[THE LGBT Bar](#) > according to their website, they are here to allow for us all to “connect, share knowledge, and succeed within the LGBTQ+ and ally legal community.”

[Marsha P. Johnson Institute](#) > according to their website, MPJI “protects and defends the human rights of BLACK transgender people” and “seeks to eradicate systemic, community, and physical violence” through “locat[ing] culturally competent resources for necessities like housing, food security, legal and financial support, COVID-19 relief, health/wellness, employment, social support, and more.”

[Lambda Legal](#) > for LGBTQ+ civil liberties, they give their all: a significant function of this organization is legal advocacy for all people affected by HIV, regardless of one’s sex, gender identity or expression, sexuality, or gender/sexuality/romantic minority status.

[Matthew Shepard Foundation](#) > following the tragic hate crime of the murder of Matthew Shepard in Wyoming in 1998, this organization, led by MS’s mother Judy “amplif[ies] the story of Matthew Shepard to inspire individuals, organizations and communities to embrace the dignity and equality of all people.”

[PFLAG](#) (no longer an acronym) > specifically for parents/families/friends/allies

[GLSEN](#) (also no longer an acronym) > sets out “to create safe and affirming schools for all, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression.”

[HRC](#) (the Human Rights Campaign) > civil rights and equality work

[ACLU](#) (the American Civil Liberties Union) > defending legal/civil rights

[SPLC](#) (Southern Poverty Law Center) -- although the SPLC is not solely an LGBTQ+ organization, their teams do incredible work to help support diverse communities of people experiencing discrimination
