How shall we build a suistainable town considering economy, environment and our planet's resources? Thanks to the city move can we influence the design of our city.

The residential areas will be built both inside the city and a little bit outside because I think that young people want to live close to the city and bigger families want to live in a calmer area. Most apartments will have balconies for the "outdoor feeling" and the apartments in the city will be small and cheap. The goal is self-supporting residentals. I mean, you only throw metals in a blue bag and plastics in a red bag for example Conny Furvall who works at the heating plant in Kiruna means. Food waste can be turned into biogas.

The hospital here in Kiruna will be so much better. It's enough with one good hospital because Kiruna is a really small town. One police station is also enough in Kiruna. They can spend money on patrolling instead to increase the safety for the people in Kiruna. There will still be many small schools around the town because it gives security to above all the young children who are starting school. I started in a small school and I thought that it was the safest and calmest way.

Some of the older houses in current Kiruna are going to be moved and the old beautiful street lights in the city, too, because they are cozy. The church and the Maxus rocket are also going to be moved because the rocket is a symbol for Kiruna and our space research station.

All the vehicles in the future Kiruna are driverless and electric. A big car park in the town which take a fee will get the people to not choose the car and walk instead. It will be really easy to drive snowmobiles to the city because it's a huge interest in Kiruna.
