

Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP)

Before & After School + Summer Care at No Cost to Eligible Families

The Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP) provides free before-school, after-school, and summer enrichment for qualifying transitional kindergarten through sixth grade students. ELOP is designed to support the whole child through safe, engaging, and hands-on experiences outside the traditional school day.

What does ELOP Offer?

- Free extended care during non-school hours
- **Priority access** and **enrollment** for qualifying students
- STEAM and literacy-based enrichment
- Homework support and academic reinforcement
- Arts, recreation, and social-emotional learning
- Safe, supervised school campus locations

Who Qualifies?

Students in **TK-6th grade** are eligible if they meet any of the following:

- Qualify for free or reduced-price meals
- Are English Learners (Qualify for priority registration only do not qualify for free enrollment. Cannot Self-Identify)
- Are Foster Youth
- Attend a school designated for ELOP funding
- Priority is given to students who meet multiple eligibility criteria. Space is limited and may vary by site.

How to Enroll

- Enrollment is managed through your school's Extended Care department.
- Qualifying families will receive an invitation for priority registration.

Attendance Policy

- Students must attend on a full-time regular basis (until 6pm, Monday through Friday). Failing to attend full time on a regular basis may result in termination of services. Part-time enrollment is not permitted.
- Schedule changes are not permitted. Schedule changes require a withdrawal, re-registration online, and will be subject to the waitlist.
- If the student needs to leave earlier than closing on any day, you will need to let the Site Supervisor know the reason for the early pick-up.

Early Release Policy

Your student may be picked up early for one of the qualifying reasons: Participation in school athletic programs and team sports, Off-site enrichment programs, family emergencies, medical appointment, parent choice, transportation, child accident/injury, safety issues, religious reasons.

Transportation Policy

Transportation for the ELO program falls solely on the parent or guardian. If your student is enrolled in the ELO program, the parent/guardian must pick the student up each day at 6:00 p.m.

Behavior Policy

Even though ELO sessions are being offered outside regular classroom hours, school rules still apply. Please read the parent/guardian handbook for our policy on behavior.

Fees

- English language learners receive priority registration and are required to pay all fees and tuition.
- All other qualification reasons will have all costs covered through the ELO-P Grant, including registration fee and tuition.
- This grant is for the 2026-2027 school year only.
