

Secret Rupees

This most likely refers to the many invisible rupees hidden throughout Ocarina of Time; far too many to list honestly but the best example of this is the three hidden in front of the crawlspace before the boulder maze at the beginning of the game.

Mario Cameo

This could refer to many things such as Malon having a bowser brooch or the portraits of Bowser, Peach, Luigi, Yoshi and Mario in Ocarina of Time. Or it could be referring to the Mario mask on the happy mask salesman backpack in Majora's Mask, or most likely it is referring to all of these references.

Mario 64 Shared Concepts/Ideas

Super Mario 64 and Ocarina of Time were worked on at the same time and shared a similar engine therefore some of their assets were shared and this is most likely the reason there are a lot of Mario cameos in Ocarina of Time and Majora's Mask. In fact, originally Ocarina of Time was supposed to play like Mario 64 where you would enter dungeons from Ganon's Castle. This idea wasn't completely lost as it is believed that it was the basis for the phantom Ganon fight.

Deku Tree Sprout

The Deku Tree Sprout is a character in Ocarina of Time that appears after finishing the Forest Temple in the adult Link section. Before finishing the Forest Temple the Deku Tree Sprout appears as a small shoot in the ground.

A couple of theories have formed around this little fella. The first being that this Deku Tree is the Deku Tree that appears in Wind Waker. Evidence to support this theory is as follows: Wind Waker's Deku Tree speaks Hylian, which is a language spoken in Ocarina of Time and he recognizes the green tunic Link wears as if he has met Link before.

The second theory is that the Great Deku Tree is the Deku Tree Sprout but reincarnated. This is believed because the Deku Tree Sprout inherited all of the Great Deku Tree's memories and knowledge.

N64 DD Lost Concepts/URA

Ura Zelda was a never released N64 Disc Drive expansion for Ocarina of Time. Ura Zelda promised new and more difficult dungeons as well as new enemies. There was also talk of another Zelda expansion titled Zelda Gaiden. Which promised a new overworld and entirely new dungeon but this would later evolve into what we today know as Majora's Mask.

The Boy in the Graveyard

In Ocarina of Time there is a boy who wanders the Graveyard in Kakariko Village and is fascinated with scary things. The boy carries a stick because he is trying to mimic his hero, Dampe, who carries a shovel. Unfortunately, the boy is never able to go on Dampe's late night tour due to his curfew. In the adult Link timeline, Dampe has passed away and The boy's house has been replaced by the bazaar but more importantly, the boy is unable to be found.

There are two theories this iceberg chart could be referring to. One being that the boy's father is the Hyrulean soldier that guards the entrance to Death Mountain in Kakariko. The boy tells Link that he asked his dad for a Keaton mask if you present the mask to him. After giving that soldier Zelda's letter, he'll ask if you can get him a Keaton mask. While this theory is most likely true I don't think it is the one the iceberg chart is referring to but instead I think it is referring to the theory that claims the boy becomes the Poe Collector in Hyrule Castle Town. The evidence that backs this is as follows: the boy was interested in the paranormal, and the Poe Hunter has a stick and waves it in the same motion as the Graveyard Boy. While this is most likely the theory that the iceberg is referring to there are a few counter-arguments that defunct this theory, those being: the Poe Collector seems to be fairly old as he refers to adult Link as "young man", the graveyard boy seemingly didn't like trouble as he would yell at you for moving gravestone then threaten to tell Dampé but the Poe Hunter is the opposite as he wants to see the world fall into disorder. And the final counterargument is fairly minor but a counter-argument nonetheless; the boy's mother isn't accounted for in the adult sections of the game.

If you consider that the boy's father is a Hylian guard then most likely the father, the boy and his mother fled Kakariko and went into hiding to avoid being killed by Ganondorf during the adult timeline then the first theory

When considering the evidence it is most likely that the first theory is correct because it makes sense for a Hylian guard to go into hiding to avoid being killed by Ganondorf.

Forest Temple New Music

The Forest Temple New Music, or Eh/Reh is a meme that went viral in 2015. The video was posted in 2012 and starts with text which happens to perfectly describes what the video is, quote: "These are forest temple songs I have created (sung). Here is the first one..." unquote. In 2015 when the video became a meme, it spawned many remixes of the original poster's songs.

Ghost Hunter

Near the entrance of Hyrule Castle Town there is a small guardhouse, inside the guardhouse is a Hyrulean Soldier who wishes there was more chaos in the world and expresses an interest in ghosts. When you return to the guardhouse as adult Link, it has been turned into a ghost shop that is ran by the Poe Collector, or Ghost Hunter. It is believed that the guard in the guardhouse was either killed during Ganondorf's attack and chose to pursue his interest in spirits as a ghost himself or Ganondorf cursed him, turning him into the Poe Collector. The Poe Collector has a picture of the Triforce on the wall behind him and he also has the Triforce on his belt. This is used as evidence to support this theory because out of everyone a Hyrulean soldier would be one of the few people who would have a connection to the Triforce emblem. Further evidence used to support this theory are these quotes: "Man, I am SO bored... Things would sure be more interesting if there were more.. troubles in the world.." and "Man, I am SO tired.. The night watch is so boring! I wish some ghosts would come out or something.."

Iron Knuckles are Gerudo Thieves

There is a model of an Iron Knuckle without a helmet or a top armor piece on floating around. Without either of these pieces of armor equipped you can tell that the iron knuckle is in fact a Gerudo due to it's face and feminine figure. Due to this it is believed that iron knuckles are Gerudos that were brainwashed by Twinrova, similarly to how Nabooru was brainwashed.

Rauru/Auru

This theory states that Auru from Twilight Princess is either a descendant or distant relative of Rauru, the Sage of Light. Evidence for this theory lies in the fact that their names and appearances are similar and also they both have aided the Royal Family as well as Link.

The Fourth Day

The Fourth Day is a glitch you can perform in Majora's Mask that allows you to have a fourth day, as the title suggests. To perform this glitch, you must go to the astral observatory and talk to Professor Shikashi so you can use the telescope. While using the telescope, keep your eye on the clock because you'll need to exit the telescope a couple of seconds before the clock reaches zero. If you let the clock reach zero before exiting this will result in a game over. Oddly enough, once you are successful, everyone who inhabits the land of Termina will vanish as well as the moon and your clock.

Arwings

Arwing is the name of the vehicle used in the Star Fox games but there is also an enemy Arwing that was left in the Ocarina of Time code, you can access it either through hacking or using a cheat device. It was confirmed during an "Iwata Asks" interview that the Arwing was used to test the flight patterns for Volvagia.

Blue Cucco

This refers to the mysterious blue cucco named Cojiro. Other than it's color, the most mysterious part about Cojiro is noone is sure what happens to it after you give it to Grog.

L is Real in Dodongo's Cavern

This refers to the fact that the L is Real sign from Super Mario 64 is reused in Dodongo's Cavern.

Romani Ranch Sign

The sign at the entrance of Romani Ranch is the same one used for the entrance to Kakariko Village in Ocarina of Time. In fact, the sign even reads "Welcome to Kakariko Village," in Japanese. This was fixed in Majora's Mask 3D.

Dampé's Fate

This refers to Dampe being a ghost in the adult timeline. Dampe's death has puzzled the zelda community for years and as it stands now there is no definitive Dampe death theory.

Fado

In Ocarina of Time, Fado is one of the few Kokiris with a unique design and because of this it is believed that she was originally supposed to be the sage for the Wind Temple. The Wind Temple was a scrapped dungeon; it was scrapped due to cartridge's limited space. It may also be worth noting that the former Wind Sage in Wind Waker was also named Fado, though they were male.

Cucco in the Observatory

In Majora's Mask, there is a caged cucco within the Astral Observatory, the weirdest thing about this cucco is that attacking it will yield no effect unlike the other cuccos

Mirinda commercial

This refers to a 90s Mirinda commercial that featured adult Link drinking the orange soda in Kakariko village.

Ranch Alien Invasion

There is a sidequest in Majora's Mask that has you defending Romani's Ranch from Aliens. There are a few theories about if these enemies are truly aliens. Some believe they are ghosts, others believe they are demons but most believe they are aliens.

Ganon's Horse

Ganondorf's steed is only seen a couple of times throughout Ocarina of Time; in that iconic opening and another time as part of the Phantom Ganon fight. Due to the fact that one of those times the horse is a phantom, the fans began to speculate whether or not Ganondorf's horse was still alive. Many believe that his horse is dead because it is never seen throughout the adult Link timeline and because Ingo mentions that he had planned to give Epona to Ganondorf as a gift after you beat him in a horse race. Though Ganondorf's steed may be dead, many believe that Phantom Ganon's steed is just a doppelganger of Ganon's horse rather than it's spirit.

Running Man

The Running Man is an NPC that appears after you finish the first three dungeons in Ocarina of Time. Even though it is pretty much confirmed that you can't beat him, many still believe you can.

In Mario Sunshine, there is a character named Piantissimo. You can remove his mask using hacks to reveal that his face is fairly similar to the Running Man's face. Because of this fans speculate that they are the same person, furthering their theories that the Mario and Zelda universe are linked.

Malon Wife

It is believed that Malon is Link's love interest in Ocarina of Time. Evidence to support this theory is as follows: Malon is one of the only female characters in the cast that isn't a sage, one of the gossip stones outside the temple of time states that Malon dreams of a knight in shining armor, Talon jokes about Link marrying his daughter, and Malon is always cheerful around Link.

In Twilight Princess, Link is a rancher and knows Epona's Song. This is believed to be more evidence towards this theory since the Link in Twilight Princess is the descendant of the Link from Ocarina of Time, this was confirmed via the Hyrule Historia.

Gossip Stones destroyable

The Gossip Stones are seemingly undestroyable but many have wondered if there is some way of breaking them. The closest we've ever gotten to this is by placing a bomb next to the Gossip Stone, after the bomb explodes the gossip stone will flash blue then rocket to the sky.

Beta Fire Temple Music

This could be referring to the SilvaGunner video titled "Fire Temple (Beta Mix) -The Legend of Zelda: Ocarina of Time" where SilvaGunner uses a voice clip from The Eric Andre Show where Eric Andre says "Yah Boobay!" while sticking his finger in a woman's mouth. The voice clip repeats throughout most of the video but other than that it is just the regular Fire Temple music from Ocarina of Time.

The iceberg could also be referring to the infamous 1.0 and 1.1 versions of the Fire Temple music that were removed in the 1.2 version of Ocarina of Time due to Islamic chanting.

Earth and Wind Temple

Both a Earth and Wind Temple were planned to be in Ocarina of Time but were unfortunately cut due to lack of space on the Ocarina cartridge.

Kakariko Archery Blindfolded

On September 9th 2015, a speedrunner by the name of Runnerguy2489 uploaded a video of him completing Ocarina of Time's Archery minigame blindfolded.

Unreachable Heart Piece

There are three heart pieces in Ocarina of Time that were unintended to collect. One in the Gerudo Fortress, another in the Kakariko Graveyard and the last one is in Jabu Jabu's Belly. All of these can be collected using glitches.

Burning Down Deku

This refers to a theory that states: Link killed the Great Deku Tree by lighting all the cobwebs inside the Deku Tree on fire. The fire would slowly spread from the cobwebs to the Deku Tree itself.

Navi Diving

Navi Diving is a speedrun trick used to clip to the bottom of the well early. It can also be used to leave the Kokiri Forest before beating the Deku Tree dungeon.

Overture of Sages

The Overture of Sages is a fake song claimed to be found in the game by Adriana Almandoz. She claimed the song would lead you to the Triforce.

Run Lola Run

Run Lola Run, a movie from 1998, is cited as one of the main inspirations for Majora's Mask.

Forest Temple is Hyrule Castle

This refers to a theory that claims the Forest Temple is an old Hyrule Castle from another era of Zelda.

Windmill/Grave Connection

This refers to the fact that Dampe's grave is oddly connected to the Windmill in Kakariko village.

Octorok

The Octorok has a cut model from Ocarina of Time that more closely resembles the design of the original octoroks.

No Statues in Forest Temple

Unlike the other temples in Ocarina of Time, the Forest Temple does not have a recurring statue to act as its guardian. This lack of statue has led to many believing that the Forest Temple is not a temple at all. There are theories claiming it is a mansion or as mentioned earlier a former Hyrule castle.

Sakon Killed by Link

In Majora's Mask, Sakon attempts to steal a bag of bombs from the Old Lady from the Bomb Shop. You have two options for stopping Sakon: you can either strike him with your sword, and receive the Blast Mask from the Old Lady, or shoot him with a projectile causing the bombs he stole to explode and kill him leaving Link without a reward.

Adult Link Mask

There is an unused adult Link mask in Majora's Mask. No one is entirely sure what its use could've been, or where you would've obtained it from, all we know is that it is in the game and it's very odd.

House of Skulltula

The House of Skulltula is an odd location in Kakariko Village. Inside the House of Skulltula is a family that has been cursed and turned into Skulltulas. No one knows exactly why they were cursed or who this family exactly is. It is speculated that the family may be Sheikah since Kakariko Village was an early Sheikah village but it is most likely that they are just greedy Hylians.

Fierce Deity/Kishin

It is theorized that the Fierce Deity is either the nemesis of Majora, or Link's Termina Counterpart. But there isn't enough information on Fierce Deity to have much evidence for or

against either of these theories. So fans just pick and choose what they want to accept as canon.

Gerudo Race gone after OoT/MM

This refers to the odd fact that the Gerudo have seemingly been missing from the Zelda franchise since Ocarina of Time and Majora's Mask. This leads to many fans speculating if the Gerudo were wipe out or if they evolved like the Kokiris and Zora in Wind Waker.

Ben Drowned

Ben Drowned is a well-known creepypasta that was originally published under the title "Haunted Majora's Mask Cartridge". The story would later become a long lasting ARG (Alternate Reality Game) that had three parts in total.

Termina is Limbo

This is a theory involved with the "Link is Dead" theory. It claims that Termina is Link's Limbo and that each area of the game is a stage of loss (Denial, Depression, Bargaining, Anger and Acceptance). This theory has become debunked due to the release of the Hyrule Historia.

Deku Related Nightmares

This refers to Eiji Aonuma having a nightmare about Dekus that was eerily similar to the Deku Link transformation cinematic in the opening of Majora's Mask.

Star and Crescent

The Crest of the Gerudo featured a Star and Crescent similar to Islamic symbol. This was removed in later versions of Ocarina of Time because of the religious implications. Oddly enough, there are some un-replaced Star and Crescent symbols left in Dampé's Grave.

Shark

At the bottom of the diving pool at Lakeside Laboratory there is a shark behind bars. Noone really knows why it is there but you are still able to find the shark in the 3DS remake of Ocarina of Time.

Dying Town Guard

There is a Hyrulean Guard that appears only one time before you enter the Temple of Time with the three Spiritual Stones. You can find the Guard in Hyrule Castle Town's Back Alley, when you speak to him he'll warn you of Ganondorf's betrayal.

Desert Pyramid

The Desert Pyramid is an urban legend involving a secret dungeon in Ocarina of Time. The urban legend began popping up once players found out that playing the Song of Storms in a specific location in the Haunted Wastelands would cause lightning to flash and a large pyramid structure to appear in the distance. Using cheats players would be able to reach the pyramid and

discovered two things: 1. There was no secret dungeon and 2. The pyramid was actually a large pointy rock.

Ocarina Items

This is a glitch used in speedruns that allows the player to play a fake Ocarina. This glitch is useful for when the Ocarina isn't playable.

Spiritual Stones Ocarina

This refers to the fact that during development, the Spiritual Stones would have to be inserted into the Ocarina to enter the Temple of Time.

HESS/FESS

HESS stands for Hyper Extended Super Slide and FESS stands for Forward Extended Super Slide. This is a glitch used in Ocarina of Time and Majora's Mask speedrunning. HESSes are also called the CLINTSLYDE named after the prestigious Ocarina of Time speedrunner, Clint Stevens.

Grog Suicide

Fans theorize that Grog committed suicide with the Poacher's Saw before being reanimated as a Stalfos. When you return with the medicine for the Biggoron's sword quest, Grog is gone and is replaced by Fado who gives you the Poacher's Saw.

Malon is an Alcoholic

This refers to Cremia giving Romani a Chateau Romani during their last moments on Termina. It is implied that the Chateau Romani is an alcoholic beverage.

Archery Guy Easter Egg

During the Kakariko Archery minigame if you don't shoot any arrows the Shooting Gallery Owner will become offended and refuse to let you play again. This can be reset by leaving and entering the building.

Stalchildren are Kokiri

It is speculated that stalchildren are the Kokiris that left Kokiri Forest. It is believed that Kokiris can't leave the forest or they'll die but this theory is quickly shot down because you see Kokiris outside of the forest in the end credits of Ocarina of Time.

Larger and Larger Stalchildren

Everytime you kill a stalchild they will respawn but slightly bigger, if you use a cheat to keep it permanently nighttime you can make the stalchildren grow infinitely. For some reason there is no limit on how huge they can get.

Beta Zelda 64 Trailer

There are a lot of Beta trailers for Ocarina of Time but if I had to guess which one this is referring to then I would assume the 1996 Nintendo Spaceworld trailer. The reason I assume it is that trailer is because that is the trailer with the most differences from the final released project. Link didn't put away his shield with his sword but instead it stayed out, different animations and finally, Link's design was more similar to the Link pictured in the Link to the Past artwork.

Sword Beam Attack

During a 1998 Q&A with Dan Owsen, Nintendo's english translator, it was confirmed that the Sword Beam Attack was present in Ocarina of Time but it was unfortunately removed before release. Strangely enough though you can still find the sword beam's code in the game's debug ROM.

Pre-Historia Debates

The Hyrule Historia is a book officially released by Nintendo that confirms many theories about Zelda but before the book was released there were tons of debates about what theories were canon. This led to many fans accepting theory into their own head canon.

Fused Shadows

The Fused Shadow is a quest item in Twilight Princess that has a few theories surrounding it. Since this iceberg is about Ocarina of Time and Majora's Mask I am assuming it is referring to the theory that claims the Fused Shadow is somehow related to Majora's Mask. The theory claims that the Fused Shadow is made by the same mystical tribe that created Majora's Mask. The eye on the fused shadow looks similar to the eyes on Majora's Mask and the creature that the fused shadow transforms Midna into looks similar to Majora's first and second form.

Sheikah Puppet Masters

The Sheikah is built up as a powerful clan that protects the Royal Family from the shadows. Due to the lack of knowledge about the sheikah and their symbol being reused throughout tons of Zelda games it is often speculated that the sheikah have ties to everything and are the ones pulling the strings from the shadows. This would also explain why Sheik is always one step ahead of you in Ocarina of Time.

Bomb Hoovering

Bomb Hoovering is a glitch used in Ocarina of Time and Majora's Mask speedrunning. It involves using another glitch called Infinite Sword Glitch, or ISG for short. While ISG is activated Link is unable to walk or run off edges. When you shield a damage source in the air the game temporarily places Link in a grounded state before falling but combining backflipping and shielding bomb damage with ISG will allow Link to hover.

Timeline Split

This refers to the official Nintendo Zelda timeline where the timeline splits into three separate timelines: The adult timeline, the child timeline and the hero is defeated timeline. This was a

commonly accepted concept concerning the chronological order of the Zelda games but is now officially confirmed according to several quotes and documents.

iQue Versions

The iQue Player was a console sold exclusively in China on November 17th, 2003. The interesting thing about this obscure console is that it is the superior console when compared to the N64 and it used to dominate the Ocarina of Time speedrunning leaderboards until faster strategies were found for the other versions.

Redeads are hylians

Many theories exist claiming that ReDeads are Hylians but it has been debunked by a gossip stone in Majora's Mask that explains that ReDeads are the reanimated corpses of the deceased Ikana Castle Dancing Troupe. Of course, that only applies for Majora's Mask and may not be the case for Ocarina of Time.

Royal Family Curse

This is the same as the Skulltula house. Unless it is referring to the curse put upon the Zelda bloodline at the end of Skyward Sword.

Composer Brothers

The Composer Brothers are a pair of poe siblings named Sharp and Flat. The theory is that The Composer Brothers are based on Mario and Luigi. This is supported by the fact that they bare a striking resemblance to the Mario Brothers. Sharp is the older brother, is short and somewhat wide and wears red while Flat is the younger brother who is tall, thin and wears green. Finally, the Composer Brothers also have mustaches like Mario and Luigi.

Song of Storms Paradox

The Song of Storms Paradox is a great example of the Bootstrap Paradox which is a theoretical paradox of time travel that occurs when an object or piece of information is sent back in time causing it to become trapped within an infinite cause & effect loop in which the item no longer has a discernible point of origin. In this case, the item is the Song of Storms. Adult Link learns the Song of Storms from the Windmill Man because he is angry at young Link for messing up the windmill and drying up the well when young Link played the song. Therefore, Link could not have learned the song if he had not gone on to play it to the Windmill Man in the past.

Lens of Truth unintended locations

It was theorized that the Lens of Truth could be use to get into the desert pyramid that was mentioned earlier. This was believed because some textures appeared buggy when looked at with the lens' filter due to shared assets.

Aria (4/21/97 build)

Aria is an NPC that was cut from the final version of the game but can be seen in a couple of beta screenshots. The 4/21/97 build had talking animations for Aria so it is speculated that Ocarina of Time was originally going to have voice acting.

Sky Temple

The Sky Temple was another urban legend dungeon. People claimed you could get to the Sky Temple by placing a bomb exactly in the middle of the lava pit under Ganon's Castle.

The Hall of Time

The Hall of Time was a fully rendered map that was discovered in the recent nintendo giga leak. In early screenshots the Hall of Time is shown to be right outside the Temple of Time.

Majora is the Hero

In the Majora's Mask manga, Majora's and Fierce Deity's backstory is explained. In the manga, Majora was a dragon who protected the land. The dragon had a powerful armor that could grant wishes. Many attempted to kill the dragon for it's armor, but failed until one day a mystery man who resembled the fierce deity came to the dragon and played music for him for 3 days and 3 nights. Afterwards, the dragon had died and the man carved Majora's Mask out of the dragon's armor in an attempt to seal away it's power.

The theory uses this backstory as it's main source of support. The theory claims that Majora created Termina and challenged Link simply because he looks like the fierce deity and he wanted revenge.

Deadhand's Full Body

This refers to the hands surrounding Deadhand during his battle. No one is sure whether the hands are connected to Deadhand or if they are separate entities.

Removed Voice Commands

This most likely refers to Majora's Mask having working voice commands programmed into the game. In a video by Zoinkity, posted March 2nd 2018, they show off these voice commands working in the 1.0 version of Majora's Mask. Though I might be wrong about this one since these voice commands aren't removed.

Link's Mother is Mido's House

This was a video posted by SwankyBox in 2019. In a Ocarina of Time comic series, after Link's mother bring him to the Kokiri forest she becomes a tree. SwankyBox then speculates that Link's mother is Mido's House due to the location where she transformed into tree.

Equipable Majora's Mask

This refers to a video posted on January 1st, 2009 where a player demonstrates themselves going through the item menu of Majora's Mask then equipping Majora's Mask as if it was an item.

Tetraforce

The tetraforce is the name given to the Triforce by those who believe it is four-pieces instead of three. This belief started when players noticed that the Hylian Eagle on the Hylian Shield in Ocarina of Time was standing on a fourth triangle like a pedestal. Since Ocarina of Time, this iteration of the Hylian Shield hasn't been used again. This theory has been debunked on multiple occasions by Nintendo and Shigeru Miyamoto.

2-3-1

After defeating the Deku Scrub who teaches you how to defeat the Deku Brothers, he will say "Twenty-three is Number One." It is speculated that this is a reference to Michael Jordan possibly put in by the translators.

Skull Kid Young Link Mask

Along with Skull Kid's assets there are three variations of Young Link masks. By changing minor values in the games code you can actually make Skull Kid wear these masks.

7 Day Concept

Majora's Mask was originally supposed to have 7 days but eventually this was lowered to 3 days. The idea actually came from another game entirely, a board game, based around the theme of cops and robbers.

Triforce Collectable

Due to a beta trailer showing Link obtaining the Triforce many were led to believe that the Triforce could be obtained in the final version of the game. There was also a hoax involved, the same hoax involving the Overture of Sages discussed earlier.

"Sold his soul to the Devil"

"He sold his soul to the devil" is a quote spoken by Flat, one of the composer brothers, in Majora's Mask. The quote led players to believe that the devil is in the Zelda universe but others assumed that it is either a figure of speech or Flat is referring to the Skull Kid.

Bottle Adventure

Bottle Adventure is a glitch used in speedruns that allows you to assign almost any item to the B button.

Unicorn Fountain

The Unicorn Fountain is an area that was supposed to appear in the unreleased Ura Zelda. It is speculated that you would either obtain the Triforce or obtain the Sword Beam ability from the Unicorn Fountain.

Sheik Genital Analysis

This refers to the reoccurring debate about Shiek's gender.

WW to Tower Collapse

Wrong Warpping to Tower Collapse is another glitch used in speedrunning, mostly the Defeat Ganon, previously any% category. The glitch allows you to warp from the Ghoma boss battle to Tower Collapse scene at the end of the game.

Ganondorf bleeds red

In the 1.0 and 1.1 versions of the Ocarina of Time Ganondorf's blood was red instead of green. This was changed due to nintendo seeming it too violent.

Kokiri Forest Beta

The kokiri forest in the beta build of the game was a lot bigger than the final version of the game. Also, worth mentioning is the Kokiri Forest Beta Mix video by SilvaGunner where the melody for Kokiri Forest is replaced with the melody from the Simpsons theme.

Five Stages of Greif in MM

I pretty much covered this in the Termina is Limbo section of the video.

"OoT changed my life"

This is common expression that you'll see on many forum boards. Players claim Ocarina of Time can be a life changing experience and is a game that has shaped their life positively, or even negatively.

Moon Children real life cult

The moon children is a cult that was formed in or before 1998. The cult ties into the second arc of the Ben Drowned ARG.

Evil Deeds can be rewarded with Heaven

This is a theory that speculates that being evil in the Ocarina of Time universe may have very few lasting consequences. A great example of this is the Twinrova fight. After defeating Twinrova, the Twinrova sisters still ascend to heaven despite being evil. This theory also implies that everyone is an actor playing their part in life; the theory essentially applies themes of fatalism to Ocarina of Time.

The Forbidden Build

The Forbidden Build is supposedly a cursed build of Ocarina of Time that is said to have the spirit of a dead game designer contained within it.

Aria Apparition

The Aria Apparition is an NPC that supposedly has a cursed spirit within her code. The only way to summon her is by cartridge swapping Ocarina of Time v1.0 with Mario 64 then swapping back to Ocarina of Time but you must swap the cartridge when you're at Kakariko Village in Ocarina of Time and Wet Dry World in Mario 64.

Aria is claimed to be in the Forbidden Build where you can interact with her. Once you interact with her she will follow you around until you interact with her again.

Majora is an egregore

I'm not gonna lie I don't really know what this means at all so I'm taking a shot in the dark of what I think it is. An egregore is an occult concept representing a distinct non-physical entity that arises from a collective group of people. So I assume Majora is a non-physical entity that was thought up by the moonchildern cult. I mean I'm not sure what else this could imply or how deeper I can go so for now this is what I'm sticking with.

OoT any% destroyed speedrunning

Ever since the discovery of ACE the any% category for Ocarina of Time is seemingly unwelcoming towards beginners and also many consider it a very boring run overall. Ultimately, it just feels as if the any% category has been destroyed due to all the new discoveries rather than pushing it forward. Though the original Get Item Manipulation route was far worse

Majora's Mask is a retelling of The Magic Flute

The Magic Flute was Mozart's last completed composition and during this time Mozart was apart of the freemasons. The Magic Flute was supposed to be a huge nod to freemasonry and this theory connects Majora's Mask's iconography and themes to that of The Magic Flute to imply that it is Nintendo's own nod to freemasonry.

OoT is intentionally badly coded

This is pretty much just a joke referring to how easily the game can be broken but also it refers to how Grezzo left a lot of speedrunning glitches in the Ocarina of Time remake for 3DS.

Mario 64 personalized AI was used in Zelda 64

Every copy of Mario 64 is personalized has to be one of the biggest things to come from the Mario 64 iceberg and since Ocarina of Time used a similar engine to Mario 64 it could easily be assumed that Ocarina of Time also uses the personalized AI. Similarly to Mario 64, many people have become attached to Ocarina of Time and it would be fair to assume that this is because of the personalized AI.
