Mrs. Hiltz's Grade 6 Homeroom

- **Inside sneakers (suitable for Phys. Ed.)**
- **Pencils (LOTS of them, but keep most of the supply at home so they don't become misplaced)**
- **Small pencil sharpener**
- **Erasers (the white ones work best)**
- **Colored pencils**
- **Colored markers**
- **BLACK SHARPIE MARKERS (at least 2 regular ones and 2 thin sharpies for fine lines - We use these a LOT, especially for art)**
- **HIGHLIGHTERS (2 of each - blue, yellow, green, pink, orange)WE NEED THESE FOR WRITING**
- **2 Glue sticks**
- **30 cm ruler**
- **Grade six will need Tracing Paper (we use this for our geometry unit)**
- **WHITE BOARD MARKERS (used throughout the year for math and other subject areas. They go through these quickly and are used every day.)**
- **Blue duo tang for Music (Pockets in the duo tang would be a bonus)**
- **Duotang for French Class and a HILROY scribbler**
- **Wired HEADPHONES with a microphone (for FRENCH and Music class) to use for online activities (they don't need to be expensive)**
- **TWO three ring 1 ½" Binders (for ELA and MATH)**
- **Scissors**
- **Loose leaf (at least 500 sheets would be fantastic, as we will be using binders instead of scribbles this year to stay more organized)**
- **Pencil case (an additional one for markers and colored pencils is also a good idea, if at all possible)**
- **Combination lock for student lockers and fee for locker rental (\$2.00) (Please do not send "keyed" locks, as keys are often lost)**
- **Extra change of clothes and antiperspirant/deodorant for Phys.Ed.**
- **Cheap calculator for math**
- **Pocket folders (2 should be fine)**
- **Grade 6 students will need a Protractor (we don't use the rest of the math sets and it's much cheaper to buy protractors separately instead of getting the whole math set – you can get these at Dan's Bargain Center)**
