INTRODUCTION (Times New Roman, 12pt, center, bold)

The introduction must convey sequentially the background of the research review and scientific studies that support the background of the research review. In addition, in the introduction it is necessary to explain explicitly the scope of this review article.

Example of writing a citation

- 1. One author: author's name and year of publication. Examples: Smith (2005) or (Smith, 2005);
- 2. Two authors: both author's name and year of publication. Examples: Smith and Jones (2005) or (Smith & Jones, 2005);
- 3. Three or more authors: the name of the primary author followed by 'et al.' and the year of publication. Example: Smith et al. (2005) or (Smith et al., 2005).
