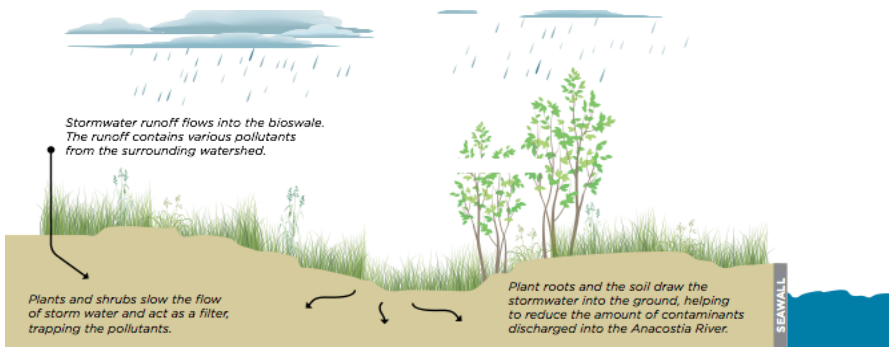

The Bioswale - The grassy buffer between the boathouse and the river that protects the Anacostia river by filtering and diverting runoff from the land. Our work in the bioswale maintains its native species such as bald cypress, Red Twig Dogwood, Rose Mallow, switch grass, blue flag iris, and Sweet Bay Magnolia.
