The government made an announcement regarding the "Making it Count" maths directive for schools at its party conference last weekend. This has been a bit of a blind-side for schools as only a month ago ,we were told that implementing the new maths curriculum was deferred until 2026.



The new initiatives are designed to improve achievement in maths across the country. They are based on some very concerning data on the achievement of Year 8 students at the end of 2023 which showed that only 22% of students were achieving at the appropriate level.

This data was only gathered from 853 students across the whole country and they were assessed against a new draft curriculum which has not been implemented in schools yet so things are not as dire as they have been painted.

I would like to reassure our parents that our school's mid year assessment shows that 88% of our Year 8 students are achieving at or above the expected level. This assessment data was gathered on-line with the Asttle tool that schools are going to be directed to use by the Ministry.


We are awaiting the release of the new draft Maths curriculum document on Monday next week and will be working hard to ensure that we are ready to implement this at the beginning of next year. It appears that we will also be issued with student workbooks. While these will provide an additional tool for our maths programme, they are certainly not going to be a quick fix and a replacement for sound teaching. We will be continuing with the work we are doing with Rob Profitt White as we are seeing that this is having a positive impact on student engagement and the ability to think mathematically and problem solve.














Rugby League
