- Create a project that includes all 5 elements: description of the habitat, location, climate, animals, and plants. It also has at least 1 more piece of additional information using books, encyclopedias, and website resources.
- Include three accurate facts given for each element including the additional information using books, encyclopedias, and website resources.
- Properly cite the resources accurately using Citation Machine.
- Create an attractive project in terms of design, layout, and neatness while including four pictures.
- Create a project that includes only a couple (1-2) of grammar, punctuation, and capitalization mistakes in the final project.
- Create a presentation video that is 1 min. 45 sec. to 2 min. 15 sec.
- Utilize the "Habitat Rubric" to rate peer's presentations with 4 comments (Appendix A).

("Be" Statements (PBIS)) Students will:

- Use time during class appropriately by staying focused on getting the project done and not distracting others by not getting any referrals.
- Utilize and follow the checklist to help aid their project with 90% of it checked off.
- Use technology and internet safely by avoiding any websites unrelated to Habitat Site.
- Analyze peer presentations and give 4 respectful comments in the "Habitat Peer Review Rubric" using the Google Form (Appendix D).
