



## TCWO Ball Machine Rental Waiver, Information, and Rules

### Important Steps

- Place the ball machine on the baseline center court.
- Main power switch is located at the bottom of the machine, under the control panel.
- Hold the power button down, located on the top left side of the control panel for 3 seconds to power on.
- The machine will automatically calibrate, the screen will inform you when it is ready to be programmed
- Use the 'Test' button to align the machine for proper ball placement on the court.
- To use the remote control, hold the remote button down for 3 seconds on the machine's control panel.
- To turn the machine off, hold the power button down on the main control panel for 3 seconds.

### Settings

- **Drills:** 12 different pre-programmed sequences that mimic opponent play.
- **Program:** Press to create customized drills.
- **Manual:** Machine will continuously throw a certain shot to a specific location.
- **Menu Buttons:** Used to scroll through the menu options to be selected and adjusted. A cursor on the LCD will highlight the current selection.
- **Settings:** Used to adjust a highlighted option on the LCD screen.
- **1-18 Numbered Buttons:** Used to select the desired position for the ball to land in program mode. (More detailed information can be found in the program section.)
- **Play/Pause:** Press to play and pause the machine.
- **Random:** Random throws using variations of speed, spin and trajectory.
- **2-Line:** Alternating forehand and backhand shots, with varying degrees of difficulty.
- **Sweep:** Throw balls randomly across the WIDTH (left-right) of the court.
- **Depth:** Throws balls randomly the LENGTH of court, from short to deep in one row.

### Rules

- Before turning the machine ON, ensure court is clear and no-one is standing in front of machine
- Do not look down or stand in front of shot selector while machine is in operation
- Turn machine OFF before reloading or, if you have trouble with machine
- ONLY place tennis balls in the machine's bucket to prevent serious damage
- Do not use 'wet' tennis balls since this may cause damage to machine
- The use of side netting is required when using the ball machine, to prevent balls from entering adjacent courts
