

Plan of Action for Citizen-Led Monitoring of Local Elections:

Planning is an endeavor that demands our utmost seriousness. It calls for meticulous attention to detail. The steps that follow provide an all-inclusive, detailed process for a plan of action, designed to facilitate citizen-led monitoring of local elections. Please note that not all of these steps may be applicable to you or your community. Feel free to make a copy, cut and paste, and adjust the list to suit your specific needs. These are merely recommendations. My intention was to provide as much detail as possible, allowing for the list to be tailored or adjusted to meet your unique requirements.

Objective: The objective of this plan is to independently monitor local elections, alleviate concerns related to election integrity, and foster transparency in the electoral process.

Step 1: Form an Independent Monitoring Committee
