<u>Library of Congress (LOC)</u> -- Provides Congress with objective research to inform the legislative process, administers the national copyright system, and manages the largest collection of books, recordings, photographs, maps and manuscripts in the world

## Business, Economics, & Labor

Bureau of the Census -- Provides data about the nation's people and economy

<u>Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA)</u> -- Produces economic accounts statistics that enable government and business decision—makers, researchers, and the American public to follow and understand the performance of the Nation's economy

<u>Economics and Statistics Administration</u> -- Provides economic analysis, distributes national economic indicators, and oversees the Census Bureau.

<u>Bureau of Labor Statistics</u> -- Measures labor market activity, working conditions, and price changes in the economy

<u>U.S. Trade and Development Agency</u> -- Links U.S. businesses to export opportunities by funding project planning activities, pilot projects, and reverse trade missions

<u>Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)</u> -- Enforces laws that make discrimination illegal in the workplace. Oversees all types of work situations including hiring, firing, promotions, harassment, training, wages, and benefits.

<u>U.S. House of Representatives</u> -- The House has 435 members, the number representing each state is determined by population.

<u>U.S. Senate</u> -- The Senate has 100 members, 2 from each state, who are elected to serve for a term of 6 years.

<u>Bureau of Justice Statistics</u> -- Publishes information on crime, criminal offenders, victims of crime, and the operation of justice systems

<u>Department of Defense</u> -- Provides the military forces needed to deter war, and to protect the security of the United States

<u>U.S. Gov. Agencies</u> – Provides government agencies contacts for elected officials, background about government structure as well as state, tribal and local government
