Keynote: Becoming the Buffalo AKG

Presented by: Jillian Jones & Jamie Robideau

Hear from Jillian Jones, Deputy Director, about the physical and philosophical transformation of the Albright-Knox to the Buffalo AKG Art Museum, a cornerstone of our region’s rich cultural landscape since 1862. Jillian will speak to the museum’s positioning in the years before the project, the tactical process of pursuing the largest expansion in the museum’s history, and how the reassembled campus has reinvented nearly everything the AKG does and how it does it.

Jamie Robideau – the AKG’s Director of Facilities Planning & Management – will also be presenting.

Brouck Amerga, Vice President & Operations Manager of the Turner Construction Co., will present his company’s work on this \$1.2 billion construction project. Brouck is currently serving as the Procurement Manager for this project.
