Introduce the topic and background of the study

- Articulate the problem or research gap
- Present the rationale and significance
- State the research objectives and/or hypotheses
- Provide the research questions
- Briefly situate the study in relevant literature

2. Methodology (800–1,000 words)

Describe research design, participants or data sources, instruments, data collection and analysis procedures, and ethical considerations.

3. Results (1,000–1,200 words)

Present findings based on research questions. Use tables or figures to support findings (if applicable). Avoid interpretation—focus on reporting the results.

4. Discussion (1,000–1,200 words)

Interpret key findings in relation to literature. Discuss implications, possible explanations, study limitations, and contributions to the field.

5. Conclusion (400–600 words)

Summarize key findings, emphasize implications, provide recommendations, and suggest future research directions.

Acknowledgment (50–100 words)

(Optional) Recognize any individual, institution, or funding agency that contributed to the success of the study but does not qualify for authorship.
