving about it. I realized art was a good way to get attention and I was hooked," said Hartman. He has been with Nickelodeon for 18 years, spearheading four successful series including: *The Fairly OddParents*, *Danny Phantom*, *T.U.F.F. Puppy* and *Bunsen is a Beast*. Hartman pursued drawing through high school and then attended Cal Arts to study animation. Hartman decided on animation as a career after working freelance as an assistant animator for Don Bluth on "An American Tail" during his junior year at Cal Arts. Upon graduation, he worked as a character designer and storyboard artist for Marvel Productions, and later, Ruby Spears Productions. Soon after, he earned a job working on *Family Dog* for Amblin Television before joining Hanna-Barbera in 1991. Hartman worked at Hanna-Barbera for six years doing storyboard work, directing cartoons and creating his own shorts for *What A Cartoon!* He also wrote and directed episodes of *Dexter's Laboratory*, *Cow & Chicken* and *Johnny Bravo* before churning out three shorts – *Pfish & Chip*, *Hillbilly Blue* and *Gramps*. Following his stint at Hanna-Barbera, Hartman began working on Nickelodeon's *Oh Yeah, Cartoons!* where he created a new short, *The Fairly OddParents*. The short was then developed into an animated series and became a mega-hit for the network when it launched in 2001. *The Fairly OddParents* ranks as Nickelodeon's third longest running animated series,

behind *SpongeBob SquarePants* and *Dora the Explorer*. It has currently been running steadily on Nickelodeon for the last 17 years. In 2011, Nickelodeon commemorated the 10th anniversary of the animated series with the live-action/CG animated TV movie *A Fairly Odd Movie: Grow Up, Timmy Turner!* The series came to life once again in the original TV movie, *A Fairly Odd Christmas* in 2012 and *A Fairly Odd Summer* in 2014. *The Fairly OddParents* was nominated for an Emmy in 2002 in the Outstanding Music and Lyrics category for an original song co-written by Hartman entitled, "I Wish Every Day Could Be Christmas." The series garnered two additional Emmy nominations the following year in the same category for original songs co-written by the creator entitled, "What Girls Love" and "It's Great to be a Guy," and in 2004 for "Wish Come True!." *The Fairly OddParents* received two BMI Cable Awards for Outstanding Theme Song and Underscore in 2002 and 2003. In 2010, *The Fairly OddParents* earned an Emmy nomination for Outstanding Writing. The successful animated series has also earned several Annie Award nominations. In 2004, Hartman created *Danny Phantom*, an animated comedy series featuring a teenage boy endowed with ghost-like superpowers, and in 2010, he created the Nickelodeon animated series, *T.U.F.F. Puppy*, which follows a gung-ho, dim-witted dog named Dudley Puppy who is thrust into the role of "hero" when recruited by the super secret crime fighting organization T.U.F.F. (Turbo Undercover Fighting Force). In 2015 Nickelodeon announced the 20-episode greenlight for Hartman's fourth series with the network, *Bunsen is a Beast*, following the adventures of Bunsen, the first beast ever to attend a human grade school, and his human best friend Mikey. Hartman also launched his own online kid's destination called "THE NOOG NETWORK". An interactive app featuring all-original cartoons, live-action shows and games for kids. Some of which were created by Hartman himself. Butch has also become a You Tube creator. His channel: "Butch Hartman" currently has 740,000 subs and is growing steadily. It's a great arena that allows him to create whatever he wants for his ever-expanding audience. In 2005, Hartman and his wife, Julieann, founded Hartman House, a non-profit foundation whose mission is to help underprivileged children all around the world. Since its formation, Hartman House has helped support numerous global child-based charities, including The Angola Girls Project, a shelter for adolescent girls in Angola, Africa. Hartman House has also spearheaded aid projects in orphanages in Uganda, Africa and Haiti. In Los Angeles, Hartman House has funded school scholarships for inner city children and sponsored a complete home renovation for a family in need.
