- November is [#NativeAmericanHeritageMonth](#) and we're grateful for the Leni-Lenape, the original people and first stewards of the [#DelRiverWatershed](#). The Lenape are indigenous to the places we now call New Jersey, Delaware, southern New York, and eastern Pennsylvania.
- The Leni-Lenape resided along [#DelRiverWatershed](#) rivers and creeks to access water and food, such as shad and sturgeon, and utilized natural resources to build their homes. - The Leni-Lenape strove to “walk so gently on the earth” without leaving a big impact on the environment, and were the first stewards of the land in the [#DelRiverWatershed](#). The Lenape called the Delaware River Poutaxat, Mochijirickhickon and Lenapewihittuck. [#NativeAmericanHeritageMonth](#)
