Club Engagement Activities

WiCS is dedicated to advancing our four pillars: Connection, Opportunity, Inspiration, and Safety, in many different ways. One way that we promote connection is through our outreach efforts. Collaborating with other student groups at LSU is vital in strengthening educational initiatives and gender inclusivity within our community, fostering networks for growth. Ultimately, our outreach initiatives create a welcoming and supportive environment for students of all backgrounds pursuing computer science studies throughout their college journey.

Some of our outreach activities include forming partnerships with other STEM clubs on campus. To do this, we invite these other clubs to collaborate with WiCS on events where we share the planning, workload, and responsibilities of those events.

Our primary collaborative events of the year are our semesterly WiCS Back to School Mixers. During these events, WiCS fosters a sense of unity and shared purpose by inviting other LSU clubs such as Bengal Bots (LSU's Robotics Club), Security Society LSU (SSL), Game Development Club (GDC), Google Developer Student Club (GDSC), and Society of Asian Scientists and Engineers (SASE) to collectively showcase the objectives and missions of our clubs. We successfully bring together hundreds of students each year. Other past collaborative events we have hosted include Geaux Hack the Globe 2024 in partnership with SASE, SSL, ColorStack, and the Association of Computing Machinery (ACM), and Geaux Hack the Globe 2025 in partnership with SSL, which became the largest LSU-run hackathon ever, with over 180 participants and guest judges from our partners. Moreover, we hosted our second Professional Development Night 2024, where we partnered with SSL for both the fall and spring semesters.

For Halloween 2024, WiCS hosted a cozy and fun-filled Board Game & Costume Social. Members gathered to play their favorite board games, enjoy treats, and participate in a friendly costume contest. The event created a relaxed atmosphere where students could unwind, connect with peers, and build community in a lighthearted setting. For Halloween 2023, WiCS presented a thrilling 'Murder Mystery' scenario centered around solving the mystery of who (fictitiously) killed a popular media mogul. This event was designed to provide our members with an enjoyable experience that allows them to apply their problem-solving skills and indulge in a sense of camaraderie.

We also actively promote our club through various outreach activities at LSU. We engage in tabling presentations such as **Engineering Tiger Connections** (ETC), LSU's **Fall Festival**, and LSU's **Involvement Festival**. During Engineering Tiger Connections, an event specifically designed to introduce LSU freshmen to the College of Engineering student organizations, we present an informative tri-fold board showcasing our pillars and highlighting our major events. Similarly, at the Fall Festival and the Involvement Festival, we man a table and tent to provide more LSU students with insights into our activities and mission. These efforts aim to raise awareness and foster connections within the LSU community.

In addition to participating in outreach activities hosted by LSU, we also provide our current and potential members with many opportunities to connect with their peers in academic and social settings. Among these activities are events like computer skills workshops, programming boot camps, academic seminars, finals study and break time days, and more. In the fall semester, we host a **C programming workshop series** led by Dr. Golden Richard, a renowned cybersecurity expert and C aficionado, for students to gain an invaluable skill that they may not learn in their classes. In the spring, this event is a **Git and CLI workshop series**, which enables students to learn granular computer science skills in a quick and fun event. We also invite notable speakers to campus, so they can share their experience and advice with us. During final exam week, we host a **Dedicated Study Space**, which also includes a study break time with relaxation and meditation tools, brainteasers, calming fidget devices, and LSU's resident therapy dogs.

Community and Friendship

In conjunction with these academically-focused events, we also have a wide range of smaller social events throughout the school year. We host and attend a variety of gatherings and activities aimed at ensuring that there's something for everyone to enjoy and participate in.

To add to the excitement of our Hackathon event, we have introduced our Hackathon Raffle to engage students and attendees during our Geaux Hack the Globe event. This gives the chance to our attendees to support our mission while entering to win exciting prizes. The raffle draws enthusiastic participation, sparks friendly chatter across teams, and culminates in a thrilling prize drawing that brings everyone together. Within this event, participants are able to buy raffle tickets within the duration of the weekend the hackathon is hosted, where the winners are announced at the closing ceremony! This is an event that offers participants a chance to relax, laugh, and bond over something lighthearted when taking a break from the fast-paced excitement of coding and project building!

To celebrate friendship and self-love, we hosted a **Galentine's Day** event that brought warmth and joy to our community, which consisted of a bouquet-building station where snacks and drinks were provided. It was a great way for us to interact with our community and

members by allowing them to choose their combination from a plethora of flowers, which then led to more conversation as the board wrapped the bouquet! Afterwards, our members got to sit down, chat, and enjoy their food for the remainder of the event! During this time, we were able to set up our new fundraising initiative, Galentine Grams. Through this fundraiser, we were able to fulfill 100+ orders from students, where the recipients ranged from instructors, friends, classmates, and even fellow WiCS members!

At the end of each academic semester, WiCS hosts an End of the Semester Banquet as well as an End of the Year Banquet in order to celebrate all of our members' achievements and give thanks to those who have helped make the organization run throughout the years. Through this event, we can give our senior students their graduation regalia, which we offer as stoles and cords based on how long they have been with WiCS throughout their time at LSU. This is an amazing event where we not only get to celebrate our senior graduates, but also all of our students who have made it one semester closer to their goal!

Every fall semester, before the LSU Engineering Networking Reception Night and Career Expo, WiCS hosts an event to aid computer science students in developing their professional skills. During Professional Development Night, students visit stations designed to hone crucial professional skills, including resume creation and revision, interview preparation and practice, LinkedIn profile perfecting, elevator pitch presentation, and more.

Sponsors are invited to send recruiters or interviewers for the mock interview station, where they provide insight into what a real behavioral interview might look like for students who are ready to enter the workforce. Sponsors also have access to the Professional Development Night resume repository, where the new and newly revised resumes from the resume station can be found, organized by students' classifications and sought-after opportunities. All sponsors are also invited to stay for refreshments following the conclusion of the stations, where WiCS officers, volunteers, and sponsor representatives show examples of professional dress levels on a red carpet runway!

Wise Words with WiCS is a student-led podcast that highlights voices and touches base in technology, education, and diversity in computing. Episodes feature interviews with students, alumni, industry professionals, and faculty, offering real conversations about career journeys, tech trends, and community impact.

WiCS Annual Geaux Hack the Globe HackathonSpring 2026

Geaux Hack the Globe is an annual event hosted by WiCS, where students are invited to spend a weekend creating a finished product to compete in several categories for prizes and accolades. Geaux Hack the Globe provides students the opportunity to apply their classroom learnings to real-world situations and scenarios. Students form teams on a Friday when they learn the community-centered prompt, and the rest of the day Friday and all day Saturday are spent creating a project that fulfills that prompt.

Sponsors of this event are invited to mentor teams. They can assist teams as they code if they have questions or problems or if they need advice, as well as act as judges on Sunday to decide which teams win in each category. Sponsors may also choose to support Geaux Hack the Globe side quests, where we develop challenges like scavenger hunts, bingo, and more. Side quests help students avoid burnout from coding for an entire weekend, and also bring more fun and prizes to the table.
