

MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

There are many amazing merit scholarship programs across the United States. If finances are a big component of your college decision and you meet the stated eligibility requirements, you may want to consider applying to institutions that grant these awards.

NATIONAL

Some significant national awards that are applicable at most colleges and universities across the country include but are not limited to:

- The Coca-Cola Scholarship
- The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Scholarship
- The Bryan Cameron Foundation Scholarship
- The Gates Scholarship

SCHOLAR PROGRAMS

Another category of scholarships is those tied to required programming and offered through a specific College or University. Often, they have a separate application process from an application for admission to the school itself and may include essays, recommendation letters, and interviews. These opportunities often cover a full ride of tuition, room, board, books, etc. but also include funding for summer experiences, internships, study abroad opportunities, conferences, and more. They often have special events for the scholar cohorts and may provide a smaller community for students socially.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES TIED TO THE APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

Typically, information about these and other scholarship programs is available on individual school financial aid websites, so it's advised that in the process of solidifying your college list, you are proactively seeking such opportunities. Often, all that is needed to be considered is an application for admission to the school (sometimes to the honors college specifically). In these cases, the Undergraduate Admissions office refers qualified applicants out to scholarship program administrators who invite students to apply, interview, etc. If you need help identifying these opportunities, please contact the Director of College Counseling, who has a list of over 60 programs.

ADDITIONAL APPLICATIONS NEEDED (separate from the school's application for admission)

Some scholarship programs have open applications. This means that any student applying to the college or University may **also** apply to be considered for one of these programs. Again, these programs have separate applications from the application for admission to the school. Some of the biggest (and most selective) awards include, but are not limited to:

- The Park Scholarship and Goodnight Scholarship at NC State
- The Robertson Scholars Program at UNC-Chapel Hill and Duke
- The Chancellor's Scholars and Wilson Scholars at Appalachian State University
- The EC Scholars Program at East Carolina University
- The Bonner Scholars Program at Wofford College
- The Hesburgh-Yusko Scholars Program at Notre Dame
- The Danforth Scholars Program at Washington University in St. Louis
- The Forty Acres Scholars Program at the University of Texas at Austin
- The Hunt Leadership Scholars at Southern Methodist University
- Questbridge Scholarships are accepted at a number of partner schools
- Stamps Scholarship are accepted at a number of partner schools

Other significant merit-based scholarship programs require an endorsement from the high school. For those, a Scholarship Committee comprised of Upper School faculty and staff decides who will be named the school nominee for that particular award. Those include, but are not limited to:

- The Morehead-Cain at UNC-Chapel Hill (students may self-nominate)
- The Levine Scholarship at UNC-Charlotte (students may self-nominate)
- The Belk Scholarship and the Bryan Scholarship (for athletes) at Davidson
- The Wofford Scholars at Wofford College
- The Jefferson and Waltentas Scholarships at the University of Virginia

To receive consideration to be named the Trinity School nominee and be eligible to apply for these awards, interested seniors must <u>complete this form</u> and explain which scholarship(s) you'd like to be considered for in the school's nomination process. Please be sure to reference the selection criteria for each award end explain how you have met that stated criteria.
