

Syllabus for PM Semester Course

PROJECT MANAGEMENT FUNDAMENTALS

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Project Management Fundamentals introduces high school students to project management from the standpoint of a manager who must organize, plan, implement, and control tasks to achieve an organization's schedule, budget, and performance objectives. Tools and concepts such as project charter, scope statement, work breakdown structure, project estimating, and scheduling methodologies are studied. What is a project? How do you manage one? What is the best approach? This is an opportunity to learn the project management fundamentals that can guide a project through a maze of challenges to successful completion!

COURSE OBJECTIVES

After completing this course, you should be able to:

- 1 Apply project management framework, processes, and tools to execute complex projects in organizations.
- 2 Examine the roles that project management plays in accomplishing an organization's strategic objectives.
- 3 Develop effective approaches for managing high-performance project teams, communication strategies, and best practice closeout strategy that maximizes the value of the project experience.
- 4 Critique the impacts of schedule, cost, and scope elements in projects and analyze different techniques for managing risks.
- 5 Create project Charters, Scope statements, Work Breakdown Structures (WBS), GANNT Charts, and Responsibility Assignment Matrix (RAM).

Discussions/Mini Assignments

During each module you will participate in class discussion followed by a variety of mini assignments to reinforce learning. The course also utilizes quizzes and a final project.

Final Project

At the end of the semester, you and your team are required to present a final project in the form of an executive project management *high level* report to your company's Vice Presidents and Directors. The goal is to produce a report addressing project management activities and tasks that will be handled by the team that you will lead. In this paper, you will apply a range of project management principles and methodologies presented throughout the course.
