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Course Description & Vision

Welcome to DSST: Cole Music! In this class you will learn and develop the character, skills, and habits necessary to help you be a successful musician in high school, college, and in the professional world.

Music Goal:

Great Musicians approach a piece of music with a firm understanding of what story they wish the music to tell and how different musical choices impact that story. Great Musicians record and perform with the explicit intention of telling stories that are authentic and meaningful. Great Musicians leverage their detailed understanding of music theory and vocabulary to collaborate with other artists in and outside the classroom. In this class we will become Great Musicians!

Intro to Music Objectives

Professionalism:

- Musicians will work toward being college ready—intellectually, and with a professional level of rehearsal etiquette, and independent practice habits.
- Musicians will exhibit their confidence, leadership, and academic maturity as future college students by participating and leading in parts of Music Class and at Performances.
- Musicians will demonstrate respect for themselves, their peers, and their teacher by participating in all course activities.

Theory:

- Basic Rhythm I.D. AND Execution { Can play accurately on at least 1 instrument
 - Whole, Half, Quarter, Eighth, and Sixteenth note/rest
- Basic Note I.D. AND Execution (Can play accurately on at least 1 instrument)
 - E-middle C on Bass Clef and middle C to A on Treble Clef
- Interpreting Written Music { reading sheet music or lead-sheets
- Scale theory { major/minor
- Key Signatures
- Basic Triads and building chords { major/minor
- Meter and Syncopation

Technique:

ALL Musicians:

- volume control
- playing and listening
- pocket and feel

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- <u>Vocals</u>: intonation, breath support, projecting, singing in unison with others, story telling
- Guitar/Bass picking/plucking techniques, roots, thirds, fifths
- <u>Keys</u>: major vs minor, shifting octaves
- Percussion: rhumba claves, basic fills, sitting "inside" a beat
- Drum Kit: variation in subdividing, playing in 3,
- Strings:, intonation, tone and sustain, roots/thirds/fifths, arco vs pizzicato,

Performance Assessments	- Student approaches rehearsals and performances with respect for the equipment and their fellow performers -Student brings professionalism to rehearsals and performances by playing rehearsed material ONLY when instructed to do so - Student acknowledges the audience experience by actively working to engage listeners through positive body language, eye contact, and emoting through music Student is familiar with all technical and logistic aspects of a performance (including promoting and ticket-sales) and contributes to the set up and tear down of any performance completely until the task is finished.	50%

Late Policy, Absent Policy, & Retake Policy

We understand that there will be reasons why a student misses class. Students will be expected to make up the mastery check, homework, and any assignments teachers think are necessary to complete. Students will be supported in developing excellent independent practice habits while in DSST: Cole's Music program.

Guardians are asked to support their student in practicing AT HOME for at least 20 minutes a day.

- Students who were <u>absent for a test, quiz, or mastery check</u>, will have until the end of the next week from the absent date to complete the missing assignment.
- Students who receive a 50% on any assignment will have until the end of the next week to retake/resubmit the assignment for a max score of 70%.
- ALL students are expected to show the Core Value of Responsibility by asking their teachers what they
 need to make up if they missed class(es). ALL students are expected to show the Core Value of
 Responsibility by communicating any anticipated absences at least 2 weeks prior to their music
 teacher.

Being prepared to perform is a key component of being able to participate in final concerts. Students must achieve at least 70% rehearsal attendance throughout the semester to be eligible for performances.

Attendance and full participation at final concerts is mandatory for all music students at DSST: Cole! This includes being present for set-up and tear-down.
