

Culturally Responsive-Sustaining Pedagogy

Getting Started Guide

What is it?

Culturally responsive education (closely related to the terms "culturally relevant" and "culturally sustaining" education) refers to the combination of teaching, pedagogy, curriculum, theories, attitudes, practices, and instructional materials that center students' culture, identities, and contexts throughout educational systems.¹

Why use it?

Research shows that culturally responsive-sustaining education can "increase student academic engagement, attendance, grade point averages, graduation rates, civic engagement, positive racial self-images, and self-definition." In addition to positive academic experiences, culturally responsive-sustaining pedagogy can influence **all** students' biases and attitudes, and help give them the tools to analyze and critique systems and institutions.³

How is it successfully implemented?

- In contrast to a deficit-based approach, **identify students' assets** through practices like surveys, <u>questionnaires</u>, or brainstorming <u>funds of knowledge</u>.
- <u>Build supportive classroom environments</u> through relationship building efforts and communicating to students that cultural diversity is welcome.
- Transform pedagogy and curriculum via course content, methodology, and assessment.
- <u>Involve families and communities</u> as equal partners in students' learning, rooted in knowledge and appreciation for their social and cultural identities and contexts.
- **Provide educators with <u>professional learning opportunities</u>** in the areas of equity, bias, multiculturalism, and culturally-responsive sustaining pedagogy.
