Description: Bedford High School is a four-year comprehensive high school in Temperance, Michigan. The school year consists of two semesters and four quarters. Students have seven classes daily (including lunch and homeroom), five days a week. Students have the opportunity to earn six credits per school year. Bedford High School teaches Grades 9-12 students and follows the Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC). We are also home to the Bedford Virtual Academy. Students can take courses to meet their interests, needs, or desired career pathways. Bedford High School courses available are special education courses, nine (9) Advanced Placement courses, four (4) Honors Courses, career /technical education, cooperative work-study, virtual courses, visual performing applied art courses, and college credit opportunities, including dual enrollment. Bedford Senior High School has no announced Top-Ten, Valedictorian, or Salutatorian named or has a speaking part at graduation. Students are honored for academic achievements through our designated policy for the graduating class.
