

ENGL 104: Critical Thinking & Composition (3 units)

Meeting times: M/W 2:45 - 4:15 pm

This course is designed to develop the student's critical thinking, reading and writing skills beyond the level achieved in ENGL 101.0. It will focus primarily on the analysis and evaluation of expository and argumentative discourse, and on writing analytical and argumentative essays. Transfers to both UC/CSU.

Prerequisite: completion of ENGL 101.0, minimum grade C.

Replaces 12th grade senior English

ECON 100: Introduction to Economics (3 units)

Meeting time: Online

Explore and learn basic economic theories and models and apply them to analyze contemporary economic issues. Topics include U.S. economic issues including minority and ethnic concerns and international economic issues, e.g. wealth and income distribution, sustainable economic growth, health care reform, unemployment, environmental issues, regulation, deregulation, inflation, interest rates, discrimination, corporations and labor unions and contemporary labor issues. Transfers to both UC/CSU.

Replaces 12th grade senior Economics

MUSC 118: Survey of Rock and Roll (3 units)

Meeting times: M/W 2:45 - 4:10 pm

This course will discuss the unfolding of rock and roll as a modern musical genre. It will also discuss societal influence on its development as well as its impact on modern society. Other styles of contemporary commercial music will be discussed and analyzed within the general historical scope of this survey. Transfers to both UC/CSU.

May count as an A-G VPA

SOC 101: Intro to Sociology (3 units)

Meeting times: M/W 2:45 - 4:10 pm

This course is a survey of the various characteristics of social life, the process of social interaction and the tools of sociological investigation. Emphasis is on culture, socialization, and basic institutions.

Transfers to both UC/CSU.

Prerequisite: ENGL 101.0 or ENGL 101H - Recommended prior to taking this course, but not required.

HIST 104: World History Since 1500 (3 units)

Meeting times: M/W 2:45 - 4:15 pm

Course will cover the period of 1600 to the 1980s and will focus on the making of the modern world. Interlocking themes will include the discovery of the New World and the rise of Capitalism, the resistance to this new economic system by the non-White world, the spread of Imperialism and the division of the world into "core" (industrial). Transfers to both UC/CSU.

Replaces high school World History and/or AP European History

CTMF 121B: Intermediate Woodworking (3 units)

Meeting time: see Mr. Chapman K-1000

This is an intermediate woodworking class. Topics include safety, tools, the composition of wood and its characteristics, finishing, intermediate design and sketching, and project planning. Students will generate shop drawings adequate to build the project. Students will measure, cut, and use power tools and general woodworking techniques. **Transfer: Not transferable to UC/CSU.**

Prerequisite: completion of CTMF 121A, minimum grade C-. Lecture Hours: 36.00; Lab Hours: 54.00
