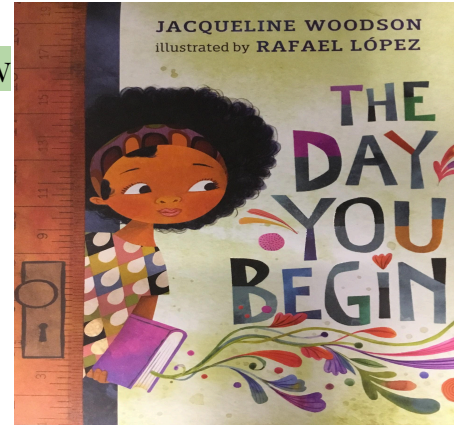


# The Day You Begin - Alg Project Wall
