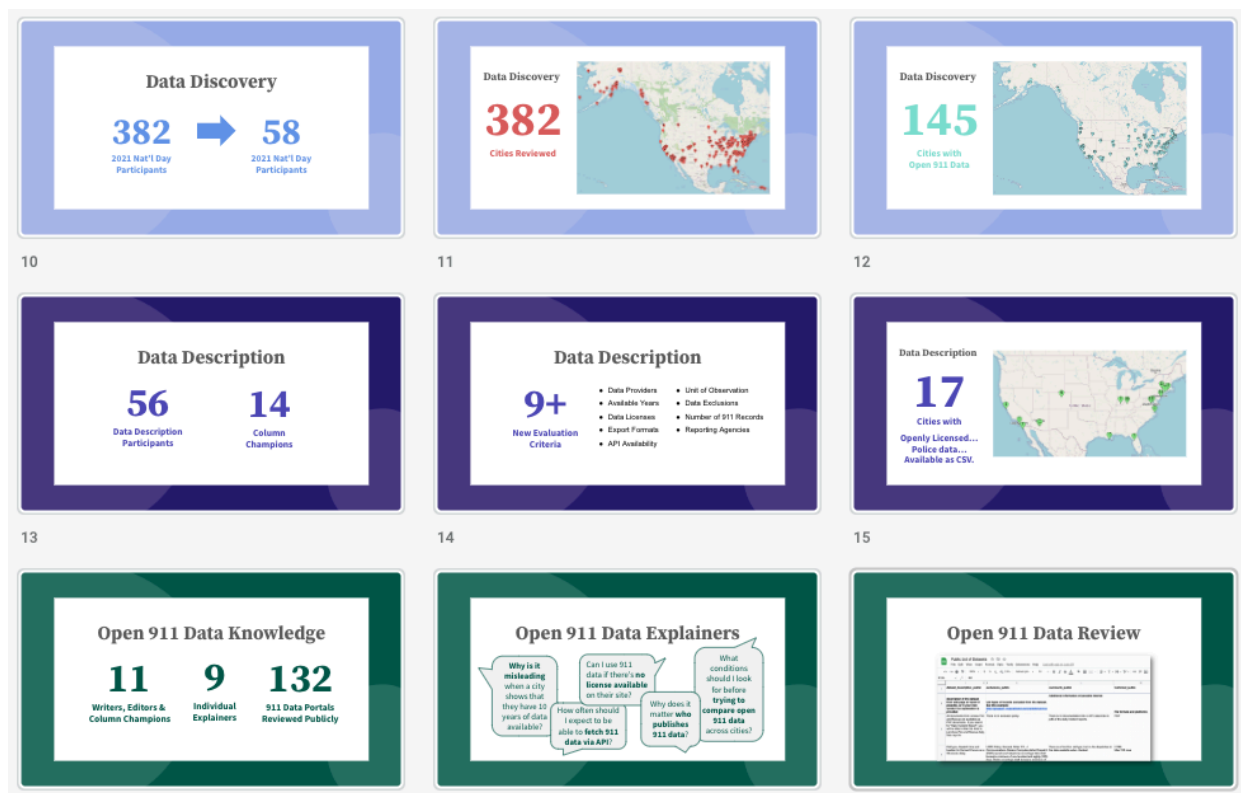

Q&A Time:

- Gio: Will the data dictionary effort continue?**
 - Micah: Yes it will, but it will probably continue in a scoped-down fashion as part of the impact sprint. It will be easier to begin that work when we've narrowed down our datasets to 10 rather than 132.
- Gio: What about reaching out to the 911 agencies? I think it would be important to get their input and provide a lot of clarity.**
 - Micah: Yes this is something that I'm continuing to look for opportunities to do. And my answer is similar to the data dictionary question - it will be easier to do this (and to do it well, since external relationships deserve a certain degree of care) when we narrow down to ~10 datasets and have a clearer understanding of them.
 - I plan for this to happen - to the degree possible - as part of the impact sprint. And I hope that it is something that can be done in collaboration with brigades acting as both R911 members, and constituents of the 911/city administrators.
- Michael Cowden: About potential partnerships for R911..**

- Michael Cowden , Evonne Silva , Meredith Horowski volunteered to co-chair the workgroups
- The blueprint effort has been very hot & heavy, but now that the blueprint has been released (about 7 days ago) there is an opportunity to reflect and consider the ~80 recommendations in that blueprint, and how to proceed
- So we're now at a starting point in some ways - now we have a larger professional 911 network, and some new mandates that we can choose to engage
- Of the potential partners - administrators, researchers, etc - we need to consider who we want to work with and how
- Now is the time to explore the partnership question, as we go into the Impact Sprint
- **Gio: The open data is a subset of actual data held by agencies - could we use that (presumably less messy data) instead of the open data?**
 - Michael: Unfortunately the data is messy at the source too. And a lot of the data
 - We see some similarities, for example, data coming from similar platforms
 - The problem of hyper-fragmentation may not represent all 6k psaps, but it is likely to be different for roughly the number of different vendors out there: likely hundreds or thousands of vendors
 - Vendors also complicate accessing that data - in many cases 911 administrators may not be the only party involved in accessing that information
 - Similarly, Jerry was looking at the fact that true multi-jurisdictional visibility requires going beyond the 911 data
- **Margaret: The impact & equity aspect of the explainers are important to me - I would want to put that in an explainer of mine and know that that is ok.**
 - Yes, attention to equitable impact is a critical area for our programming.
 - I know that Myranda has raised similar questions too, and I appreciate that.

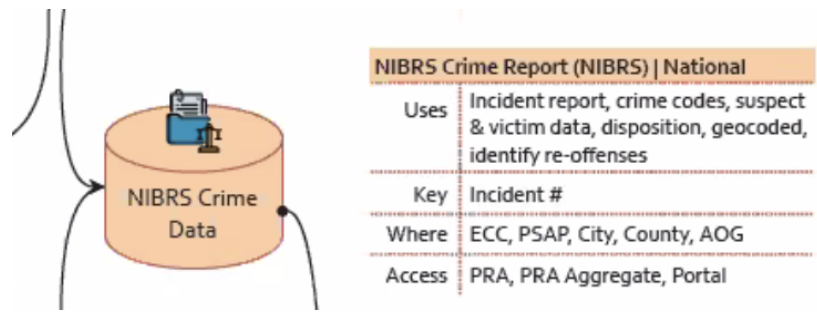

 - This enables someone to understand how an interested party would connect any dataset to other datasets – which will likely be required if someone has a specific question they want to answer regarding 911 data.
 - Court data, jail data, attorney data, crime data, behavioral health data, NIBRS data, geo coded data, etc
 - Jerry identified at least 10 databases that are related to emergency services
 - Each dataset includes:
 - Uses: A description of its uses
 - Key: an indicator of how this data is linked to other datasets
 - Where: the owner of the dataset
 - Access: who has access to the dataset

Reviewing various projects and deliverables:

- A. **Data Dictionary:** Slack @r911-data-dictionary. Mary reported a lot of ambiguity and questions.

Q. Margaret: What is plan for using Data Dictionary items.

A. Micah: DD is a pre-req to standardize datasets and to determine and define nomenclature.

Mary - discussed range of variances between naming.

Jennifer - advocates for DD re: we can't draw conclusions from data without understanding individual cols. DD could be valuable to local users.

Jerry - could be good to develop national goal posts re: to start migrating to a more common standard

Margaret - Vera only used 5 datasets to develop a recent report on datasets.

- B. **Q. Margaret - Sees value of naming consistency but, for instance, what are we seeking to analyze?**

Micah: the 'ol eating-the-elephant answer - would be nearly impossible for a single org to resolve this (naming standard) issue. But, we could get there through taking small steps.

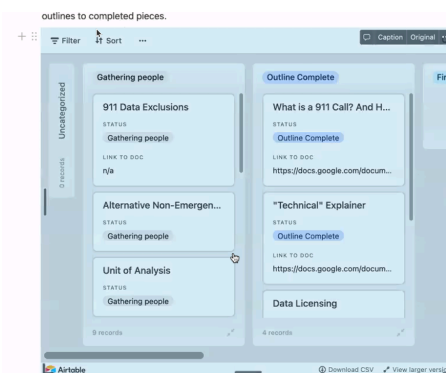
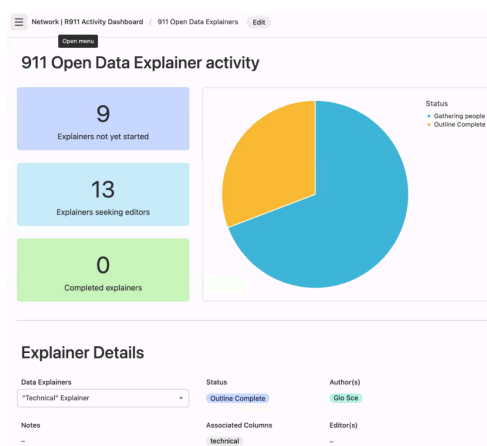
Future might include partnering with other orgs who would contribute their perspectives and work.

- C. **Q. Margaret: Is CfA doing in partnership with T911 or independently?**

Micah: CfA is currently in an independent space but, looking forwards to partnering.

- D. **Open 911 Data Explainers.** Micah developed a [Process Guide](#) re: endpoints of explainers. See [Notion](#) for this work. Includes descriptions of key ideas and findings in readable form. Guide goes into more detail on target audiences (internal/external). Authors doing champion work would love input on document.

The dashboard illustrates the number of explainers and editors currently working on the project. 9 records started, 4 not yet. Encouraging a peer review of explainers.

- F. Q: Jerry - are we posing challenges relating to the topic explainers cover?
A: Micah - we are introducing challenges and some facets of them in a narrative format
- G. Margaret - she and Mary are talking with all authors. Gio for instance did a lot of unpacking in his current explainer.
- H. Micah - looking to where to best publish this work to best serve community. We need to keep explainers and current datasets we've discovered separated so explainers are more comprehensive.
- I. Jennifer Note: *Brief detail / clarification: If we have 130-140 datasets, that's not the same number of cities. Might be more like 80 cities.*
- J. Jennifer: Thanks Margaret for being so thorough in deploying the column champion approach and likes Margaret's approach and one we should emulate.
- K. **Micah: We need an Editor or Editorial Team**, someone who has an editorial role to interface with DE team and getting feedback, have reviews, fact-check etc. Myranda has volunteered to act as the Editor.
- L. Jerry: do we have a consistent framework for Explainer template? Championing consistent format and style.
- M. **Open 911 Data Review** - Productive meeting today. Aleks recapped they're making a publishable directory of the current 145 datasets. Adding a couple columns e.g. 'why city was picked (based on spreadsheet in Data Discovery folder)?', another on changing API column to 'API Availability' column. These smallish to-dos for Data Review would be great activities for a volunteer new to the project.
- N. **Peripheral Datasets** - Jerry has a tentative list of external datasets that would be complimentary to our R911 work. He and Micah will review it each week to keep moving forward.
- O. **R911 Strategy**: not a lot to report this week. They discussed four major focus points:
Equitable Outcomes - in multijurisdictional systems. **Rightsizing** - ideal staff and resources.
T911 partnership - how will R911-T911 collaborate in future or, **Other Partnership** - potential future partnership with other entities is a consideration.

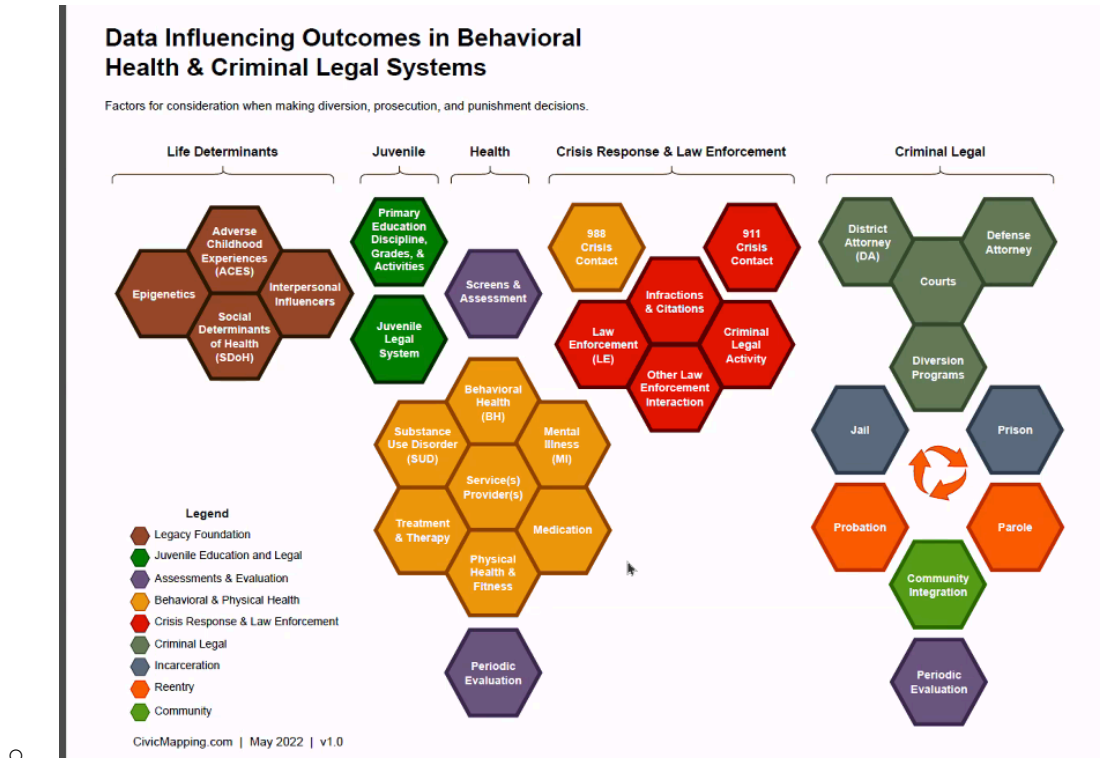

Reimagine911 activity updates

- **Alt-911 Dataset summary - Jerry Hall**
 - Jerry's business (Civic Mapping) has put him in contact & researching a lot of different datasets that are somewhat proximal to 911.



- Lived Determinants are datasets related to broad health & welfare factors.

- **Data dictionary activity**

- Note that it is important to be careful about how we use & store data, and it is important to remember the ethical burden we have as we use and aggregated this data
- Data Dictionary - this is the next activity in the Discovery » Description » Dictionary series
 - This is the step where we go from having a list of datasets with general understanding... to taking those 139 datasets and getting specific info about what is actually provided
 - What does each row in this dataset actually represent?
- Since last week(ish), we've been working on the activity guide
- Tonight we're going to take a shot at actually creating our first data dictionary
 - Doing this as a group to see what hurdles we run into
 - Doing this as a ??? session right after this meeting
- Would love more participants because we have a lot of datasets to work with

Comments

- Gio Sce created a script to automate the R911 dataset column naming scheme and is testing it's usefulness. If you are interested contact him via Slack @Gio.
 - Gio looked at ~63 datasets that could be fetched as csv data. Did not work with data that was available by PDF or HTML.
 - Jennifer: I think some of the work Gio did could be helpful. Peter, are you prioritizing certain cities to start with?
 - Peter: We don't have a priority yet. We considered 3-4 different ways to prioritize cities.
 - Gio: see this sheet for an example of initial output on the 63 datasets reviewed to date.:

- Jerry, by mid-2024, healthcare data in CA will be newly accessible to different stakeholders at various levels of security (e.g. identifiable data to criminal-legal system, and only aggregate data to the public)- The Data Exchange Framework is being developed now and about to be released: Over the next year the Governor is forming committees to flesh out the details of how the program will actually be deployed.

- **Open 911 Data Review**

- This activity is geared towards taking the  R911 Directory of Datasets and publishing the data from that spreadsheet as its own dataset. This will be made available to the public so that other groups don't need to do the work we've done so far
 - NOTE - this will not include the open 911 data from agencies
 - We'll be including information needed to understand things such as...
 - How many cities provide 911 data (vs fire vs ems)
- We will be reaching out to all Champions to ask if & how they would like to be credited for their work

- **Call Type Categorization**

- Micah gave an overview of how the group's goal is to create a set of call-type categories following the APCO standards.
- The first step is creating a model for how one approaches this non-trivial task. Laurel has experience developing categories and large heterogeneous sets of data.
- Plan is for a few folks to test the call types insofar as how they are grouped.
- This past week Micah developed a small group of people doing an associative analysis. Going forward they'll be looking for similar datasets to determine scalability.
- Should be able to progress to including other folks and datasets in a couple-few weeks.

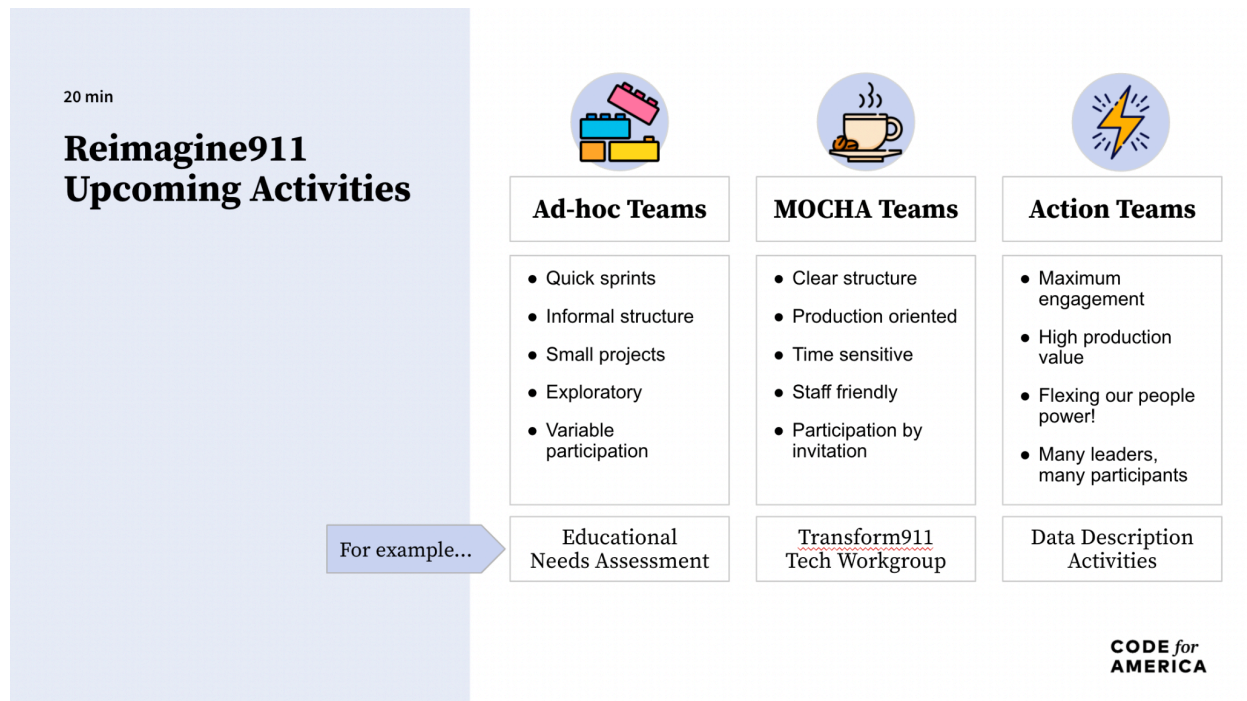

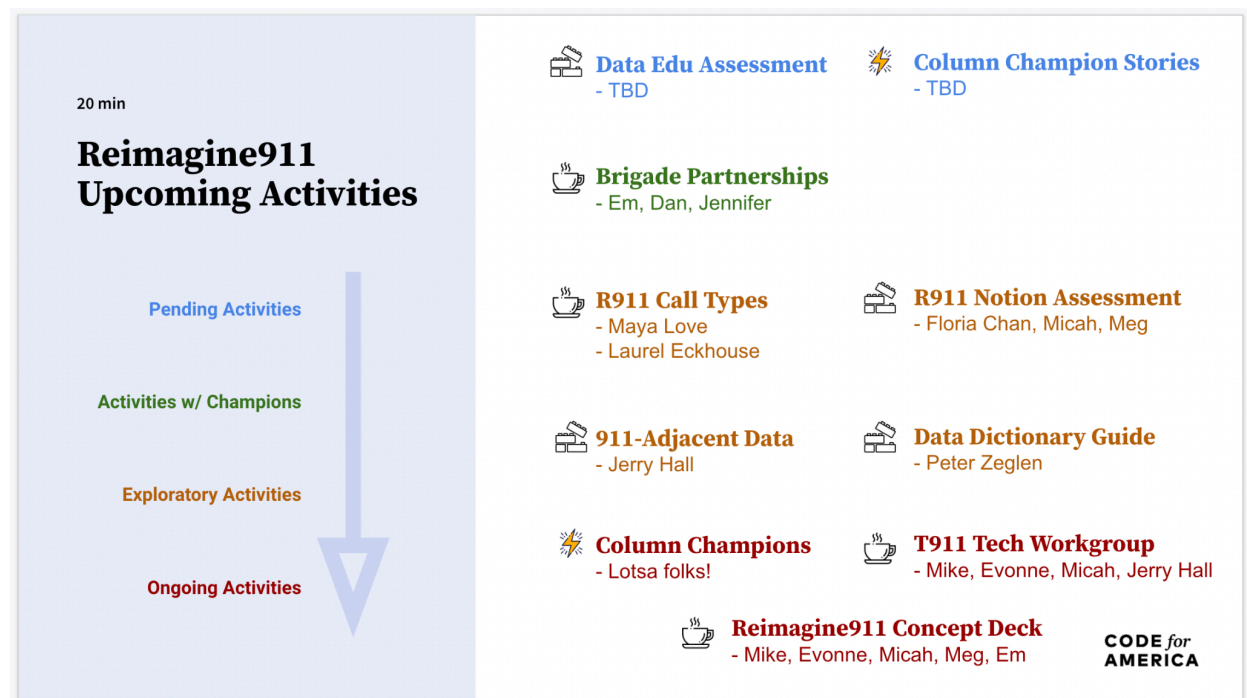
