<u>Harry M. Vale Memorial Scholarship</u>



Mr. Harry M. Vale taught Vocational Agriculture at Durand High School from 1955 to 1970. Through those years his students had numerous wins in crop and animal judging and also a state championship in Public Speaking. In 1962, the Farm Bureau recognized the Durand FFA Chapter as having the best cooperative in the State of Illinois. This is only a small slice of the influence he had on the students in his agriculture programs along with others in the agriculture community. A special greeting from Harry to his former students was "Back to the mines, boys!"

After Harry passed in January of 2020, the Durand FFA Alumni & Supporters decided to start the Harry M. Vale Memorial Scholarship. When reaching out to the Vale Family for permission, they also decided to participate in the scholarship. We were blessed to have the Vale Family donate part of Harry's memorial donations to fund this scholarship for many years to come.

Purpose:

Provide a one-time \$500 scholarship to be used for education expenses such as tuition, room and board, books, etc. Applicants will need to provide proof of acceptance letter from school and a copy of 1st semester registered courses by September 15th.

Criteria:

A graduating Durand High School senior with a minimum of 2.50% GPA. Must be a good-standing member of the Durand FFA (see page 2) pursuing a degree in the agricultural industry at a trade school, community college, or 4-year university. A minimum of 3 years of active FFA membership is required to apply for this scholarship.

Deadline:

Applications must be returned to Mrs. Backeberg by March 21, 2025.
