



- BGA (Better Government Association) has created this database since 2012
- Went all across the state FOIA-ing for govt. salary details
- Was a good research tool, but wanted to give more context
 - "This is how much this gov body spends on salary. This is compared to other likeminded or like-sized bodies"
- Went and retroactively asked how much was paid in base time, overtime
- See an increase of officers making more money
- Broaden the context on that
- FOIA-ed 900 agencies across IL
- A lot of info you'd find on data portal, but wouldn't have been able to find it for some downstate communities
- The database is here: https://salary.bettergov.org/
- Essentially this is managed in a Gmail account
 - Asking for list of employees and total compensation (last name, first name, middle name or initial, suffix, title, dept., annual base salary, extra pay, and a few more fields)
- IL Public Salaries database is open source all the way down -- Django App, PostgresSQL, and
- Highest paid employee in city of Chicago in 2017: Ginger S. Evans, Commissioner of Aviation (has since left that job)
- Can search people from the homepage
- Highest paid department: Chicago Police Department
- Can also get the data behind the agency
- There are plans to add 200,000 more records and 120 more agencies worth of data

Presentation Questions

"Q: What do you get when Chewbacca spills chocolate on himself?"***

A: A chocolate chip wookie!!!!

- 1. You mentioned the request includes "extra pay." Is that data broken out into smaller categories, so you can see bonuses vs. overtime (for example)?
 - a. It isn't on the display broken down into multiple, but if it came in the response, it would have it. Larger employers have it. Fire depts have Rule 9 or something -- multiple pay-grades for what they're doing (sweeping the floor, driving the engine, staying up 48 hours). Raw data lets you look at more granular info.
- 2. Did any agencies include contractors' pay?
- 3. When responses came in a less structured format (e.g., PDFs), how did you extract the relevant data?
- 4. Pensions
 - a. Totally different dataset, but we're tracking it too. We have the pre-version on the site right now. That's our next thing.
 - b. There's a lot of potential for pensions and the way we have it. Tier 2, Tier 3 pensions -- will it make a difference in a few years? Will be able to correlate salary to annuitance.
- 5. Statistics of rejected/success rates on FOIA?
 - a. Responded within legal 10-day period: 60%
 - i. Some gave an excuse
 - b. Filled all but 3 of the FOIA requests -- one went to court and was settled, two more court
 - c. Jared calls every day to hound people
 - d. No deletions, no reason for any of this to be held back for exemptions -- you just have to push, push
- 6. How did you combine all that data into that database?
 - a. Mostly R, doing a lot on back end
 - b. Then Jared sends to DataMade
 - c. This round had a little more to validate dates -- spin things out, get those fixed
 - d. Import script takes flat files and formats them into these models powering views
- 7. How much time to clean that data?
 - a. 3-4 months and an army of grad students
 - b. Work with IRE (based out of Mizzou)
 - c. One agency in southern Illinois handwrites this data, and it has to be typed into a spreadsheet
- 8. Privacy with salary -- how do you do risk analysis to make sure there's no harm for ppl and families? (particularly with the raw data)
 - a. Got 3-4 responses where they provided home phone number, address, SSN, salary, etc.
 - b. Jared cleaned stuff up to have non-identifying info
 - c. Try to stress context

- d. Not letting Google index pages of those getting less than \$30k
- e. Earnings are one aspect of who you are. Doesn't prevent ppl from looking for specific person. Can't really specifically look for someone in vulnerable position
- 9. Do you account for non-monetary benefits?
 - a. We try to remove the health, pension, other benefits not accounted for in the paycheck
 - b. Wanted to make it how people view your take-home pay
 - c. Easier way to make apples-to-apples comparison
- 10. Have govt agencies reacted to this data? To any race or gender disparities?
 - a. There hasn't been that
 - b. But this is the first step in finding out things like that
 - c. Hope it will be used by us, other agencies, universities -- want to empower people with this info
 - d. Can we sort by gender or race?
 - i. No gender or race data in what we have
 - ii. It would have to be joined
 - iii. You can take the data, take it to Cook Co, and figure it out yourself
- 11. Discrepancies in terms of part time, full time?
 - a. It's anyone who makes any money
 - b. Contractors tend to be on different scale
 - c. Chicago keeps that info
 - d. Specialty employees kept specific for certain departments
 - e. We try to fact check this as best we can -- we go back, look for mistakes
 - f. Encourage people to let us know about any mistakes they see
