The Future with *Be Going To + Verb*

"**Be going to + verb**" is used to discuss:

- **Future Plans:** Things we already decided to do.

"I bought some fish. *I'm going to make* fish for dinner."



- **Predictions Based on Evidence:** When there are signs that something will happen.

"Look at those clouds. *It's going to rain.*"



Form of "Be Going To + Verb"

Subject	Be	Going To	Base Form of Verb
I	am	going to	cook dinner.
You	are	going to	work hard.
He/She/It	is	going to	start soon.
We	are	going to	travel.
They	are	going to	join us.
