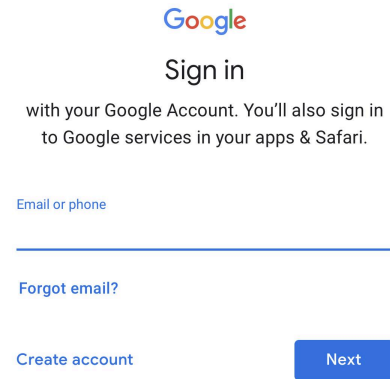


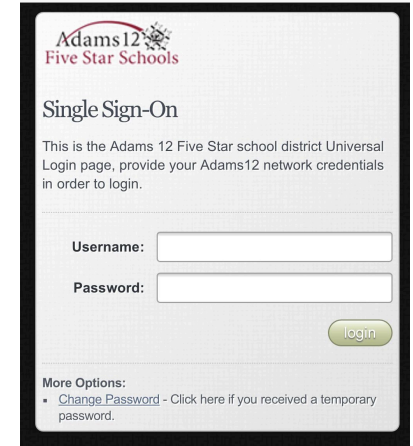
Uploading and Taking Photos in Google Drive on a Phone/Tablet

1. Download the **free** Google Drive app to your device. ([Apple](#) or [Android](#)) These screenshots are from an iPhone.

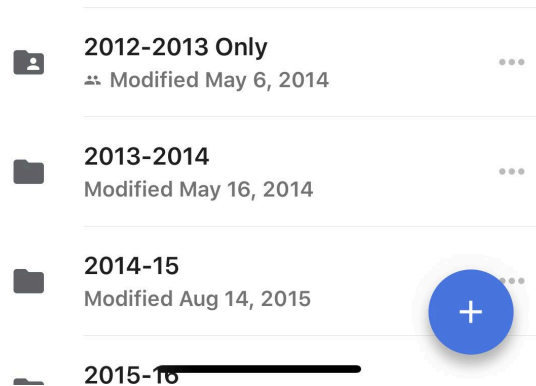
2. Sign into Google Drive with your **full Adams 12** e-mail address.



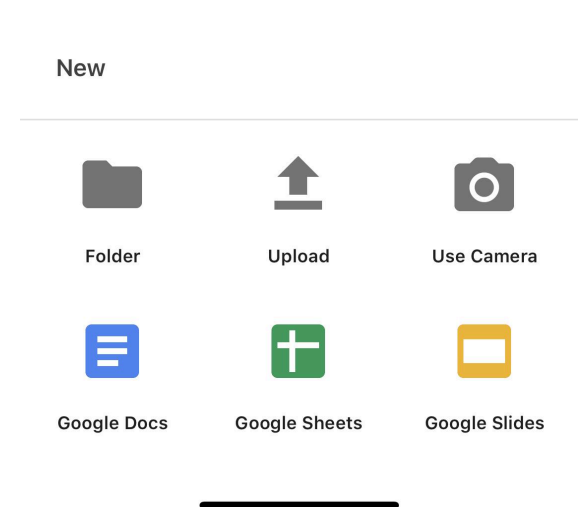
3. You'll then sign in like you normally would.



4. Once you see your drive, click the plus sign in the bottom right corner.

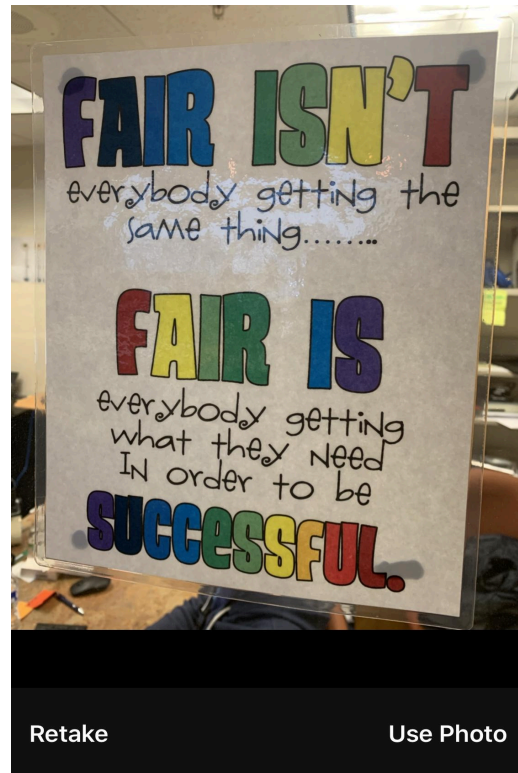


5. Then, tap "Use Camera" to take your photos or video.

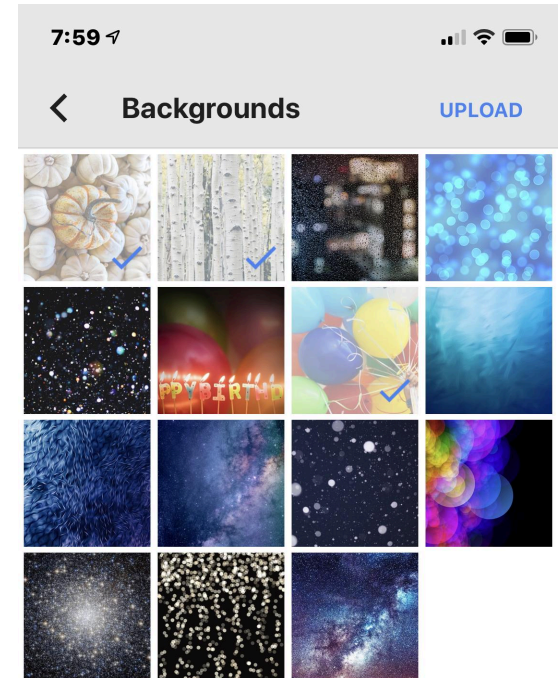


6. If you like a photo, just click "Use Photo" in the bottom right corner.

Bonus: Anything you save will be in your drive automatically.



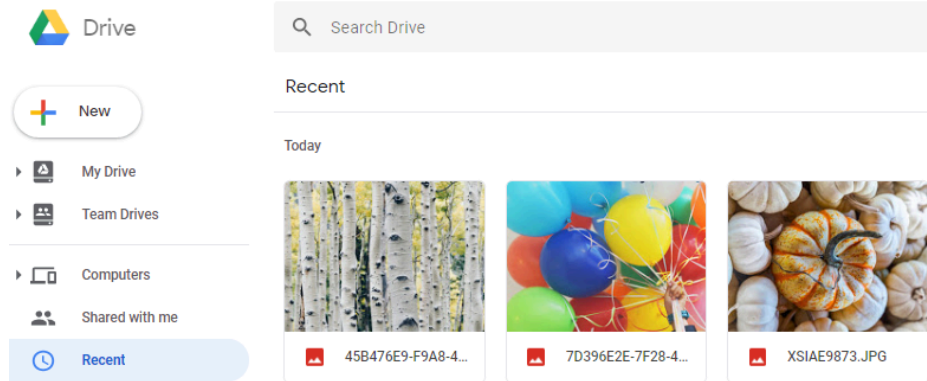
7. You can also upload photos and files already on your device. Follow same steps as taking photos, but choose upload instead. Tap the photos you want upload.

8. Here is the photo I just uploaded, and the photo I took earlier and uploaded directly to my Google Drive is also there.

I can then use the photo however I'd like. I can download it to my computer if needed, too.



*If students (or you) have a phone or tablet with a camera, this would be another way students could take photos or videos for projects.

*It saves right to their Google Drive, and then students can download the video or photo (or any file) to their H Drive.

*Then, that photo or video can be uploaded to any presentation tool (WeVideo, Prezi, Animoto, Movie Maker, PhotoStory, etc.).

*This even works on Chromebooks! Nice since Google Drive is the **only** Drive...you may just need to allow access to your Drive. (See the example from Haiku Deck.)
