## 2025 Junior - Senior Prom Dress Code Details and Guidelines

Trinity Christian School partners with its families by putting modesty guidelines in place to ensure a healthy and respectable environment for our students. We ask that families partner with TCS by complying with our modesty guidelines. When choosing a dress, please make sure it not only honors God, but it represents your Christian character and Trinity Christian School positively. Please do not let your social media posts create a false representation of our standards and dance dress code.

## For the Guys

- A suit jacket with a tie, a collared, button-up shirt, and loose-fitting dress pants (avoid extremely tight pants).
- No shorts, no jeans, or overly casual attire will be permitted.
- Shirts must remain fully buttoned throughout the dance.
- No pierced earrings or nose piercings.

## For the Girls

- Dresses should not have a lace see through corset look. Any sheer fabric needs to be backed with a solid non-skin color fabric. Otherwise, coverage will be provided.
- Slits should not be higher than 6 inches above the knee. Slits that are high and expose a significant portion of the upper thigh will be given biker shorts and safety pins.
- No exposed low V necks. This includes sheer fabric. Low V-necks need to be backed with a solid non-skin color fabric. Otherwise, a modesty panel will be provided.
- We should not see any cleavage or parts of your chest. If any is noticeable, a cloth or modesty panel and safety pins will be provided.
- The back of the dress should be raised to not have any view or exposure of the small of the back. Use the natural waistline as the guide. If the back is too low, biker shorts will be provided.
- If dresses have lace as a top layer, the underlayer should not be close to your skin tone because it gives the impression we are seeing your skin. Coverage will be provided.
- No large cut-outs at mid-section or sides of the dress. Coverage will be provided.
- Pierced jewelry is limited to earrings (no nose piercings).

<u>Important Information to Note</u> --If students end up coming to the dance with attire that does not meet our guidelines, we will have modifications ready to help students meet dress code compliance before we permit students to enter. Therefore, it is better for you to handle dress modifications prior to arriving for a more clean appearance and to avoid embarrassment. Non-compliant students will be asked to leave.
