

## COLD SORE

Cold sores, or fever blisters, are a common viral infection. They are tiny, fluid-filled blisters on and around the lips. These blisters are often grouped together in patches. After the blisters break, a scab forms that can last several days. Cold sores usually heal in 2 to 3 weeks without leaving a scar.

What is the cause of a cold sore?

Cold sores are small blisters around the mouth, caused by the herpes simplex virus. They are sometimes called fever blisters. The most common strain of the virus causing cold sores is herpes simplex virus 1. It can be spread by kissing or sharing eating utensils or even sharing towels.

What is the best thing for a cold sore?



There are antiviral drugs that can help cold sores heal faster, including acyclovir, valacyclovir, famciclovir and penciclovir. If you're having frequent outbreaks or experiencing some of the serious side effects of having a cold sore, your doctor may consider prescribing antiviral medication.

How can I speed up the healing of a cold sore?

Cold sores usually disappear on their own in 5–15 days. Antiviral medication may speed up the healing process by about 1 day. Healthcare professionals, including dermatologists, can prescribe oral or topical antiviral medications.

What cream is good for cold sores?

Acyclovir cream is usually applied 5 times a day for 4 days. Acyclovir cream may be applied at any time during a cold sore outbreak, but it works best when it is applied at the very beginning of a cold sore outbreak, when there is tingling, redness, itching, or a bump but the cold sore has not yet formed.

Is vaseline good for cold sores?

A petroleum jelly such as Vaseline won't necessarily heal a cold sore, but it may ease discomfort. The jelly helps prevent cracking. It also serves as a protective barrier against outside irritants. Witch hazel is a natural astringent that may help dry out and heal cold sores, but it can sting with application.

Can cold sore heal in 2 days?

They are tiny, fluid-filled blisters on and around the lips. These blisters are often grouped together in patches. After the blisters break, a scab forms that can last several days. Cold sores usually heal in 2 to 3 weeks without leaving a scar.

What foods trigger cold sores?

Some foods to avoid are: citrus fruits, tomatoes, fruit juices, wine, soda, pickles, and vinegar-based salad dressings. Hot and spicy foods can also have a tendency to break cold sores. We recommend eating warm foods, and reducing salt and spice consumption

If your cold sore is especially painful or irritating, your doctor may prescribe an anesthetic gel to alleviate pain or an antiviral oral medication to speed healing or prevent recurrence. The antiviral medicines available for treatment include acyclovir (Zovirax), famciclovir (Famvir), and valacyclovir

Does salt water help cold sores?

Salt water affects the environment around the virus so it can't thrive, which might help dry up the cold sore, but it can also be painful on your skin. Petroleum Jelly may help to soften the skin and provide a protective layer against infection, but it will not shorten the healing time of the cold sore
